ANOTHER BATCH OF BENEFICIARIES OF BOTIKA ON WHEELS

The Provincial Government of Cavite's Botika on Wheels program continues to roll delivering maintenance medicines and vitamins to target beneficiaries, this time, in the municipality of Indang and City of Imus from October 6- 29, 2020. A total of 3,947 senior citizens were given free vitamins and prescription medicines, while the 8702 children also received vitamins in the City of Imus. On the other hand, 5,426 elderlies of Indang received their maintenance medicines and vitamins while 10, 847 children received vitamins. Board Member Jeff Asistio together with City of Imus Sangguniang Panlungsod Members accompanied the BOW team in distributing the medicines in 97

BURNED IN BACCOOR, TWO BARANGAYS ARE AFFECTED

BACCOOR CITY - At 10:16 pm Sunday, November 1, the fire began in a house in Barangay Alima and was immediately lifted to the 4th Fire Alarm at 10:46 PM.

According to BFP Bacoor report, two residents were reported injured. It reached 398 families with 1,641 individuals affected by the fire. The Barangay Sineguelas-

an reached the adjacent barangay, the fire from Alima. Fire has been declared completely extinguished at 1:28 am.

Those affected by the fire were urgently evacuated at four evacuation centers:

1. Bacoor Elementary School (Alima): 64 families, 271 people from Sineguelasan
2. Alima Elementary School: 290 families, 1,233 people
3. Jesus is Lord Church: 1 families, 4 people
4. Alima Senior High School: 33 families, 133 people

Bong Go supports measures strengthening anti-money laundering efforts in PH

Senator Christopher "Bong" Go has expressed his support for proposed measures that aim to strengthen anti-money laundering efforts in the Philippines in compliance with the legal standards set by concerned international bodies.

During a Senate Committee on Banks, Financial Institutions and Currencies hearing on Wednesday, October 28, Go echoed the calls of President Rodrigo Duterte and Department of

Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez III to strengthen efforts against money laundering in the country through the proposed Senate Bill 1412 and its counterpart House Bill 6174.

Go noted that Duterte has certified the proposed measure as urgent.

"I echo the President's call to comply with legal standards for anti-money laundering and counterterrorism financing, as established by relevant international bod-

ies," Go said during the hearing.

The proposed measures seek to strengthen Republic Act 9160 or the "Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2001", making the country compliant with the legal standards set by international bodies in addressing money laundering and the funding of terrorist activities.

Go cited that just last March, the Bureau of Customs confirmed that \$370 million in dirty money entered the country. According to the DOF, two groups allegedly laundered around \$167.97 million and \$200.24 million, respectively.

In response, Dominguez ordered the BOC to work with the Anti-Money Laundering Council in investigating the entry into the country of dirty money.

In the hearing, Go also expressed his support for the inclusion of tax crimes and violation of the Strategic Trade and Management Act, which indirectly includes proliferation of weapons of mass destruction as predicate to money laundering.

Moreover, Go said that the swift passage of the measure will also benefit overseas Filipino workers.

"Possible na sila po ang direktang maapektuhan dahil kapag hindi po namend ang ating Anti-Money Laundering Law, maaari pong ma grey list ang Pilipinas ng Financial Action Task Force at tumaas ang cost ng remittance rates para sa ating mga OFWs," he said.

"Narapat lamang po na maglaan tayo ng sapat na proteksyon upang mapangalagaan ang kapakanan ng ating mga kababayan. Our campaign has always been against criminality and cor-



ruption aside from the war on illegal drugs," he added.

Ending his statement, Go emphasized that strengthening laws against money laundering will boost the government's fight against criminality.

"Our campaign has always been against criminality and corruption aside from the war on illegal drugs. Amidst the continuing pandemic that has hampered, not just the economy but also the lives of our brothers and sisters, criminality and corruption have become more important issues that we must take seriously," said Go.

"At the time when our people are experiencing unprecedented hardships, every single centavo counts. Make no mistake, tutuluyan talaga namin ni Presidente ang mga manloloko at magnanakaw," he added.

Go also stressed that he and Duterte have always adopted a firm opposition against any form of terrorism.

"We are one in our vision to exterminate terrorism and improve our anti-terrorism efforts," he said.

"Dapat po putulin at hadlangan ang lahat ng kahit anumang makakatulong sa mga teroristang walang ibang ginagawa kundi manggulo lang po sa ating bayan," he ended.

DepEd recommends 'academic ease' measures to help teachers, learners

The Department of Education (DepEd) suggested measures to foster 'academic ease' and help teachers and learners who are still adapting to the distance learning set-up.

"The welfare of our teachers and learners remains to be our priority and we will ensure that School Year 2020-2021 will be bearable for all while still promoting effective learning engagement," Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones said.

In Memorandum OUCI-2020-307 released on October 30, 2020, Undersecretary for Curriculum and Instruction Diosdado San

Antonio outlined ten highly-recommended measures to field units to ensure flexibility in teaching and learning. The policy was also in response to the request of teacher and student groups to ease the components of distance learning implementation.

"The measures suggested are expected to enable the learners and learning facilitators to navigate through the challenges of the new normal in the teaching and learning process and make necessary adjustment throughout the school year," Undersecretary San Antonio noted.

Some of the mea-

sures recommended are the reconsideration of time allotment for the completion and submission of activities by the learners; and the expansion of mental health/socio-emotional well-being support to teachers, learners, and parents through group wellness sessions.

Teachers and learning support aides will also provide additional support to households that are experiencing difficulties in accomplishing Self-Learning Modules (SLMs) or Learning Activity Sheets (LAS) independently.

Schools are also advised to put a premium on instructional management tasks for teachers, such that they should not be burdened with printing and distributing mod-

ules.

In addition, schools can also determine activities contained in the first quarter SLMs or LAS that may be declared as optional. Additional enrichment activities in the SLM can be offered to fast learners.

For the succeeding quarters, learning tasks in the SLMs may be streamlined to ensure that activities sufficiently develop learning competencies leading to mastery.

"The need to adjust the assigned tasks for the learners is anchored on the fact that learners have long been disengaged from academic learning since the onset of the pandemic last March 2020," Usec. San Antonio explained.

San Antonio also added that Regional and Schools Division Offices are authorized to implement other 'academic ease' measures appropriate for their respective contexts.

Meanwhile, external stakeholders and partners can also be tapped to provide materials, equipment, and mechanism to help in addressing challenges in the distance and home-based learning.

Cavite Computer Center extends online learning opportunities to primary school students

The Provincial Government of Cavite through the Provincial ICT Office – Cavite Computer Center, conducted the first of its webinar series teaching Microsoft Word and Excel to children ages 7 to 12, last September 19 & 26, and October 17, 2020, via Zoom video conference.

Each of the webinars was held on a Saturday—with morning and afternoon sessions—to keep from interfering with the students' regular class schedule. Its main objective is to help young learners be more familiar and comfortable with computer applications at the ground level as they try to cope with their schoolwork.

The Cavite Computer Center has been PGC's dynamic arm since 1999, offering free and practical computer education and training across sectors especially for out-of-school-youth and



adults, self-employed and unemployed citizens. Its certification courses are accredited by TESDA and DepEd Alternative Learning System or ALS and vary from basic computer repair skills to competencies relevant to Information and Communications Technol-

ogy (ICT) such as multimedia and web design, video editing, graphics design, and database management, and so on.

It has recently branched into online platforms and is making way for all of its courses to be delivered virtually as quickly as possible as a

There are 79 firetrucks who responded. 66 from differ- ent towns and cities in Cavite and NCR. 10 firetrucks from BFP and 3 from Bacoor City.

According to Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla, 398 fam- ilies affected will receive P10, 000 per family as Local Govern- ment assistance. It is also expected that evacuees may last from two weeks to a month in evacuation centers.

Still referring to the cause of the fire today, BFP Bac- oor's initial report found that the fire in a house in Brgy was started. Alima. Local Government is proposing speculation arson or deliberate fire occurrence in the area. The deep investigation into the incident continues until now.

Cavite declares state of calamity

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite Nov. 3 (PIA) – In a special emergency session held at 1:30pm of Nov 1, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan declared a State of Calamity in the entire province in response to the effect of Tropical Depression “Rolly.”

The session gave way to the urgent passage of the Resolution no. 1618-2020, de-

claring the province of Cavite under the state of calamity due to the impact of Super Typhoon “Rolly” and authorizing the use of Php10M from the quick response fund of the 2020 Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund for the purchase of relief goods and for other expenses for the benefit of those affected by the super typhoon.

Typhoon Rolly ravaged the Bicol region and Southern part of Luzon bringing havoc to the provinces of Quezon and Batangas though strong winds and light to heavy rains were experienced early afternoon of November 1, 2020 in the province

Pre-emptive evacuation measures were conducted in the coastal areas of Bacoor,

Kawit, Naic, Indang, Rosario, and Cavite City and also in low-lying areas and danger zones in different cities and municipalities of the province during the morning.

The Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRR-MO) reported that about 3,309 families with a total of 12,332

Typhoon Rolly Dept. of Health CALABARZON declares Code Blue Alert

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna, (PIA) --The Department of Health (DOH) – CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, Quezon) today declared a Code Blue alert for all DOH hospitals in the region as part of the comprehensive disaster preparedness measures to deal with and to lessen the expected impact of Typhoon Rolly on local communities that will be affected.

“The regional office is ready and prepared to provide assistance to local government units that will be needing essential health care services. Nakahanda kaming magbigay ng tulong pangkalusugan sa mga komunidad at mga indibidwal na maapektuhan ng bagyo,” Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo stated.

“Our provincial health teams, especially in the province of Quezon are already in coordination with local government units and prepared to provide assistance for the management of the most common health-related problems that may result from this typhoon,” he assured.

According to the Severe Weather Bulletin # 12 of the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAG-ASA), the eastern portion of Quezon including Tagkawayan, Guinayangan, Calauag, Lopez, Catanauan, Buenavista, Mulanay, San Narciso, San Andres, San Francisco will be very much affected and are now placed under signal # 4 as of November 1, 2020.

“With this development, the situation is potentially very destructive to the community. We are advising residents of the affected areas to take all precautionary measures and stay at home or stay in evacuation centers for safer shelter. Huwag na po kayong lalabas ng bahay at baka mapahamak lang kayo dahil sa malakas ng bugso ng hangin at ulan,” Janairo warned.

The regional office also requested LGU health workers, provincial health coordinators including regional health emergency management staff to assist in the conduct of a pre-disaster risk assessment to ensure the health and safety of residents such as preemptive evacuation of those residing in high risk areas, ensuring the adequate supply of medicines and medical equipment, placing responders, rapid health assessment teams and surveillance officers on standby duty and checking that all emergency vehicles and radio communication are working effectively.
