

DOH 4A on full alert for Taal eruption

The Department of Health Region 4A (DOH 4A) has placed all government health facilities in the region on full alert status following the eruption of Taal volcano in Talisay, Batangas last Sunday afternoon, January 12.

"All health facilities are ready to provide preventive measures on the possible effects caused by the volcanic eruption that may include traumatic injuries, burns, suffocation, skin diseases, eye injuries, respiratory problems, conjunctivitis and even death," Regional Director Eduardo C. Janairo said after a briefing with provincial health officials and other concerned units of the region.

He said health emergency personnel and provincial health team leaders, as well as mental health teams were being deployed to strategic areas to provide immediate medical and health services to affected residents.

The Regional Director advised residents with health conditions like emphysema, asthma, and bronchitis, among others, who were exposed to ashfall to immediately seek medical attention to avoid further health complications.

Volcanic ashfall is one of the major health hazards caused by volcanic eruption. A person exposed to it may suffer

Tolentino supports Tagaytay Tourism operators' plea to resume business activities

TAGAYTAY CITY (PIA) - Senator Francis Tolentino has supported the reopening of hotels, restaurants and other vital establishments the soonest possible time citing the need for Tagaytay to get back on its feet immediately.

"Hotels and restaurants form the backbone of Calabarzon region's tourism industry. Their non-operation has an effect on national economy," Tolentino said.

The Senator sat down with Tagaytay's tourism council in an emergency meeting this morning here to help them come up with a common decision to re-open their businesses simultaneously.

The council will pass a resolution addressed to Tourism Secretary Bernadette Romulo-Puyat for her review.

The council, composed of hotel and restaurant owners and operators, has agreed to open on January 24 in time for the Chinese New Year where tourists and guests who have been previ-

LAPID BILL TO ENSURE SEA GAMES FACILITIES WILL NOT END UP AS WHITE ELEPHANTS

Senator Manuel "Lito" Lapid wants to ensure the sustainable rehabilitation and maintenance of all the government-funded sports facilities, particularly those that were built and refurbished for the 2019 Southeast Asian (SEA) Games, saying the people's money must not be put to waste.

According to the senator, these facilities must not end up as "white elephants" or big budget infrastructure projects that turned out to be sparingly used or of no use at all, with maintenance costs eating up more than whatever income they generate.

"Dapat natin siguruhin na hindi masasayang ang pera ng bayan na inilaan natin para itayo at ayusin ang mga pasilidad na ito para sa ating mga sports competitions, at lalung-lalo na para sa ating mga atleta," Lapid said.

Lapid highlighted that the government has the responsibility to guarantee that the different facilities and venues constructed, renovated and repaired for the SEA Games are properly and sustainably maintained.

A month after the recently concluded biennial regional multi-sport event, Lapid is proposing under Senate Bill No. 1246, for the government to institutionalize the creation of sustainability plans for all future and existing government-funded sports facilities, venues and other sports-related infrastructure.

As the host country of the 30th SEA Games, the Philippines allotted P6 billion for hosting expenses alone.

Meanwhile, the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) gave a financial boost

SSS opens service office in Candelaria



CANDELARIA, Quezon- (PIA) -The Social Security Office (SSS) Lucena City branch recently opened an extension office at the 3rd floor of the Candelaria building in Barangay Poblacion here.

Ms. Haidee Consignado, Information Officer of SSS Luzon South 1 Division said the newly-opened service office will cater to about 1,500 employers, 11,000 employees and 6,000 self-employed and voluntary members in 135 barangays in the

municipalities of Candelaria, Dolores, San Antonio, Sariaya and Tiaong.

According to Consignado, SSS-Candelaria will offer the following services: receipt and processing of SSS member's application such as SSS personal record form (SSS- Form-E), Member Data Change Request Form (SSS- Form E-4), Employer Registration (SSS Form R-1), Employment Report (SSS- Form R-1A), Employer Data Change Request (SSS Form

R-8), Annual Confirmation of Pensioners (ACOP), maternity Notification and Educational Loan, on-line verification of member's contribution and loans.

Other services include benefits applications, receipts and screening of benefit claims as well as the generation of Payment Reference Number (PRN) needed for the payment of SSS contributions and loans.

Villar marks 5th anniversary of Baseco project

To mark the 5th anniversary of her various projects in Baseco Compound, Tondo, Sen. Cynthia Villar led a clean-up activity in the area. Since 2015, Villar has been returning to Barangay 649, Gasangan, a coastal community along Manila Bay, to conduct monthly clean up and tree-planting activities as well as to check on the progress of the construction of toilets and status of the various livelihood projects she established for the residents.

Villar, chairperson of the Committee on Environment, Natural Resources, and Climate Change, expressed her gratitude to individuals and groups who contributed to the success of the projects.

"Looking back, rehabilitating Baseco looked like a daunting task but your continued cooperation encouraged me to carry on. It's still a long way to go but as you can see, we are starting to reap the benefits of our initial steps," Villar said, addressing the volunteers from partner organizations gathered

for the activity.

The Nacionalista Party senator was joined by representatives of partner-organizations namely; Department of Health, Department of Social Welfare and Development, Department of Public Works and Highways, Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources, Bureau of Soils and Water Management, Department of Education, Metropolitan Manila Development Authority, Maynilad, Kabalikatan ng Kaunlaran ng Baseco, MBC-DZRH, and Gasangan barangay officials. Villar adopted this area of Gasangan in a bid to turn the compound into a model community rehabilitation project and site for urban agriculture and aquaculture.

After Villar raised the issue of poor sanitary conditions in Baseco, DOH, DSWD, the City of Manila and Maynilad came together to launch the "Zero Open Defecation for Baseco Compound" project in May 2017.


The project aims to

construct 5,000 toilets for 80% of the residents who has no access to sanitary toilet facilities.

At the beginning of the project, Villar has also taken the initiative to pave the street and build a communal septic tank. She also sought the commitment of authorities for the regular collection of garbage to prevent solid waste accumulation in Manila Bay. Through the help of the BSWM, Villar established urban gardens which have been the source of vegetables for residents' own consumption and livelihood. Recycling projects were also initiated in the area provided by the Pasig River Rehabilitation Commission.

Mangroves are also planted in the area to serve as natural barriers that will protect the community in the event of storm surges.

Aquaculture was also introduced in the area with the help of BFAR who provided the training and distributed fishing boats and tri-bikes to the residents.

Manila Water extends assistance to evacuees affected by Taal eruption

East Zone Manila Concession, Manila Water has extended its assistance to evacuees affected by the Taal Volcano eruption.

Today, Manila Water said that some 30 water tankers were made available to provide for the needs of evacuees affected by the volcanic eruption in various sites in Southern Luzon.

Through the efforts of its subsidiary, Laguna Water, the tankers will be deployed initially to three towns in the Province of Batangas. Four tankers will be sent to the following sites in Tanauan City: Poblacion Balele West Covered Court, Poblacion Gloria, and Tanauan City Gym 2; while two will be deployed to PUP Gymnasium in Sto. Tomas; and six tankers will be stationed at the Bolbok Provincial Sports Complex in Batangas City. Request for tankers have also been received for San Luis Municipal Hall and Taal Municipal Hall in Batangas, as well as in Alfonso town in Cavite.

Manila Water added that the other water tankers will be on stand by for deployment to other evacuation sites as requested by local government units.

The water tankers will be refilled by Laguna Water and their personnel will also lend assistance with the tankering activities.

Manila Water is on standby 24/7 to provide assistance affected by the volcanic eruption in Batangas and Laguna.

Meanwhile, the Manila Water Foundation (MWF) will also be sending some 2,000 units of 5-gallon bottles of potable water to various evacuation sites, in coordination with the Batangas Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO). (Manila Water)

to the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) amounting to P842.5 million for the renovation of facilities for SEA Games, including the 85 year-old Rizal Memorial Sports Complex, the Multi-Purpose Arena at the Philippines Complex, and the Ninoy Aquino Stadium.

Lapid, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Games and Amusement, reiterated that the "stagnation and degradation of these sports facilities must be avoided at all costs" and that Congress must do its part in looking after the nation's investment in building these infrastructures. All government-funded

sports facilities, venues and other sports-related infrastructure, including stadiums, coliseums, arenas, sports centers/complexes, running tracks, courts, swimming pools, convention centers, media centers and athletes' villages are included within the scope of the proposed measure.

Furthermore, the bill suggests that the contents of the sustainability plans shall include, but are not limited to, the following: (1) plans on future hosting and uses of the sports facility after the termination of the event for which the same was constructed; (2) regular



Sen. Lapid maintenance, up-keep, repair and/or renovation; (3) income-generating activities sufficient to cover the maintenance, up-keep, repair and/or renovation of the sports facility; (4) installation of energy-saving and water-saving systems or devices; (5) water conservation measures such as rainwater harvesting, use of grey water, etc.; (6) waste management, recycling and/or composting facilities; (7) use of renewable energy such as wind power and solar power; among others.

The deadline for submission of nominations for the 2020 Metrobank Foundation Outstanding Filipinos is extended until Friday, January 17.



PH, France to strengthen agri trade

QUEZON CITY-- Secretary William Dar and Ambassador of France to the Philippines Nicolas Galey discussed mutual goals to enhance the agricultural cooperation and trade between the Philippines and France during the ambassador's visit to the Department of Agriculture (DA) on January 6.

The two countries will continue to implement the Administrative Arrangement on Agricultural Cooperation particularly in terms of capacity building for cooperatives, dairy, food safety, and intellectual property.

"I really would like

to see the DA strongly a part of the activity," Secretary Dar said in support of the project to improve agricultural infrastructure, particularly the establishment of food terminals in the country.

He said that the development of the Clark-Rungis Wholesale Food Market is "a big help in many ways" as it will attract various sectors to invest in agriculture.

Ambassador Galey said that the Philippines has a big potential to cater to the French consumers. He also expressed support to the DA's initiatives under a new development framework.

According to the am-

bassador, the importance of agriculture in France can be seen through the Rungis International Market in Paris, which is the biggest fresh produce market in the world.

Dar also shared the DA's plans to enhance the food terminals in the Philip-pines that will apply the principles of modernization, in-

dustrialization, and inclusive agribusiness.

In 2018, the Philippines exported USD49.82 million-worth of agricultural products to France and imported USD132.73 million-worth of agricultural products from the European country. (Gumamela Celes Bejarin/DA-AFID)

ously booked in their facilities are expected to arrive.

Tolentino said he will also seek guidance from Philvoles Director Renato Solidum if it was safe for hotel operators to re-open their businesses to tourists.

Hotels and restaurants in Tagaytay voluntarily shut down operations following Taal Volcano's eruption on Sunday. Authorities likewise advised business owners not to accommodate guests for their safety due to Taal's imminent destructive eruption.

eye, nose and throat irritation, difficulty in breathing, cough, bronchitis-like illness and minor skin problems.

Janairo reminded residents to stay indoors and keep all their windows and doors closed to keep volcanic ashes from penetrating their houses.

"For those in evacuation centers, follow orders and await for further instructions," he stressed, persuading them not to leave the evacuation center without any advice from local officials.

He likewise emphasized the importance of getting up-to-date news by listening to the radio.

"Huwag na rin pong lumabas ng bahay, kung kinakailangan naman (Avoid leaving your homes, but if it is really needed), be sure to wear protective mask and eye goggles or shades as protection from eye irritation."

Meanwhile, the Regional Director appeals to retailers and traders in the region to stop exploiting the situation as reports about overpricing and shortage of the N95 mask have emerged.

"We will be monitoring prices and take stern action against those who will be taking advantage of the situation by unreasonably raising the prices of face asks," he pronounced.

Finally, Janairo announced that DOH shall be distributing free N95 facemask, as well as eye drops and protection kits to residents of high risk areas in the region. (SOURCE: DOH 4A)/R. GABRIDO

shall apply to all Direct Contributory members using the following schedule:

The state agency said that the new schedule will help ensure sustainability of the National Health Insurance Fund, guaranteeing that all Filipinos are able to avail of outpatient benefit packages that are currently being finalized, as well as immediate eligibility to benefits during confinement.

"Starting November 22, 2019 until such time that a new set of guidelines are issued, all Filipinos including those without the qualifying contributions shall be allowed to avail of the PhilHealth benefits," PhilHealth President and CEO Ricardo C. Morales announced.

While no one will be denied of PhilHealth coverage

due to non-payment of premiums, Morales also clarified that members lacking contributions shall be billed for the unpaid premiums with interests (compounded monthly) and penalties of at least 3% a month for employers, sea-based OFWs, and Kasambahays. On the other hand, self-earning members, professionals and land-based migrant workers shall incur a maximum interest of 1.5% for every month of missed payment. Interests, however, shall only be applied effective applicable month of January 2020.

PhilHealth assured that the adjustments in contributions are sanctioned by law and essential in sustaining and enhancing its benefits and services to its 108 million-strong members and beneficiaries here and abroad. END (JJ Rico)

identified the suspects as Marc Giancarlo Evora Reyes, alias Gian, Vincent Michael Arive Go Bon, alias Alex, and Ma. Ka-rina Esperanza.

At around 8:20 pm, elements of PDEA Special Enforcement Service (PDEA SES) under the supervision of Director Levi S. Ortiz, conducted a buy-bust operation in 67 Rafael Palma Street, BF Heva Homes, Parañaque City that resulted in the arrest of Reyes and seizure of seven bottles containing more or less 300 ml of suspected liquid ecstasy worth P35,000.00, two pieces of heat-sealed transparent plastic sachet and one piece of self-sealing plastic sachet containing suspected shabu, weighing more or less 10 grams with an estimated value of P60,000.00, 100 tablets of valium worth P5,000.00, several drug paraphernalia, and the buy-bust money.

The BOSS of San Pedro City also offers convenience to business owners as representatives from the different barangays of the locality were stationed in the City Hall for more easily accessible issuance of Barangay Clearance.

Know what to do before, during and after an ashfall

AFTER

➤ As soon as the ashfall diminishes, scrape off the ash that has accumulated on the rooftops to prevent collapse.

➤ After removing the ash, clean the roof and gutter with water to prevent corrosion.

➤ Remove ash from windows and doors of the house and car. Use water before washing them with soap and lukewarm water.

➤ Collect the ashes and put them in an area far from water drainage to avoid clogging.

➤ Wash grass before feeding the animals or livestock.

➤ Boil water before drinking.

➤ Use powder detergent in washing clothes covered in ash.

➤ Use a vacuum cleaner or shake the furniture to loosen and clean the ash. Cover your nose and mouth while cleaning.

Church leaders praise junking of same-sex union

Church leaders in the Philippines have welcomed a court ruling junking the same-sex union petition with “finality”.

The Supreme Court upheld an earlier decision to reject the petition that seeks to allow same-sex union in the predominantly Catholic country.

The petition, according to SC, lacked “substantial arguments” to warrant the reversal of its earlier ruling.

Bishop Broderick Pabillo, the auxiliary of Manila, praised the ruling and urged the public to instead deal on pressing issues like poverty, unemployment and climate change.

“We should focus on these (issues),” Pabillo said.

Bishop Honesto Ongtioco of Cubao said the Church will always uphold the teachings of Jesus regarding marriage, regardless of what the state legislates.

“At least the SC still upholds what the Church teaches,” he said.

For his part, Fr. Melvin Castro, a former official of the bishops’ family and life ministry, said joy over the court decision is “incomplete”.

The SC said that the Constitution does not explicitly prohibit same-sex marriage.

“It leaves open for Congress to enact such a law,” Castro said.

The priest also said that the SC decision “challenges us to be vigilant and ever-on guard.”
