SMC Infrastructure, Metro Pacific Tollways, complete interoperability of Luzon expressways

The long-anticipated interoperability of expressways operated by SMC Infrastructure and Metro Pacific Tollways Corp. throughout Luzon is now complete, with both firms officially launching the One RFID program Tuesday in Calamba, in ceremonies attended by President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos, Jr.

"We are proud to announce the successful completion of interoperability between our electronic toll collection (ETC) systems, Autosweep and Easytrip. This latest feature will directly benefit motorists who will register for a new ETC account, as they will only need one radio frequency

identification (RFID) and account to travel seamlessly across the Luzon expressway network," both companies said in a joint statement.

The One RFID program covers all toll roads in Luzon such as Tarlac-Pangasinan-La Union Expressway (TPLEX), Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX), North Lu-

zon Expressway (NLEX), NLEX Connector, Skyway System, NAIA Expressway, Manila-Cavite Expressway (Cavitex), Cavitex-C5 Link, Muntinlupa-Cavite Expressway (MCX), Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX), South Luzon Expressway (SLEX), and the STAR Tollway.

PhilHealth clarifies
coverage for
ischemic heart
disease patients

MANILA – The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) has clarified that patients diagnosed with ischemic heart disease and acute myocardial infarction (IHD-AMI) are qualified to avail of the corresponding benefit package under PhilHealth Circular 2024-0032.

In an advisory issued Wednesday, PhilHealth said the policy guides all regional offices, accredited healthcare providers, and beneficiaries in filing, processing, and evaluating claims for IHD-AMI cases.

“All patients with acute myocardial infarction, including those with ST-elevation (STEMI) or non-ST elevation (Non-STEMI), may avail of the package,” the state insurer said.

“A non-specific or non-diagnostic ECG should not disqualify a patient from receiving the benefit.”

The advisory also emphasized that accredited health facilities without the capability to perform percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI) or fibrinolysis must coordinate and refer patients to hospitals capable of providing these services.

Referring facilities may still claim the “Emergency Medical Services with Coordinated Referral and Interfacility Transfer (IHD-AMI-C)” package. They are also advised to refer patients for cardiac rehabilitation as part of their medical management, even if PCI or fibrinolysis is not performed.

Cardiac rehabilitation sessions may begin during hospital admission and continue on an outpatient basis.

Patients are required to complete at least six sessions provided on different dates, supervised by a cardiac rehabilitation specialist or, where unavailable, by a cardiologist in collaboration with a physiatrist.

PhilHealth encouraged health facilities to establish dedicated cardiac rehabilitation units but noted that the absence of such units should not hinder the delivery of rehabilitation services.

The state insurer also clarified that a 24-hour hospital admission is not required for reimbursement of IHD-AMI claims, emphasizing access to timely referral, early revascularization, and cardiac rehabilitation to improve patient outcomes.

“All accredited health facilities are encouraged to forge networks to improve access and address service gaps,” PhilHealth said.

It added that referrals to facilities with similar service capabilities are also acceptable and do not automatically require transferring patients to higher-level hospitals.

PBBM leads 1st gov’t-

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. on Thursday led the opening of the first government-initiated housing expo under his term at the World Trade Center – gathering the country’s top private developers and thousands of prospective homebuyers.

The National Housing Expo 2025, organized by the Home Development Mutual Fund or Pag IBIG Fund– one of the attached agencies of the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD), was among the highlights of this year’s celebration of the National Shelter Month, spearheaded by the DHSUD.

“This is also in furtherance of President Marcos Jr.’s push for safer, decent and dignified government housing under the flagship Expanded 4PH,” DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling said.

The expo is touted to further propel the nationwide implementation of the administration’s flagship Expanded Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino (4PH) Program, thus, benefitting more Filipino families.

The President led the ceremonial awarding of certificates of entitlements (COEs) and titles to beneficiaries of government housing programs like rental housing, enhanced community mortgage program, Pag IBIG subsidized rates under the Expanded 4PH, and those covered by Presidential Proclamations– which served as

He further warned that those proven guilty of tampering or selling unauthorized electric meters may also face disconnection of electrical service and permanent disqualification from future power service connections.

Registering for the One RFID program is optional. Motorists with existing, separate Autosweep and Easytrip RFIDs and accounts may choose to join the toll interoperability program, but those who choose to maintain two separate RFID accounts, may also do so, the companies said.

This project was initiated by government through the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB), in line with their mandate to improve the efficiency of the country's expressway network.

The private operators had been working closely with government over the years, to make the vision of toll interoperability a reality.

"The road to One RFID was not easy, as it required extensive work on the part of all stakeholders. Both ETC providers made significant upgrades to their existing infrastructure to integrate their systems, while conducting rigorous testing to ensure smooth and seamless interoperability," the firms said.

With the completion of the interoperability project, the expressway operators said their focus will now be on roll-out—making registration to the One RFID program more convenient and accessible—as well as continuous improvements to the system, to ensure overall better experience at the expressways for motorists.

"We express our gratitude to the leadership of the DOTR led by Secretary Giovanni Z. Lopez and TRB Executive Director Jose Arturo M. Tugade for their steady hands in steering this project towards the finish line. Their valuable guidance helped us navigate the existing regulatory environment, which simplified settlement mechanisms, so that motorists can enjoy a smooth and secure experience," the companies said.

The tollway operators expressed their continued committed to support government initiatives, invest in world-class systems, and contribute towards a better Philippines for all.

DepEd, DPWH, LGUs to sign MOA to address classroom backlog

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) will sign a memorandum of agreement (MOA) with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) and local government units (LGUs) to address the classroom backlog in the country, Malacañang said on Wednesday.

The signing of the MOA is in line with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to provide direct funding to LGUs for the construction of classrooms in the country, Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said in a press briefing.

"Nakatakandang magkaroon ng memorandum of agreement ang DPWH, DepEd at local government units upang mapatupad ito

(A memorandum of agreement is set to be signed by the DPWH, DepEd, and local government units to implement this)," Castro said.

"Ang nais ng Pangulo, ang kakulangan sa classrooms ay dapat na mapunan sa lalong madaling panahon para sa kabutihang mga mag-aaral. Hindi puwede ang mabagal kumilos, iyan ang direktiba ng Pangulo (The President wants the classroom shortage to be addressed as soon as possible for the benefit of the students. Delays in action are not acceptable – that is the President's directive)."

Castro did not indicate when the MOA is expected to be signed.

She said Marcos

wants the swift construction and improvement of classrooms, after the DepEd lamented that only 22 out of the 1,700 classrooms targeted for completion this year have so far been finished by the DPWH.

DepEd Secretary Sonny Angara on Tuesday raised concern over the delays caused by the DPWH's sole implementation of all DepEd-funded projects since 2018.

Castro noted that under the MOA, the funds will be entrusted to the LGUs, while the implementation and classroom construction will be monitored by the DPWH and DepEd.

She said that approximately 2,370 classrooms will be constructed

through the partnership between DepEd, DPWH, and LGUs. Castro said the target is to complete about 2,000 classrooms by the third quarter of 2026.

Spearheading the program is the Department of Transportation (DOTr), in partnership with the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB), Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC), and San Miguel Corporation (SMC) Tollways.

Under the new policy, motorists with an existing RFID account can register for cross-expressway interoperability, enabling a single RFID tag to be used on all toll roads in Luzon, whether under the Autosweep or Easytrip systems.

"Finally, what we call one RFID, All Tollways has come true. This is the true meaning of seamless connection, convenience for our riders," DOTr acting secretary Giovanni Lopez said during the launch.

The program's practicality has been well-received by drivers, who previously faced the hassle of maintaining separate accounts and switching lanes.

Argel Aligui, a dealer sales coordinator from Los Baños, Laguna, who travels frequently for work, noted the benefits for both private and commercial drivers.

"It will reduce the hassle of installing and load-

ing and also speed up the flow of traffic at toll booths," he said.

Aligui, a car enthusiast, also added that the unified system would lead to "lessening RFID stickers on my car."

Imran Pangan from Bay, Laguna, emphasized the convenience for his frequent travels to Northern Luzon. "It's more convenient [for me], because only one of my RFID accounts has autodebit, so I have to load the other one manually... it's really hassle-free," he said.

The DOTr confirmed that registration for the

interoperability feature is free of charge and can be done online or at designated service centers. Motorists are advised to update their accounts to ensure a smooth transition.

Government and private partners are also promoting the program to reduce traffic congestion and minimize physical contact at toll plazas by encouraging adherence to a cashless system. The "One RFID, All Tollways" program is a significant step toward modernizing and interconnecting the country's transportation network. (AM/PIA4A)

DepEd: 4-day break upholds teachers, learners' well-being

MANILA – Education Secretary Sonny Angara on Thursday announced a four-day wellness break for teachers and students from Oct. 27 to 30, giving them time to rest ahead of the All Saints' and All Souls' Day holidays.

Angara said the break aligns with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to prioritize the well-being of educators and learners while ensuring the delivery of quality education.

In a Facebook post, Angara explained that the move was a response to appeals from teachers and students, especially those affected by recent earthquakes, typhoons, and flu.

"This is a time to rest, regain strength, and be with your families," he said in Filipino.

"Many of our teachers and learners come from areas that were hit by typhoons and earthquakes, or perhaps contracted the flu. That's why we need to rest for a while, our DepEd fellows!"

Meanwhile, Angara said the declaration also gives schools the discretion to adjust their midyear In-Service Training (INSET) schedules, which may be moved after the break.

This means that

even those public schools and divisions that already paid for venues and meals for INSET may move it to another date and use it for other purposes.

Rescheduled INSET and professional development programs, however, should still fall on any dates within the remaining days of School Year (SY) 2025–2026.

If schedule adjustments are not possible, attendance will be voluntary, and teachers who already participated will not be required to attend similar activities again this school year.

Regular classes will resume on Nov. 3. source: (PNA)
