In a simple turn-over ceremony held at the Noveleta National High School in Barangay San Rafael, Mayor Dino Reyes-Chua handed over the tablets to DepEd Noveleta District Supervisor Dr. Arnel Zapanta together with Assistant Schools Division Superintendents Randy Punzalan and Dr. Diana Topacio

The provision of computer tablets is part of the local government's program in support of education in the New Normal with the use of blended learning modality, online classes supported with learning modules.

Metro Manila's biggest COVID-19 isolation facility will soon open after the Solaire-PAGCOR Mega Quarantine Center in Bagong Nayong Pilipino, Parañaque City was inaugurated and turned over by the Razon Group to

the national government on Tuesday, September 29.

The ceremony was led by National Task Force Against COVID-19 Chairman and Defense Secretary Delfin Lorenzana, National Action Plan Against COVID-19 Dep-

uty Chief Implementer Secretary Vince Dizon, Presidential Spokesperson Harry Roque, Prime BMD CEO J.V. Emmanuel "Jocot" De Dios, and Department of Public Works and Highways Undersecretary for Project Management

Office Emil Sadain. Also present were Ach. Dan Lichauco of Archion Architects and Maynilad Head Assistant Vice President for Government Relations Ms. Annette de Ocampo.

"I still remember

## IMEE: WHAT DO WE DO WHEN HOMEWORK BECOMES GARBAGE?

Senator Imee Marcos has put the Department of Education (DepEd), local government units (LGUs), and schools on alert to a creeping environmental problem, as printed self-learning modules will begin to pile up when classes resume next week.

"Imagine the multiplier effect with the number of modules for each subject, the number of subjects for each kid, the number of kids in each home, and the number of homes in each community, and you will end up with mountains of trash," Marcos pointed out.

Marcos said a waste disposal system that facilitates the recycling of discarded paper must be organized not just in highly urbanized cities but also in areas that will have limited access to online classes and where printed modules will become the new learning norm.

"Since paper is totally biodegradable, a recycling plan must be put in place to reduce the need to dump discarded paper in landfills," Marcos said.

"As it is, a good bulk of landfills is made up of waste paper. With our new methods of education, its toll on the environment cannot be underestimated," Marcos added.

Marcos cited that the growth of landfills has been a perennial problem that local government units are constantly looking to control.

"Homes tend to be less strict than schools in implementing waste segregation measures. With schools half closed, systematic waste segregation of

## Gierran takes oath of office, now PhilHealth chief

Atty. Dante A. Gierran officially assumed leadership of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) after Department of Health (DOH) Sec. Francisco T. Duque III swore him in via a simple ceremony held online on September 17.

Gierran replaced retired Army General Ricardo C. Morales who resigned on August 26, 2020 due to his health condition.

Gierran thanked Duque for his support to the National Health Insurance Program and vowed to regain the people's trust in PhilHealth through effective public service devoid of fraud and corruption.

Prior to assuming the helm at the country's state health insurance agency, Gierran retired from the service on February 2020 after serving the National Bureau of Investigation for 29 years, the last four of which as the Bureau's chief.

## Gender-Responsive Reporting: Role of Journalists

*"Gender is not just the women's issue, to be truly equal, men and women must be seen and heard as equals. Let us integrate it in news reports and the newsrooms by eliminating language and images that misrepresent, that exclude or offend the other gender," Ambassador Bita Rasouljan, Austrian ambassador to the Philippines and European Union gender champion, said.*

*She added, "Let us recognize the transformative role journalists play in shaping public discourse and promoting gender equality by being gender-sensitive."*

*According to the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW), the overall proportion of stories focusing on women has had relatively steady at 10 percent since the year 2000.*

*"Being gender responsive in reporting is not an option, it is a must," Atty. Kristine Rosary Yuzon-Chaves, executive director of PCW, said before journalists, communications students, and educators in Central Visayas region during a webinar.*

*She stressed that fair gender portrayal must be a professional and ethical aspiration for all journalists, it must be given the same equal importance as the respect for accuracy, fairness, and honesty in the profession.*

*Media feed the consuming public messages that end up forming their social values and influencing decision-making, also editorial decision can affect public discourse, she added.*

*Among the Standards of Gender-Responsive Reporting journalists must adhere are:*

1. Content of the media must be empowering. Emphasis is on the story, and not the sex or gender identity of the subject.
2. Non-discrimination and derogatory portrayal of women. Protect the image of women and the men in a dignified manner.
3. Balance in the representation of men and women. Present stories of women and men with equal prominence and frequency.
4. Avoiding gender stereotypes. Pursue stories that liberate women and men from rigid standards.
5. Harness the power of language in the journalistic profession or shifting to gender-neutral language and avoiding the use of non-sexist language.

*6. Gender-fairness must transcend the digital news sphere. These platforms will not be used to perpetuate discrimination or abuse. These standards is part of the PCW-released Gender-Fair Media Guidebook released in 2018 as a guide for journalists to self-assess if media content is gender-responsive.*

*Meanwhile, Dr. MingKwok Lim, advisor for communications and information in UNESCO office in Jakarta, shared that gender lens help avoid stereotypes thus creating more accurate messaging.*

*He reminds journalists to be aware of unconscious biases and be mindful on the use of language.*

*Also in reporting violence against women, use of accurate and non-judgmental language is important.*

*"Don't let crime be the only story, focus on the responses to the violence like what the institutions are doing, where to call for help or the so-called solutions journalism" Dr. Lim said.*

*In finality, "Key in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) is leaving no one behind and these are men, women, boys, and girls, old and young, thus we must provide equal opportunities to access and rights, and one way is improving how we report on gender issues."*

*Gender-Responsive Journalism can benefit the nation, through the SDGs, and can contribute to an equitable, enabling environment for human development. (JCR/AMB/JDS PIA La Union)*

## 4 NPA REBELS YIELD AFTER SOLDIERS RETRIEVE TERRORIST WAR MATERIALS IN QUEZON

CAMP CAPINPIN, Tanay, Rizal, (PIA) --Four more NPA rebels voluntarily surrendered a few hours after soldiers recovered an M16 rifle along with explosives in Quezon on Wednesday, September 23.

Based on the report that reached the 2nd Infantry Division, the former rebels belonged to the NPA's Sub Regional Military Area or SRMA 4A and opted to surrender after localized peace negotiation in Brgy Canaway, General Nakar while the recovery of war materials in an NPA-designated arms stash took place in Brgy Magsaysay, Infanta all in Quezon province.

Lt. Col. Jesus Dioc-ton, Commanding Officer of 11B, identified the former rebels as alias Anton, alias Alvin, alias Jim, and alias Boy, adding that all of them used to play key roles in the NPA atrocities in the hinterland communities of Quezon. "We were also able to recover one M16 rifle, one hand grenade, and an anti-personnel landmine after our troops acted

upon the reports of our informant regarding an arms cache belonging to the terrorists."

"These NPA terrorists hide their firearms and other war materials whenever they want to evade our forces and recover them once the government troops leave the area," added Dioc-ton.

The military has recorded a total of 115 surrendered firearms since 2016.

BGen Alex Rillera, Commander of the 202nd Brigade said that the community's support to our soldiers has caused growing demoralization and disenchantment across the ranks of the NPA rebels resulting to unprecedented number of surrenders and recovery of firearms as the government advances its campaign to finally push these terrorists in the verge of irreversible collapse.

"Our soldiers have proven, yet again, their ability to secure their informants and their families from any acts of retaliation from the NPA terrorists."

Rillera added that those willing NPA rebels who will turn their backs from the armed conflict will be treated humanely and with dignity while those who shall insist to stay on the path of terrorism must be ready to face the full force of the law.

The former rebels are set to undergo the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program or E-CLIP enrollment process, where a former rebel will be assessed by the DSWD for profiling and counseling by their health experts in preparation for their reintegration to the mainstream society.

For his part, MGen Greg Almerol, Commander of the Army's 2nd Infantry Division praised the bravery of the concerned civilians who set aside their safety and wellbeing, and instead, chose to help the government forces by tipping off timely information to support our quest to end the five-decade insurgency and bring peace the soonest possible time.

"We are calling the

remaining NPA terrorists to abandon your violent ideologies and return to the folds of the law so that you and your families will be able to have a bright and secured future and without you having to die for an unworthy cause."

Almerol assured the people of Southern Tagalog that the government will not tolerate any acts of terror to its

The LTFRB said the resumption of bus operations in these areas was approved by the respective local government units (LGUs) covering the routes following a "comprehensive agency engagement" with stakeholders, including the terminal and bus operators.

Based on the circular, drop-offs and pickups in any part of the modified routes are prohibited except for the designated stopover points and terminals where the bus will last stop.

The public vehicles would be monitored by authorities via the global navigation satellite system. Operators would also get a QR Code that must be placed on a short bond paper and posted inside the bus. Passengers, mean-

while, need to secure a travel authority/pass from the Philippine National Police near the terminal; a valid ID; a written consent allowing the LGU to subject them for Covid-19 testing or quarantine if needed; and other documents required by the LGU or the Inter-Agency Task Force for Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID). The LTFRB said both drivers and passengers need to follow the protocols set by IATF-EID, including wearing face mask and face shield, carrying and using alcohol and sanitizer, and following the one-meter physical distancing. Eating, drinking, and talking to other passengers as well as taking calls from a cell-phone while inside the public vehicle are also prohibited.

A passenger must get a trip ticket two days prior to the date of travel via an online platform or at the bus terminal itself.

"Buying a trip ticket is prohibited on the day trip unless it's an emergency like family problems or health," the LTFRB said.

All buses that would travel in modified provincial bus routes would be subject to regular monitoring, the LTFRB added. SOURCE:(PNA)

of other countries, the number one purpose of [our] lockdown, was to enable us to build our capacities. Fast forward, we now have a lot of facilities and this is the newest one. We hope to put up more isolation facilities not only in Metro Manila but also in the regions," Lorenzana said.

The Solaire-PAGCOR Mega Quarantine Center has a 600-bed capacity for COVID-19 patients with mild and no symptoms. Constructed in less than two months, the facility will be manned by the Armed Forces of the Philippines Health Service Command and is being eyed to be operational by November.

Patients to be accommodated in the said facility are the ones referred by local government units as well as by the One Hospital Command Center.

"We cannot thank the Razon Group enough for really building this in record time. This will go a long way in our efforts especially now that we are focusing on reopening the economy. Isolation facilities such as these will really play a critical role in ensuring that we are able to manage COVID-19 cases as we allow more people to go back to work," Dizon said.

According to Dizon, Metro Manila presently has about 28,000-bed capacity in its isolation facilities including those under the local government units and the isolation hotels commissioned by the national government under Oplan Kalinga.

The Department of Public Works and Highways is also implementing the construction of 131 quarantine facilities in the National Capital Region with a 5,000-bed capacity. Of this number, 52 facilities have been completed.

"While we have relied on large-scale infrastructure projects to underpin our business and growth, we are greatly honored to have been able to participate in this project. We are very proud to be involved in the fight against COVID-19 and to be able to deliver this facility to the government. We will not be able to accomplish this without the different government agencies [that] work tirelessly," De Dios said.

Prime BMD is the construction arm of the Razon Group. The Group has also been involved in the construction of We Heal As One Centers at the Ninoy Aquino Stadium and the Rizal Memorial Complex. (NTF against COVID-19)

# POPCOM CALABARZON joins the rest of the world in the celebration of World Contraception Day

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) --Based on the 2017 National Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS), CALABARZON region has reached almost a hundred percent of currently married women ages 15-49 who have heard at least one family planning method and 36% of women 15-49 years old currently used any modern method of family planning. Relatively, almost half or 46% of the population 15-49 years old are not using any modern family planning method.

Moreover, three out of every 10 pregnancies are unplanned or unintended, based on a Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) survey. The UNFPA also reported that even if some 214 million women worldwide want to avoid pregnancy, they risk getting pregnant. This is due to lack of access to family planning methods or absence of support from partners and communities.

According to the study of University of the Philippine Population Institute (UPPI) on "the Potential Impact of the COVID19 Pandemic on Sexual and Reproductive Health in the Philippines", the potentially significant impact of the disruption in the delivery of Sexual and Reproductive Health services underscores the need for a sustained provision of essential family planning and maternal health services, and social and protective networks, during the period of quarantine to mitigate any further devastating effects.

To improve awareness on all available contraceptive methods and enable young people to make informed choices on their sexual and reproductive health, the World Contraception Day is celebrated every 26th of September yearly. This year's theme is "Your Life, Your Choice".

POPCOM continues its partnership with Bayer, a global enterprise, in bringing the World Contraception Day in the country as an annual movement which aims to provide information and awareness about contraception to young people on how it is important to make informed choices on their sexual and reproductive health.

The Commission on Population and Development (POPCOM) IV-A CALABARZON has extended its campaign on family planning to reach out to more families and individuals in the region through various strategies amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

POPCOM CALABARZON Regional Director Angelito Obcena stated that face to face discussion about family planning is still challenging given the current situation. Thus, the use of social media was intensified and mobilized in informing the Filipinos on responsible parenthood and family planning information and services through the partner LGUs who are conducting the house to house visits and providing FP services. POPCOM Helpline was also launched in providing basic information and referrals.

As part of the celebration, POPCOM CALABARZON wants to remind the public that the "POPCOM Helpline" is always available and ready to respond any issues and concerns related to Responsible Parenthood and Family Planning, Adolescent Health Gender-Based Violence and COVID-19. # 12 PROVINCIAL BUS ROUTES TO OPEN IN CENTRAL LUZON, CALABARZON

MANILA – A total of 12 modified provincial bus routes would be opened in Central Luzon and Calabarzon starting September 30, the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) announced Saturday.

Under Memorandum Circular 2020-051, the buses may resume operations provided that they have a valid and existing certificate of public convenience (CPC) or application for Extension of Validity and that the units have a personal passenger insurance policy.

The modified bus routes are:

1. San Fernando, Pampanga - Araneta Center, Cubao, Quezon City
2. Batangas City, Batangas - Parañaque Integrated Terminal Ex-

## METRO MANILA UNDER GCQ FOR OCTOBER
