Judiciary gets P58-B budget for more efficient, reliable system

As the administration of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. continues to strive for the efficient and reliable administration of justice, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) allocated P57.79 billion to the Judiciary branch in the proposed 2024 national budget.

DBM Secretary Amenah F. Pangandaman underscored that the Judiciary was provided a significantly higher fund compared

to its P54.91 billion from the Fiscal Year 2023 General Appropriations Act.

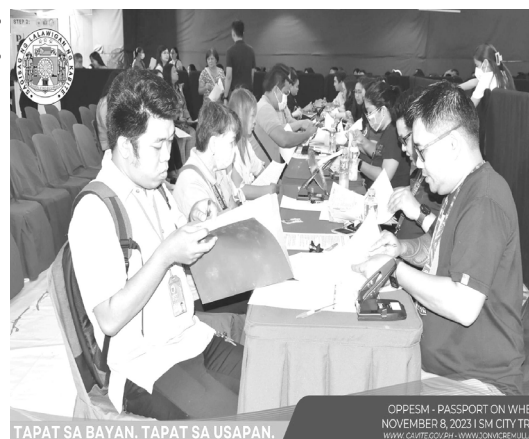

Measles cases in PH surge by 299% this year - DOH

According to the data shown by the Department of Health (DOH), the measles cases this year across the country increased almost 300% from January 1 to October 14, 2023 compared to the total measles cases from last year.

Based on DOH’s latest epidemic-prone disease case surveillance, a total of 458 registered measles cases were recorded in 2022 and 1,829 this year, equivalent to 299%.

With the continuous increase of measles cases the DOH together with developmental partners United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) and World Health Organization (WHO) continues the drive of the “Chikiting Ligtas” campaign program.

“I think this is expected kasi the past year, ang baba ng MMR vaccination natin sa mga bata. In fact, hindi tayo nakaabot doon sa 90% na kinakailangan (I think this is expected because the past year, the MMR vaccination among children is low. In fact, we did not reach the 90% vaccine coverage needed),” Infectious diseases expert Dr. Rontgene Solante said in the public briefing on Wednesday, November 8.

“If we can remember also, we had measles outbreaks in 2018 and 2019, so it becomes a cycle now na kapag mababa ang vaccination rate sa mga bata ay tataas ang mga kaso (When children’s immunization rates is low, the number of cases increases), and this is now the result because of the low vaccination coverage that the country had for the past two to three years,” he added.

Due to the low immunization coverage, the program aims to lessen the measles cases and other infectious diseases by giving a free vaccination to the children – the most cost-effective protection against measles.

The local government also cooperated with DOH by giving a memorandum to barangay-level local government units urging them to support the measles vaccination to avoid the cycle of measles outbreak in the country.

According to the Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD) and World Health Organization (WHO), the most effective prevention with Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) is community-wide vaccination.

Prevention

1. Get the MMR shot and be vaccinated.
2. Maintain proper hygiene and keep your

hands clean.

3. Cover nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing.

4. Avoid sharing food, water, utensils and other items contaminated by saliva.

The WHO said that there is no specific treatment for measles thus experts usually give recommendations only to relieve the symptoms until the immune system fights off the virus.

The DOH advised people who got infected to drink enough water and treatments for dehydration and eat healthy food. And see a doctor once the symptoms get worse because measles is highly infectious that can cause death.

PH embassy to Holy See honors Pinoys in top posts in Rome

ROME– The Philippine embassy to the Holy See honored 83 Filipinos occupying top posts in the Vatican and institutes of consecrated life based in Rome, a roster led by no less than the country’s top churchman, Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle.

Ambassador Myla Grace Ragenia Macahilig led the awarding rites on Nov. 3 at the hall of the Pontifical Patristic Institute Augustinianum just outside St. Peter’s Square, with Tagle delivering an inspirational message.

The Filipiniana-themed event gathered a who’s who of Filipino clerics and religious men and women just days after the conclusion of the 2023 Synod of Bishops.

Given official Philippine government recognition were five heads of congregations: Fr. Teodoro Kalaw, superior general of the Adorno Fathers or the Order of Clerics Regular Minor; Sr. Marife Mendoza, superior general of the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart; Br. Armin Luistro, superior general of the Brothers of Christian Schools or the La Salle Brothers; Fr. Jesus Dajac, superior general of the Clerical Congregation of the Missionaries of Faith; and Fr. Gerard Francisco Timoner III, master of the Order of Preachers or the Dominican Order.

The embassy cited Filipino curial officials, led by Tagle, pro-prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization. Also cited from the same dicastery were Monsignors Ericson Tiu and Erwin Jose Balagapo.

From the Secretariat of State, Msgr. Jan Limchua; from the Dicastery for Consecrated Life, Fr. Stefano Canuto; and from the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints, Sr. Arlyn Gotoman.

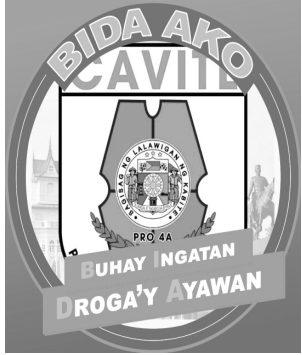

a resident of Brgy 56, Cavite City, Cavite wanted for the crime of Estafa.

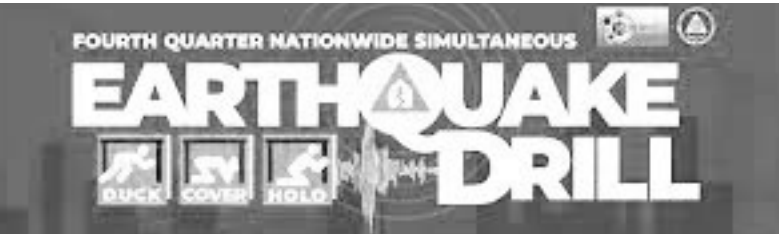

LRT-1 Cavite extension 94% complete, on track for Q4 2024 opening

MANILA – The civil and system works of the Light Rail Transit Line 1 (LRT-1) Cavite Extension reached a progress rate of 94.1 percent in the third quarter of 2023, according to its private operator Light Rail Manila Corporation (LRMC).

In a statement Friday, the LRMC said the five new stations under the project are on track to open by the last quarter of 2024.

This includes Redemptorist Station at 86.3 percent completion, the Manila International Airport (MIA) Station at 86.9 percent, Asia World Station (to be connected to the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX) at 72.9 percent, Ninoy Aquino

Station at 81.5 percent, and Dr. Santos Station at 90.5 percent.

“With construction activities in full swing, safety remains the top priority of LRMC for its workers and workplaces by carrying out programs to ensure stringent health, safety, and environmental practices among its employees and contractors,” the LRMC said.

To date, the project has accumulated 11.8 million “safe man-hours” without a lost time incident as of September.

LRMC president and CEO Juan Alfonso expressed confidence that the commercial operations of the LRT-1 Cavite Extension project will begin in less than a year.

“The overall progress rate is a good signal to usher the country into an era of modern railway experience where passengers can take advantage of world-class amenities, user-friendliness, and PWD-friendly facilities, high standards of safety and security, and value-added services,” Alfonso said.

The first phase of the Cavite Extension project consists of a 6.7-kilometer extension of the mainline and five stations.

These stations will be near or connected to several other transport hubs such as the MIA, the PITX and a bus terminal in Cavite as well as an interconnection with SM City Sucat. (PNA)

receive their plaques of appreciation in person.

Embassy officials gave plaques to a total of 14 Filipino vicars of the different congregations based in Rome, along with 42 members of general councils, seven general secretaries or general assistants, and seven general treasurers or economists.

The embassy also awarded Filipino officials of the Pontificio Collegio Filipino, the college for Filipino priests studying in Rome, namely Fr. Gregory Ramon Gaston, the rector, and Fr. Andrew Recepcion, spiritual director.

“Numbers-wise, it is a very strong voice of the Filipino Catholic community here in Rome,” Macahilig told the gathering. “As you take on your tasks in your communities, you also carry with you the flag of the Philippines,” Macahilig said.

Sister Arlyn Gotoman and Fr. Dennis Duene

Ruiz, definitor general of the Order of Discalced Augustinians, delivered responses on behalf of the Filipino religious community in Rome.

“I am proud of and take pride in being a Filipina. Our creativity exceeds in all aspects. Our capabilities to bring positivity, optimism, joy and cheerfulness to the face of our colleagues are priceless,” said Gotoman, a former school principal who had worked under Luistro when he was secretary of education.

Citing the theme of the recent celebration of the 500th anniversary of the arrival of Christianity in the Philippines, Gotoman and Ruiz said Filipinos were really “gifted to give.”

“Our flexibility, adaptability and common sense are evident. Our hospitality is superb. Our industrious attitude generates success in our field of mission,” Gotoman said.

Ruiz said: “As religious Filipinos, we are

privileged to participate in the synodal and dynamic interest of the Church prior to this experience of the Synod on Synodality, with our basic ecclesial communities.”

Cardinal Tagle reminded the religious that their positions of authority came from the mercy of people and of God.

Tagle recalled how he was summoned to the sickbed of his former professor, Jesuit church historian Fr. John Schumacher.

Schumacher, Tagle said, reminded him that he used to sleep in class.

“Curial official, et cetera, vicar, oekonomo. Hoy, kilala tayo ng Diyos. Tutulog-tulog din lang tayong lahat. Habang tayo’y pinaparangalan, lalo sana tayong maging mapagpakukbaba at makiisa sa mga kapwa natin na ibinaba at minsan ay hinihila papaba at tinatapakan,” the former Manila archbishop said.

Anchored on the theme, "Agenda for Prosperity: Securing a Future-Proof and Sustainable Economy," the proposed Fiscal Year 2024 national budget amounts to P5.768 trillion.

Out of the said amount, P27.65 billion was dedicated to the adjudication program undertaken by the Supreme Court of the Philippines and the Lower Courts (SCPLC), Sandiganbayan, Court of Appeals (CA), and Court of Tax Appeals (CTA).

The Judiciary will also continue to implement the Justice System Infrastructure Program (JUSIP), which will be supported with the P4.19 billion allocation in capital outlays for the construction, repairs, and rehabilitation of halls of justice nationwide.

Furthermore, P1.442 billion has been provided for ICT requirements such as cybersecurity solutions, renewal of security applications of the SC, improvement of connectivity and data servers, and development of e-Filing and e-Service modules under the justice sector convergence program.

To pursue the conduct of succeeding bar examinations in a computerized format and sustain the momentum of the shift towards a technology-driven Judiciary, the allocation for the conduct of the bar examinations was increased to P720.956 million from its P510 million fund in FY 2023. Meanwhile, the Special Shari'ah bar examinations were dedicated to P100 million in the FY 2024 NEP. (DBM/PIA-Caraga)

Cayetano extends aid to hundreds of flood victims in Bulacan

Senator Alan Peter Cayetano on Wednesday extended aid to more than 300 residents in Bulacan to help them recover from the economic impact of the recent flooding in the province due to Typhoon Egay. The senator's Emergency Response Department (ERD) team collaborated with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) to distribute assistance to flood victims in Calumpit, Hagonoy, and Malolos City.

The disbursement was held at the Bulacan State University Hagonoy Campus under the DSWD's Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS), a program that provides various forms of aid to Filipinos facing extreme economic hardships, including support for medical, food, or educational needs.

One of the beneficiaries was Christian Esguera, a 43-year-old father of five who works as a timekeeper for a construction company.

"Kapag wala kaming trabaho, wala rin kaming inaasahang sweldo. Kaya nito pong nagdaang kalamidad, dumanas po kami ng pagsubok sa pangangailangan sa pang-araw-araw," he said.

Heavy rains brought by back-to-back Super Typhoon Egay and Typhoon Falcon, coupled with an enhanced southwest monsoon, caused extensive flooding in many parts of Bulacan for more than a month, resulting in more than P500 million worth of infrastructure damage.

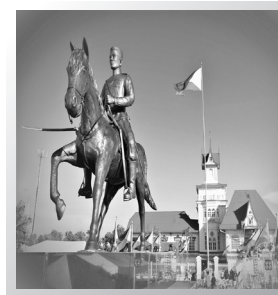
