Gonzales was arrested for the crime of RAPE under Art. 206-A Par. 1 in Rel. to R.A 7610 (Child Abuse Law) docketed under Criminal Case Number TG12-1812 & 1812 A (AS) (2 Counts) dated

October 01, 2013 with no bail recommended.

He was brought to the police station for proper disposition of the case and will be turned over to the court of origin to face trial filed against him.

Subic's first hospital to rise soon

SUBIC, Zambales – After decades of planning and preparations, a 100-bed, fully equipped Subic General Hospital is finally set to rise here.

“It was the dream that was first conceptualized during the first year in office of our father, former mayor, now Congressman Jeffrey Khonghun,” Mayor Jonathan John Khonghun said in his message during a groundbreaking ceremony on Wednesday (Jan. 26).

Khonghun said when he was elected as mayor in 2019, one of the many priority projects of his administration was the construction of the general hospital.

However, the project was deferred as the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) crisis started in early 2020.

“But because of Covid-19 pandemic, we have seen the importance of health care system. Today, we are holding this groundbreaking ceremony to officially make that dream a reality. A dream come true that will benefit the people of Subic and those from the northern municipalities of Zambales,” he added.

The proposed Subic General Hospital will be built inside the 5,000-square meter property on the main road in Sitio Mapanao in Barangay Cawag. The budget allocation is PHP100 million.

The property, which used to be a fish farm, was developed and donated by Wilfredo Tan, president of Fiesta Communities Inc.

COVID -19 Vaccination for Children aged 5 to 11 to start on Feb. 4

The government will start giving COVID-19 vaccines to children aged 5 to 11 years old starting February 4, according to National Task Force Against COVID-19 Chief Implementer and vaccine czar Secretary Carlito G. Galvez, Jr. on Monday night.

In his presentation during President Duterte’s Talk to the People address, Galvez assured parents that the reformulated COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective.

‘Hospitainers’ boost Bacoor City’s COVID-19 center capacity

A CONTRACTOR AGENT NABBED FOR COMELEC GUN BAN

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City, Cavite- A contractor was arrested in a COMELEC Checkpoint in Brgy Gavino Maderan, GMA, Cavite on January 25, 2022 after having been flag down and subsequently found to violate COMELEC Gun Ban.

The suspect was identified as JOHN ANGELO GANDIONCO y ALTARE-JOS, 33 years old, single, Contractor/Agent, and a resident of Brgy Sampaloc 3, Dasmariñas City, Cavite.

Initial report revealed that at about 7:30 in the evening of January 25, 2022 in Brgy Gavino, while duty team was conducting COMELEC Checkpoint and flagged down one (1) Toyota Innova, color silver gray being driven by the above-mentioned suspect, did there and then in plain view noticed inside suspect’s vehicle one (1) calibre 38 super, COLT MK IV series 70, inserted with one (1) magazine loaded with six (6) rounds of ammunition and one (1) spare magazine with five (5) rounds ammunition.

During inquiry in the checkpoint, the suspect introduced himself as non-organic personnel of NBI and presented two (2) identification cards with the logo of NBI. The suspect was apprised of his Miranda Rights and subsequently brought to the police station along with the pieces of evidence seized including the vehicle used for proper disposition.

A case for Violation of COMELEC OMNIBUS ELECTION CODE or BP 881 was prepared to be filed in the proper court.

quarter of 2022,” said Mayor Salamat.

More than a dozen steel cages were recently completed on May 17, 2021 which according to mayor Salamat will now be distributed to every barangay in the municipality for the temporary holding of stray dogs.

The local government for years had been taking steps in preparation for the program with the training of personnel of the Municipal Agriculture Office on Rabies Awareness, Animal Impounding and Management of Dog Pound for the Animal Control Officers of LGU on August 2019.

Subsequently, on

March 27, 2021 the Municipal Ordinance no. 02-2021 or the Anti-Rabies Ordinance was passed and approved by the LGU which provided for the pertinent guidelines to protect human and animal inhabitants of the municipality from rabies infection pursuant to the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007.

Additional steps for the full implementation of this program are the skills enhancement of Animal Control Officers for the proper and safe handling of animals and the procurement of an Animal Control Vehicle. (Ruel Francisco with reports from Alfonso LGU)

House ratifies bill regulating vape products

MANILA – The House of Representatives on Wednesday ratified the bicameral conference committee report on a bill that would regulate the importation, manufacture, sale, packaging, distribution, use, and communication of vaporized nicotine and non-nicotine products, as well as novel tobacco products.

During the plenary session, the chamber approved the final version that reconciles the disagreeing provisions of House Bill 9007 and Senate Bill 2239.

House Deputy Speaker Rufus Rodriguez said the measure aims to offer an alternative for Filipinos who want to quit smoking.

With the enactment of the bill into law, posts, messages, or images by manufacturers, importers, distributors, and retailers that encourage the purchase and use of vape products would be prohibited.

The bill mandates the Department of Health (DOH) to prescribe guidelines on the implementation of smoking and vaping restriction awareness campaigns.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), meanwhile, would consult with the Food and Drug Administration in setting technical standards for the safety, consistency, and quality of vape products.

Manufacturers, distributors, importers, and sellers would then be given an 18-month transitory period from the issuance of the implementing rules and regulations to comply with the requirements of the measure.

This would include the registration of the vape products with the DTI.

The bill provides protection to minors from accessing vape products by setting the minimum allowable age for the purchase, sale, and use of such products to 18 years old.

The DOH earlier expressed strong opposition to the bill, as it is retrogressive and contains several provisions that contradict public health goals and international standards and undermines the country's progress in tobacco control, according to a DOH news release on Sunday.

It said lowering the age of access to vapor products from 21 to 18 years old, allowing flavorings, and permitting advertising and sponsorship strategies would expose the youth to harmful and addictive substances by making vapor products enticing and easily accessible.

The DOH maintains that vape products are harmful and not risk-free and should be regulated as health products due to their toxic substances and effects.

Vape liquids and its emission contain chemicals such as nicotine, propylene glycol, carbonyls, and carbon monoxide that are either addictive, toxic or can cause cancer.

Additionally, studies have shown vape use increases the risk of using other known addictive substances such as cigarette, alcohol, and even marijuana.

There is also growing evidence of the harmful effects of using vapes, both to the user and those exposed to its emissions, including its potential to cause cardiovascular diseases, respiratory problems, and explosion injuries.

The agency cited the Global Youth Tobacco Survey, which showed that the prevalence of using electronic cigarettes is increasing among the Filipino youth.

Data showed a 110-percent increase in vape use in just four years -- from 11.7 percent in 2015 to 24.6 percent in 2019.

A recent study conducted by the Philippine Pediatric Society and the Department of Education also showed that the age of initiation of using electronic cigarettes starts at 10 to 15 years old.

The DOH added that this is concerning because several studies noted that the brain’s prefrontal cortex, which is involved in executive and decision-making functions, continues to mature until about the age of 25.

This bill predisposes adolescents and young adults to be more susceptible in initiating smoking and subsequent nicotine addiction.

DepEd, COMELEC, DOST tie up for 2022 National and Local Elections preparations

The Department of Education (DepEd), the Commission on Elections (COMELEC), and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) have teamed up to ensure smooth preparations for the upcoming 2022 National and Local Elections.

"With three agencies working and cooperating very closely and linking our various campaigns, we can communicate with the public our joint efforts to assure free, fair, and clean elections," Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones said during the virtual Memorandum of Agreement signing on January 25.

According to the MOA, DepEd will spearhead the process of selecting teachers who will serve as members of the electoral board. Meanwhile, DOST will be in-charge of the upskilling activities and certification under the Automated Election Law.

The agencies assured the public that members of the electoral board will undergo training and written examination, which will be held virtually, and practical examination on the use of the vote-counting machines.

Secretary Briones also expressed her gratitude to the Commission for granting the increase of the honorarium of the members of

electoral boards, which will be composed of teachers. "I would like to express our appreciation to the Comelec, the Chairman and all the officials, for the generous adjustments in honoraria and allowances for the members of the electoral board, which we were advocating for in DepEd," she said.

According to the released COMELEC Resolution No. 10727, the Chairperson of the Electoral Boards will now receive P7,000; Members of Electoral Boards – P6,000; Department of Education Supervisor Official (DESO) – P5,000; and Support Staff – P3,000.
