## SC orders physical closure of courts in Alert Level 3 areas

MANILA – Chief Justice Alexander Gesmundo on Wednesday ordered the physical closure of all courts in areas under Alert Level 3 until the end of January amid the continued surge in coronavirus infections.

In Memorandum

10-2022, Gesmundo cited the unabated rise of cases of Covid-19 due to the Omicron variant in the National Capital Region, Nueva Ecija, Bulacan, Cavite, Rizal, Laguna, and other areas placed under Alert Level 3--Baguio City in the Cordillera Autono-

mous Region; Dagupan City in Region 1; Santiago City and Cagayan in Region 2; Angeles City, Bataan, Olongapo City, Zambales in Region 3; Batangas and Lucena City in Region 4-A; Naga City in Region 5, Iloilo City in Region 6 and Lapu-Lapu

City in Region 7.

"All courts in the above mentioned-areas from the Supreme Court down to the first level courts shall be physically closed to all users and may be reached only through their respective hotlines, and email address-

es and Facebook accounts, if available, effective tomorrow, 13 January 2022, Thursday until 31 January 2022, Monday," Gesmundo said.

The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (Phil-Health) announced recently that it will extend the validity of all currently accredited health facilities (HFs) until January 31, 2022.

In its Advisory No. 2021-049 signed by its President and CEO Atty. Dante A. Gierran, the state agency made the extension provided that “... they (HFs) have submitted their complete applications for CY 2022 accreditation to the concerned PhilHealth Regional Office on or before+ January 31, 2022.”

The PhilHealth Chief also reminded that applications received for continuous or renewal of accreditation beyond January 31, 2022 may result in a gap in a facility's accreditation.

Earlier in November 2021, PhilHealth released Advisory 2021-046 saying it has started accepting applications for continuous or renewal of accreditation until December 31, 2021. However, to give HFs ample time and to ensure continuous processing of their claims, the validity was further extended.

Continuous accreditation is provided under the Revised Implementing Rules

and Regulations of Republic Act 10606 or the National Health Insurance Act of 2013.

Accreditation is granted to health care providers that have applied through basic participation and complied with the requirements prescribed by PhilHealth, qualifying them to uninterrupted participation in the Program until their accreditation is withdrawn based on rules set by the Corporation. ###

# DepEd reports emerging good practices in first month of pilot face-to-face classes

The Department of Education (DepEd) has reported some of the participating schools’ emerging good practices in conducting the pilot limited face-to-face classes after a month of its implementation.

During a Senate public hearing held last December 17, 2021, Assistant Secretary for the National Academy of Sports and Field Operations Malcolm Garma reported initiatives of participating schools in learning delivery as well as health and safety measures in traditional and modern approaches.

“I think this is the opportunity insofar as education is concerned – to really showcase the shared responsibility and coordination between the schools, the community, the parents, and the LGUs. Talagang nakita po namin yung effort ng lahat ng stakeholders, especially the local government units,” Asec. Garma noted.

“Importante po yung orientation. In fact, the reason why parents have already discouraged their children pagka sinisipon, di na nila pinapapasok, because involved po ang parents sa orientation. So alam po nila basically kung ano ang gagawin,” he added.

Some of the remarkable practices of schools to ensure the safety of learners are conducting daily orientation on health protocols, contactless facilities such as faucets that are controlled by infrared sensors and thermal imaging cameras, installed sanitation boxes with UV light for the output of learners, and use of QR codes for contact tracing, among others.

“If those set of [equipment] will provide [a] certain level of comfort among the parents and among the teachers involved, tinitingnan po namin kung ano yung possible value added nito, putting up an

additional layer of protection,” he said.

In addition, he also shared the sentiments of the teachers in the importance of conducting face-to-face classes as they are now able to determine the learners’ strengths and weaknesses through one-on-one instruction.

“Many teachers have manifested that they really find it difficult to assess their learners if it is remote learning, so with the introduction of face-to-face learning, mas madali po nilang naibigay yung feedback to our learners,” Asec. Garma shared.

DepEd also reported that some teachers and school personnel are part of the COVID-19 safety marshals accredited by TESDA, IATF, and their respective LGUs that helped in constantly reminding all the involved stakeholders in complying with the health protocols stipulated in the

"The infamous massacre in Ampatuan, Maguindanao in November 2009 is a constant reminder that media workers are most vulnerable a few months before, during, and a few months after every election," Malaya said in a statement.

He said that the DILG and the PTFoMS are particularly concerned over the fact that the problem of media killings and other acts of violence against members of the media are "directly related to the geopolitical environment."

"We share the views of PTFoMS Executive Director Usec. Egco, whose office has data on the prev-

## PH Navy, TESDA ink pact on free skills training

MANILA – In line with ongoing modernization efforts, the Philippine Navy (PN) and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) signed Wednesday (Jan. 12) a memorandum of agreement (MOA) that will provide free skills training and certification related to the specialization of interested naval personnel.

"Through this partnership, TESDA is providing free skills training, assessment, and certification to PN beneficiaries through the TESDA Technology Institutions (TTIs). The skills that will be taught are related to their respective specializations, such as construction, maintenance and repair, and information technology," PN spokesperson Commander Benjo Negranza said Wednesday night.

Navy chief, Vice Adm. Adeluis Bordado and

TESDA Secretary Isidro Lapeña signed the MOA in a virtual ceremony witnessed by ranking personnel of both agencies.

Under the agreement, TESDA will also provide technical assistance to enhance the PN workforce and skills development capabilities and provide trainers with skills-related workshops, seminars, and other relevant training programs.

It is also open to dependents of PN personnel and the Navy's civilian employees.

"TESDA is privileged to further strengthen the capacity and competence of our Navy personnel through this agreement. Through this, our PN will be able to learn or expand their skills through TESDA's scholarship programs. The Navy personnel and their dependents will be given free skills training on differ-

ent courses under the information and communication technology and construction sectors," Lapeña said.

He also lauded the PN for coming up with this initiative and collaborating with them to make this partnership possible.

Meanwhile, Bordado said the partnership will help improve the technical skills of PN personnel.

“(The) success of this partnership will definitely support the Navy’s Human Capital Strategy and help sustain our future force projection. We will continue to strive to achieve significant transition milestones while we shift from a legacy Navy into a modern and multi-capable naval defense force, ready and able to perform our mandate to protect the Philippines’ maritime rights and interests,” he added. source(PNA)

## No need to panic. We have enough food! – Dar

As the government imposes stricter movement, particularly in “Alert Level 3” areas to prevent and reduce Covid-19 infections, Agriculture Secretary William Dar appealed anew to consumers to avoid panic-buying, assuring that the country has enough food supply.

“Buying more food than what we require deprives others, thus causing an artificial shortage and price spikes,” said Secretary Dar. “Our inventory for basic food commodities, particularly rice, shows that we have more than enough supply that will last for more than the next three months,” the agri chief added.

As of January 8, 2022, the country’s rice supply is good for the next 115 days, enough until the next harvest season in April, according to the Department of Agriculture’s (DA) Philippine Integrated Rice Pro-

gram. The same situation holds true for lowland and highland vegetables, which is at 85 percent and 107 percent sufficiency level, respectively.

He likewise appealed to local government units to ensure unhampered and continuous flow of food and agricultural inputs to and from production and consumption areas, particularly those affected by typhoon Odette.

He stressed that there should not be any unnecessary restrictions in the movement of goods, services and people.

“We will see to it that food supply lines are kept open, in partnership with the LGUs, and ensure continuous delivery of major food items and temper prices,” Secretary Dar said.

# 61 trainees start basic course for PDEA agents

The Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) on Thursday said it has started the training of 61 agent-trainees for Drug Enforcement Officers Basic Course (DEOBC) in its academy in Camp Castañeda, Silang, Cavite.

The DEOBC Class 2022-20 is composed of 41 males and 20 females who took their oath and underwent reception on Wednesday,

marking the beginning of their six-month regimented training as drug enforcement officers.

The hiring of DEOBC Class 2022-20 started on March 2, 2020 wherein a total of 1,380 applicants applied. They took qualifying and neuro-psychological examinations simultaneously held week-long in 16 testing centers nationwide

“For the first time, the neuro-psychological examinations for entry-level DEOs were held in-house and online. All four major stages of the examination were made simultaneous and regionalized, thus bringing the recruitment accessible to all applicants,” PDEA Director General Wilkins Villanueva said in a statement.

After undergoing neuro-psychological examination, qualifiers went through medical and dental examination, physical fitness test, and panel interview.

“The continuous hiring of DEOs will boost the government’s efforts in the national anti-drug campaign, and ensure the effective and efficient implementation of the Barangay Drug Clearing Program (BDGP) on a nationwide scale,” Villanueva said.

The PDEA Drug Enforcement Officers Basic Course comprises basic management and leadership, communication enhancement skills, community-based anti-illegal drug advocacy, legal studies, anti-illegal drug intelligence and tactics, interdiction operations and investigation, and other non-academic activities. Roderick Alba, made the remark after the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) designated officers of the PNP as media security focal persons in each province and city nationwide to provide a mantle of protection for members of the media who may face threats or intimidation in the course of the 2022 elections.

“The PNP finds it timely and relevant to designate focal persons purposely for media security, ayon na rin sa kautusan ng DILG (based on the order of DILG). Our PNP Chief (Gen. Dionardo Carlos) has high regard sa trabaho (job) and the sacrifices of our media partners. The job will be more challenging sa pagko-cover ng (to cover) election. Sila ang magiging takbuhan ng ating (these are the person to go of our) media practitioners kung may mga (if there is) threat or intimidation that relates to the performance of their profession,” Alba said in a message sent to reporters when sought for a comment.

“In other words, these focal personnel will serve as the quick response component sa pagtugon sa mga ganitong insidente. We condemn any form of violence, that definitely includes violence against media but in the meantime, we will wait for the official guidelines from the top PNP Leadership,” he added.
