President Duterte signs P4.1 trillion 2020 national budget

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte on Monday signed the 2020 General Appropriations Act (GAA) geared towards sustaining critical infrastructure, human capital development and socio-economic growth in the country.

In a speech during the signing ceremony in Malacañang, President Duterte said the passage of the P4.1 trillion GAA is proof that with the help of the House of Representatives and the Senate, the government can effectively work towards the enactment



that will support the country's development agenda in the next two and a half years.

He called on Con-

gress, civil society partners, and civil servants in the executive branch to remain driven towards the collective goal of providing a more comfortable life for the people.

"Together, let us ensure that every peso in this budget will never be used to support the selfish greed of the few, but spent exclusively for the benefit and service of Filipino taxpayers," he said.

Representing almost 20 percent of the country's projected GDP for 2020, this year's P4.1 trillion budget

GSIS-PRRD extended until Sept 30

State pension fund Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) has extended the deadline for application to the GSIS Program for Restructuring and Repayment of Debts (GSIS-PRRD) until September 30, 2020.

GSIS-PRRD is the one-time condonation and restructuring program for members who are already out of government service to settle their outstanding loan balances in full or in part.

"GSIS is intensifying its efforts to recover and collect outstanding and non-moving loan accounts through the program. It likewise addresses the clamor of separated GSIS members and pensioners for a little more time to restructure their loans and pay the remaining balance through instalment," GSIS Chairman and Acting President and General Manager Rolando Ledesma Macasaet said.

GSIS-PRRD avalees may settle their balance until December

31, 2020.

"We urge inactive GSIS members to apply for PRRD so they can pay their remaining balance free of penalties on an instalment basis at 10% interest per annum only," the pension fund chief said.

GSIS-PRRD covers various service loans, which include Salary Loan, Restructured Salary Loan, Enhanced Salary Loan, Emergency Loan Assistance, Summer One-Month Salary Loan, Member's Cash Advance/eCard Cash Advance, Conso-Loan, Emergency Loan, Home Emergency Loan Program (HELP); Study Now, Pay Later and Fly PAL, Pay Later loans (did not avail of the condonation program in 2014); Education Assistance Loan (did not avail of EAL II), Stock Purchase Loan (did not avail of the condonation program in 2013); Policy Loan; and GSIS Financial Assistance Loan (for DepEd Personnel). Health Report: Duque orders strict check on in coming travelers amid reports of China mysterious disease



MANILA -- The Department of Health assured the public that the Bureau of Quarantine (BOQ) is on alert and is closely watching all seaports and airports in response to reports of a mysterious disease from China.

Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III instructed the BOQ to intensify the checking of all incoming travelers especially those manifesting fever or signs of respiratory infection.

It has been reported lately that an outbreak of a mysterious illness has affected 44 individuals in China. According to reports, the said disease is similar to a "viral pneumonia of unknown origin".

"I urge the public, especially those with history of travel from China, to seek immediate medical consult if experiencing any flu-like symptoms" Duque said.

"Let us also embrace healthy lifestyles, practice proper hand hygiene, and observe cough etiquette to prevent transmission of respiratory infections" the Health Chief concluded. source:(DOH)

DOST aims to intensify commercialization of DOST- developed products and technologies this 2020

TAGUIG CITY, -- Department of Science and Technology (DOST-Philippines) Secretary Fortunato de la Peña expressed his goal of intensifying the commercialization of DOST-developed products and technologies in 2020.

During the flag ceremony at the DOST Compound in Bicutan, Taguig City earlier today, Secretary de la Peña enumerated some of the agency's areas of accomplishments that he wants to fully commercialize this year. The technologies' areas of application range from health and medicine, agriculture, and mass transportation:

The 18 active ingredients discovered in local plants for developments as nutraceuticals and drugs through the Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (DOST-PCHRD)'s Tuklas Lunas Program. Biomedical devices like the AGAPAY and TAYO that assist injured patients, and the local ventilator called Ginha-

wa (ReliefVent) which is way cheaper compared to imported ventilators. Somatic embryogenesis technology (CSet) for coconut propagation. Secretary de la Peña said there are five institutions currently doing coconut propagation research (UP Los Baños, UP Mindanao, Visayas State University, and Philippine Coconut Authority with its two centers in Zamboanga and Albay).

"Kung dati nakakuha lang tayo ng isang puno

sa isang mature na coconut fruit, dun sa unang bahagi ng research, naka-exceed ng 300 planting materials ang UP Los Baños from one fruit using tissue culture.," Secretary de la Peña said.

The technology to improve native livestock through the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST-PCAARRD). The project, led by the Marinduque State College, is

focused on the proliferation of native pigs.

Commercialization of mass transportation technology developed by the DOST is also a top priority. Secretary de la Peña said the Hybrid Trimaran, currently being developed in New Washington, Aklan, could be possibly launched on the first semester of 2020. The Hybrid Trimaran is envisioned to carry 150 passengers, four vans, and 15 motorcycles. The 12-horsepower diesel engine developed by the Metals Industry Research and De-

velopment Center (DOST-MIRDC) will have a crucial role in agricultural modernization. Secretary de la Peña said there are two private companies that are very eager to be licensed to manufacture the said engine. (DOST)

DA allots P2B for youth agriprenurship programs

QUEZON CITY, --The Department of Agriculture through the Agricultural Credit Policy Council (DA-ACPC) is offering an initial P2 billion that young students and entrepreneurs can borrow to start any agriculture, fishery or agribusiness venture.

"This is our way to attract the younger generation of Filipinos to be key players in attaining our vision of a food-secure Philippines with prosperous farmers and fishers," said agriculture secretary William Dar.

"We have approved an initial P2 billion to implement two lending programs, namely the Young Agripreneurs Loan Program (YALP), and Micro and Small Agribusiness Loan Program (MSALP) — with an

initial budget of P1B each, during the DA-ACPC 67th governing council meeting, on January 8, 2020," said Secretary Dar.

"We have to replace aging farmers with younger blood -- our Pinoy millennials -- who are the future of Philippine agriculture," added the DA chief, who chairs the ACPC governing

council.

Eligible to avail of YALP loans are agri-fishery graduates and young hobbyists, aged 15 to 30 years old. They can borrow start-up funds of up to P500, 000, with zero interest, payable in five years.

On other hand, under the MSALP, agripreneurs can borrow working capital or for fixed asset acquisition, from P300,000 up to P15 million, for micro and small enterprises.

The two programs will be implemented by the DA-ACPC through the Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP). ACPC-accredited cooperative banks, rural banks, cooperatives, and viable non-government organizations (NGOs).

"They will be launched formally before end of January

will support the administration's vision of a more peaceful and progressive Philippines -- an upper middle-income country that has already cut poverty rate to just 14 percent and achieved a 7.5 percent GDP growth by 2022, according to the President.

The 2020 GAA, like in previous years, will continue to allocate a huge portion of the national budget for government projects such as infrastructure, development and social services, which will greatly benefit the lives of Filipinos.

The government will spend 36 percent of the budget to fund programs on education, healthcare, housing and social welfare.

And to further boost the thriving economy, the Duterte administration will invest 29 percent of the 2020 budget in infrastructure, tourism, trade, job generation, and agriculture. Under the government's plan, 11 percent of the budget will be allotted for debt servicing, with the ultimate goal of bringing down government debt to just 39 percent of the GDP by 2022.

The Chief Executive then expressed his gratitude to Congress for supporting the administration's sound fiscal policies through the continued adoption of the Cash Budgeting System and the full implementation of the Comprehensive Tax Reform Program.

He also recognized the invaluable contribution of the men and women of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) under the leadership of Secretary Wendel Avisado for their efforts in crafting this year's budget. PND

CALABARZON Batangas Electric Cooperative II inks agreement with Aboitiz Power

BATANGAS CITY, (PIA)- Batangas II Electric Cooperative, Inc. (BATELEC II) signed an agreement with Aboitiz Power under the Cleanergy brand for a 3-MW supply at Lima Park Hotel in Malvar, Batangas last December 18, 2019.

BATELEC II is the largest of all the 119 electric cooperatives in the country and has a peak demand of 132 megawatts (MW). The company's move to go renewables is an initiative of the management to diversify its portfolio while continuously being responsive to customers' call for more sustainable operations.

Eng. Octavius Mendoza, General Manager-BATELEC II, said although their business is already over four decades, this is the first time they ventured into the open access business and activate Local Retail Electricity Supplier (LRES).

"We've decided to source renewable supply to better serve our customers. It does not only bring a big difference in our company but also considered a bold move that is why we chose a dependable partner that can support us in sustaining the energy we need. We have a big trust on Aboitiz Power that it can give us our expectations," Mendoza noted.

Aboitiz Power First Vice President for Energy Trading and Sales Juan Alejandro Aboitiz said it is a big honor for their company to serve a growing number of customers who are

pushing for a more sustainable energy source.

"We are very pleased that BATELEC II will partner with us for their Cleanergy Supply. We do hope the partnership will be stronger as time goes by and looking forward to bigger partnerships in the future," said Aboitiz.

The Cleanergy supply will be sourced from the Tiwi-MakBan geothermal power plants, which are being operated and managed by Aboitiz Power subsidiary AP Renewables, Inc. (APRI). It will be utilized by BATELEC II for its local retail electricity supply (LRES) customers.

The partnership is favorable as APRI's geothermal plants are also located in Batangas and neighboring province of Laguna. In addition, APRI will also supply BATELEC II with a 20-MW emergency power supply for a period of one year from December 26, 2019 to December 25, 2020. The agreement for this additional Cleanergy supply was signed on December 23, 2019.

118th Police Service Anniversary : FUTURE OF PNP DEPENDS ON AÑO: DUTERTE

MANILA -- The future of the country's police force will depend on Interior Secretary Eduardo Año's efforts to rid the Philippine National Police (PNP) of corruption, President Rodrigo Duterte said.

Duterte made this remark admitting that he has yet to appoint a PNP chief but only because he wanted Año to ensure that the police force is corrupt-free before he names its new head.

He earlier appointed Año to supervise the PNP while Lt. Gen. Archie Francisco Gamboa remains as PNP officer-in-charge (OIC).

"I have given Secretary Año the blanket authority to get rid of corruption," Duterte said in a media interview in Malacañang.

"And it is on his shoulder the future of how the police would behave in the coming years --- na kay Año 'yan (it's Año's responsibility)," he added.

At present, the President said it was enough for him for Año "to make the corrections."

He expressed confidence that Año would be successful in cleansing the police force.

"And I think that with the remaining --- remaining two years, if I can

just fix a third of what's bogging the PNP, and that is corruption," he added.

Even if he appointed a new head, the President said he was sure that the new PNP chief would "not be able to solve the problem."

"You know, historically --- historically, the police, the PNP, has always been a problem for any administration," Duterte said.

Earlier, Presidential Spokesperson Salvador Panelo said Año will manage the country's police force for as long as the President thinks is necessary.

"Di ba sabi niya hanggang kailan niya gusto?

(Didn't he say that he wanted Año to supervise the PNP as long as he wanted him to?)," Panelo said in a January 2 Palace briefing.

Despite his delay in appointing a new PNP chief, the President assured that a new commander will definitely be named for the police force within his term.

"They should have a commander," Duterte said.

However, he said he has not selected a new PNP chief "at this time."

Contenders for the PNP chief post are Gamboa, Lt. Gen. Camilo Cascolan, deputy chief for operations
