

Noveleta LCE poised to continue infra projects, reopen tourism in 2021

NOVELETA, Cavite (PIA) – The local government of Noveleta will put to completion several of its infrastructure programs and projects for 2020 and hopes to revive the town's economy thru reopening its tourism industry this coming year.

During his interview for the #LagingHandaNetworkBriefing News Tuesday, 8 December, Mayor Dino Chua reported that some of its programs and projects under the UNLAD Noveleta 2020 were put on hold like the industrial zone groundbreaking and other infrastructure projects, adding that the town suffered much with the economy coming to a halt due to the lockdown.

Mayor Chua reported said that "Information dissemination is key to adapting to the New Normal especially with regards to COVID-19 quarantine protocols and counter measures."

He also revealed during his interview with PCOO

Assistant Secretary JV Arcena that he took care of the needs of his constituents during the height of the pandemic by returning his two years (2019 & 2020) worth of salaries to the LGU funds to purchase food for the relief distribution to the residents.

"This way we were able to save the LGUs calamity funds which we later used for our relief operations during the series of calamities brought by Typhoons 'Rolly and Ulysses,'" stated Chua.

On the tourism side, Mayor Chua proudly said that "Noveleta was known as the Boracay of the 80's" because of its beautiful beaches with the best sunset view. The local gov-

ernment made the rehabilitation and clean-up of the town's shoreline as one of its priority projects, hoping to revive the tourism industry with the opening of the beach resorts in the town like the Lido Beach Resort and the Long Beach Resort and Aqua Park.

These beach resorts are now open and now operating to 50% capacity pursuant to IATF guidelines.

Early next year, the

Noveleta app will be launched to digitalize access to government services and payment of government fees keeping the public safe from the threat of the COVID-19 infection and mitigating its further spread.

Meanwhile, the Mayor boasted of the 'must try' tourism sites in the town like the Malen's Restaurant known for its delicious Filipino dishes that were favorite of our revolutionary he-

roes, and also the dried fish/seafood products that are celebrated during the 'Daing Festival' and best for take home 'pasalubong'.

The local chief executive was recently recognized as Best Mayor of the Year at the Asia Leaders Awards 2020 along with Alfonso Mayor Randy Salamat, Manila Mayor Isko Moreno, and Pasig City Mayor Vico Sotto. (Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite)

Bong Go urges DOTr, TRB to fix issue on expressway RFIDs

Senator Christopher "Bong" Go on Friday, December 11, urged concerned agencies, particularly the Department of Transportation and the Toll Regulatory Board, to immediately address the problems with the implementation of electronic toll collection on expressways in greater Metro Manila.

In an interview right after personally attending the launch of the Malasakit Center in Marikina City, Go said that while the issue is currently being investigated, the DOTr, TRB's mother agency, must address and resolve the inconvenience this issue has caused to the public as soon as possible.

"Meron na po silang ginagawang imbestigasyon at pamamaraan para maisaayos po ang problema d'yan sa trapik na dulot ng RFID," said Go, referring to the radio frequency

identification (RFID) tags needed for electronic toll collection on expressways.

"So, nananawagan po ako sa DOTr at sa TRB na ayusin n'yo na po. Trabaho n'yong ayusin ang problemang 'yan at 'wag ipasa sa publiko ang trapik," he added.

Go also said that defective RFID tags on some vehicles, such as trucks, leads to a domino effect on the traffic situation -- frustrating many motorists.

He, then, urged DOTr Secretary Arthur Tugade to hold accountable those who are responsible for the problem or negligent in addressing these issues.

PALACE ASSURES AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS FOR VACCINES

Presidential Spokesperson Secretary Harry Roque Jr. assured the public of the availability of funds for the procurement of COVID vaccines.

"Paulit-ulit na po sinabi natin yan na tayo po ay makakautang na sa multilateral sources, sa bilateral sources para po sa P72.5-Billion na kakailanganin," said Secretary Roque during a press briefing.

The Palace official stressed that all of the P72.5-Billion is included in the national budget even if the rest of the amount will still have to be loaned because the whole amount needs to be reflected in the budget for it to be spent. "Kinakailangan nasa

budget otherwise hindi magastos maski ang pangagalangan ay utangin," Sec. Roque underscored.

"Maski wala pang revenue source eh mayroon naman po kasing plano talaga na pagkunan at ito nga po yung ADB [and] lending facilities," Sec Roque affirmed.

To ensure transparency in accessing funds for the vaccine, Vaccine Czar Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr. explained that the Asian Development Bank (ADB) will act as the fund manager and fund procurement agency. This means that procurement of the vaccines will be through a multilateral system, said Sec Gal-



Secretary Harry Roque Jr. vez, who further pointed out that the Philippines needs to close negotiations with advance market commitments this December and January next year.

Otherwise, Sec Galvez said that if we wait for the allotted 2021 budget for the procurement of the vaccines, then the Philippines will be on the tail end of the vaccine supply chain.

Galvez further explained that what the government will use in its initial vaccine procurement is the \$1-Billion that Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez allocated for the vaccines back in July upon the instruction of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte.

Galvez said that the money will come from the ADB plus funds from the Development Bank of the Philippines, Landbank of the Philippines, and from government-owned and controlled corporations.

Aside from assuring the availability of funds, the Palace also assured that the Philippines will be able to have its share of COVID vaccines as the Presi-

dent has been strongly advocating for the equitable and universal access to vaccines. This has been the reason why many countries including Australia, China, Russia, among other countries with strong diplomatic ties to the Philippines have expressed willingness to support the country with regard to COVID vaccines, said Sec. Galvez.

Sec Roque, on the other hand, pointed out the importance of President Duterte's independent foreign policy in ensuring access to the vaccines.

"Kaya po importante yung naging pagkakaibigan natin sa bansang China, Russia and even India dahil bagamat hindi sila mayayamang mga bansa eh sila ay nagpoproduce din ng mga bakuna at sila naman ay nagsasabi sa kapwa nilang mga hindi masyadong mayamang mga bansa gaya ng Pilipinas na bibigyan din tayo ng bakuna," said Roque.

This vaccine diplomacy on the part of China, in which the Chinese government pledged to make the vaccines a global public good, assures its neighboring and allied countries that the vaccines will be made available to them, said Philippine Ambassador to China Jose Santiago "Chito" Sta. Romana.

Ambassador Sta. Romana added that three Chinese companies were already granted emergency use authorization (EUA) since July 2020 in China, and that an issuance for the general use of the vaccines is expected to be released by the Chinese government before the end of this year. ### OPS-PCOO

MANILA - The Cavite extension project of the Light Rail Transit Line 1 (LRT-1) is about halfway complete according to the Department of Transportation (DOTr).

"As of November 30, this long-awaited and highly-anticipated rail extension of LRT-1 is now halfway, with 50.54% overall progress rate," the DOTr said in a Facebook post on Friday.

In total, the LRT-1's Cavite extension will span 11.7 kilometers from Baclaran Station southward and will traverse eight more stations — Redemptorist Station, MIA Station, Asiaworld Station, Ninoy Aquino Station, Las Piñas Station, Zapote Station, and Niog Station.

Once complete, it will extend the existing 20-kilometer LRT-1 to 32 kilometers and boost its passenger capacity from 500,000 passengers to 800,000 passengers per day.

The extension project is expected to cut the travel time from Baclaran to Bacoor City, Cavite from the current one to two hours to only 25 minutes. source:(PNA)

Guidelines: The documentary requirements should be in Portable Document Format (PDF) and emailed in two files only, following the order of documents as enumerated herein.

Incomplete applications and/or out-of-date documentary requirements and those electronically submitted on a date other than the chosen date in the Online Application Scheduler shall be rejected.

Applicants shall ensure receipt by the JBC of two (2) complete sets of the hard copies of the documentary requirements through courier service not later than 4:30 p.m. of the above-mentioned deadlines. 'yung mga concessionaire, suspindihin n'yo na po," he said.

Samar Rep. Edgar Sarmiento, the head of the House of Representatives Committee on Transportation, recently warned the TRB that he would ask Duterte to veto the 2021 budget of the agency if it would not fix the mess surrounding the RFID tags needed for electronic toll collection on expressways.

In response, Go affirmed that President Rodrigo Duterte has the prerogative to veto the 2021 budget of the TRB if it fails to fix the issue which has caused discomfort among motorists.

"Karapatan po n'ya 'yan kung may gusto siyang i-veto, pero 'di sya pwedeng magdagdag. Pwede po n'ya burahin," said Go.

He explained that while the President cannot introduce new items or bring back items in the approved budget, he has the power to veto particular line items.

"Pero isa rin po ang ating Pangulo sa nagmamadali na

maipasa ang budget. Kapag ipinasa na po ng both house leaders (sa Office of the President), aaralin at mapipirmahan na po ito ng Pangulo bago sumapit ang 2021," he added.

Downplaying the possibility of Duterte vetoing the budget, Go said that the President himself wants the budget to be enacted as soon as possible to address the COVID-19 problem in the country. He, however, stressed that Duterte still has the prerogative to do so.

"Mismong ang Pangulo ang nagmamadali na magkaroon tayo ng budget sa January 1, budget para labanan ang COVID-19, para sa medical equipment, vaccine. Kaya s'ya nanawagan, sabi niya 'If you can't solve it, I will solve that for you'. So, s'ya mismo ang nagmamadali na ma-approve ang budget," Go said.

"Still, prerogative po ng ating Pangulo 'yan kung ibe-veto n'ya 'yung TRB (budget). Sa pag-kaalam ko, may ginagawa nang paraan ang DOTr in which kasma ang TRB," he added.

Lima Land expansion to add 20K jobs in Calabarzon

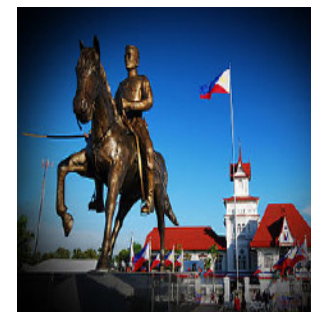

“However, this is the time to say “No”. Group activities carries significant risk, especially during this time of pandemic and we do not want to endanger our lives and that of our family,” she stressed.
