DOH-CALABARZON reminds vax recipients to take 2nd shot

C A L A B A R -ZON--The Department of Health Region IV-A (DOH IV-A) reminds COVID-19 vaccine recipients to take their second dose of vaccines to get full protection amid the rising number of COVID-19 cases in the region.

In a press release, Regional Director Eduardo Janairo emphasized that although they will not be com-

"Tandaan natin na nagkaroon na nga maraming variant ang virus kaya napakaimportanteng makumpleto natin ang ang bakuna natin upang masiguro na ang katawan natin ay may kumpletong panlaban sa COVID-19," Janairo explains.

In its May 4 report, the DOH said around 132, 180 doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to priority groups in the Calabarzon region using vaccines made by drugmakers Sinovac and Oxford-AstraZeneca. Around 154,347

Around 154,347 (93.8%) have already re-

ceived their first dose, while 10,154 (5.2%) were given their second shot.

Despite getting inoculated, the region's top doctor reminded those who have been vaccinated have to continue following minimum health protocols such as wearing face masks, physical distancing, and regular handwashing as they may still get infected by the virus. "Only upon receiving the second dose of Covid vaccine can you get the full protection against the virus. Huwag po natin itong ipagwalang bahala dahil mahirap po ang magkasakit dahil sa covid. Mahirap ma-hospital at hindi rin madaling gumaling dahil dito," Janairo said. According to the re-

gion's top doctor, those who received AstraZeneca vac-

cines will have 12 weeks to get their second dose, while those who were inoculated with Sinovac shots have 28 days or 4 weeks to get their second shot. (PB/DOH 4-A)

LGU GenTri approves financial assistance to repatriated documented OFWs

TRECE MATIRES CITY, Cavite May 10 (PIA) -- The City Government of General Trias recently approved City Ordinance No. 20-46, an ordinance granting financial assistance to repatriated documented Gentriseño Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) who lost their jobs due to the CoViD-19 pandemic.

D o c u m e n t e d OFWs who are bonafide residents of the City of General Trias with valid passport, work visa, and contract of employment duly processed with the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA) or the Philippine Overseas Labor Office (POLO) can avail of the program.

Interested applicants are required to present the following: copy of passport or travel document; copy of valid ID/Documents showing proof of residency in the City of General Trias; copy of flight ticket or boarding pass as proof of return to the Philippines or arrival stamps/sticker attached to the passport; proof of overseas employment contract, Overseas Employment Compensaton registration, OWWA or POEA registration, residence IDs, working visa/re-entry visa,

or work permit to stay in the receiving country; and proof of loss of employment due to CoViD-19 or proof that the host country are included in the list of those heavily affected by the CoViD-19 pandemic.

Applications including requirements must be submitted using the links provided in the City Government of General Trias Facebook page until May 14, 2021. It is also advised that applications will undergo evaluation and approval.

About 9 to 10 days prior to confine ment, I felt symptoms that started with two days of mild body aches. two days of fever. two days of unproductive cough, two days of fever

with chills until my oxygen saturation level became low. And on the 10th day, my RTPCR result indicated that I am COVID-19 positive." This is how Alvin Rae R. Samson of

Angono, Rizal recalled his journey in battling the dreaded virus.

At 39, he was very much proactive in his career as a corporate trainer and meta-coach specializing in facilitating leadership, change, & business strategy.

It was a painful experience as he recounts how the illness affected his daily life routine. During his twenty days of confinement at the Manila East Medical Center, his physicians and nurses were so accommodating and exuded positivity celebrating every progress he made. Alvin remembered grinding his NGT tube, to aid him as he had difficulty in breathing. He never thought he would survive as he struggled against critical pneumonia.

Several procedures were administered to Alvin such as x-ray, Hemoperfusion, ECG, and a series of various blood tests. "I realized that really, there are things beyond my control despite my best efforts to be in control - such as to prevent getting infected," Alvin said. He further related that... "What is even more frustrating during that crucial period was subjecting myself to that uncomfortable suctioning procedure that made me gawk and almost vomit." That deeply hurts. "It should be one of the reasons you would want to 'stay home' to reduce the risk of infection," he added

Glorified in every single day of his recovery, Alvin testified that God is the center of all these things. "I put my trust on the Lord our God whatever the outcome of my situation is. From the beginning, my faith in God stabilized my emotional and mental attitude about my confinement and isol tion." He proclaimed, "I was not isolated at all because my doctors and nurses, my friends and my family, my PhilHealth family, and God Himself, were with me

Despite negative remarks against PhilHealth, Alvin remarked that he was truly grateful as he

availed of the P786. 384 maximum benefits for critical pneumonia COVID-19 package. "Kahit gaano pa kalaki ang matitirang balanse, hindi tayo makapupulot ng PhP786K sa labas ng bahay natin.

And for Alvin, what PhilHealth offered was a huge relief for a critical COVID-19 patient.

Alvin pointed out that, "dumadaan din ngayon ang PhilHealth sa matinding pagsubok" trying to convince other people that... "gaya natin exposed din sila sa mga panganib ng pandemya at maaaring marami rin sa kanilang mga empleyado ang iginugupo ng COVID-19." he further stressed. True enough, Alvin expressed his appreciation to PhilHealth telling everyone. "amidst the crisis we are currently facing, there is a state-insurer that serves the public in another frontline of this pandemic – that of providing universal health care benefits, whether rich or poor, no matter who you are."

Greatly comforted from what he received from PhilHealth, Alvin has these to say, "Dear PhilHealth, maraming maraming salamat sa inyo. Know that there is a grateful nation — millions of families — who depend on you and who benefit from your great service during this pandemic." (END)



> In Korea, Maghirang said okra is not as mainstream as radish, cabbage, cucumber, potato, and sprouts, which are parts of many Korean dishes. Some Koreans eat okra as "banchan" (side dish), including "okra muchim" (seasoned) or "okra kimchi" (pickled/

Okra is available only at the online market, as market is indeed a welcome frozen or dried form. Processed okra products mostly imported from China, while the fresh, green pods are available in small volume, during summer season. These are mostly consumed by Filipinos and other Asian

nationalities in Korea. "This is therefore

a good opportunity for us to enter the Korean food market and promote Philippine okra for mainstream consumers," Secretary Dar said.

Okra has long been favored as a food for the health-conscious, as it contains potassium, Vitamins B and C, folic acid, calcium, and rich in amino acids. It prevents anemia, promotes healthy skin and pregnancy, prevents stomach ulcer, and improves the respiratory system.

Filipino farmers plant okra as it is a high-yielding crop and provides good source of income. Its green pods can be harvested as early as 55 to 65 days upon seeding. Surveys show that farmers can harvest 500 kilograms up to one ton of okra pods per hectare, providing them a net income, ranging from P80,000 to P120,000.

"The entry of Philippine okra to the Korean development to boost not only the livelihood and incomes of our farmers, but also pave way to other potential export crops, thus invigorating the country's agriculture sector," the DA chief added. (PIA NCR)

TRECE MAR-TIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) --Cavite 4th District Rep. Pidi Barzaga proposed the drafting of a city ordinance in Dasmariñas that will address the perrenial problem on stray dogs biting residents, not only to protect the public but the dogs' welfare as well.

According to Rep. Barzaga, the city government allocates almost a million pesos of the LGU's funds on a monthly basis for the purchase of rabies vaccine.

He also cited that 50% of the victims were children or members of the household of dog owners.

As part of the initiative, the city government will undertake the construction of a big impounding center to house stray dogs captured with the support of a centralized dog catching system.

The proposed ordinance will affirm that all stray dogs will be caught and brought to the center. Dog owners will redeem their dogs within 10 days with corresponding fine. Dogs that will not be redeemed within said period will be placed for adoption, while those that will not be adopted will be "euthanized" as provided by Republic Act 8485 or The Animal Welfare Act of the Philippines.

Moreover, all residents who want to breed dogs will be required to obtain a dog breeder's permit

from the city government. Puppies also need to have a cage with corresponding space.

A public hearing will be held for the drafting of said ordinance with concerned stakeholders present to solicit their views on the proposed ordinance.

According to the FB Page of Rep. Barzaga, the ordinance will not only address the safety of the public but also prevent the proliferation of stray dogs, resolve related sanitation problems and significantly reduce LGU expenses every month on anti-rabies vaccine with the savings alloted for other health projects. Palace announces arrival of more vaccines; Priority given to NCR Plus, Cebu and Davao

Some 3.5 million vaccine doses have arrived in the country in the past few days, plus another vaccine delivery is expected today, said Presidential Spokesperson Secretary Harry Roque Jr in his press briefing today, May 10, 2021, held in Davao.

The Palace official mentioned the arrival of 1.5 million doses of the Sinovac vaccine from China last Friday, May 7, 2021, and the arrival of more than two million doses of AstraZeneca vaccine from the COVAX Facility on May 8, 2021.

"Inaasahan din natin na darating naman ngayon araw, May 10, ang nasa 193,000 doses ng unang batch ng bakuna mula po sa Pfizer," said Secretary Roque.

The Palace spokesperson added that because the Pfizer vaccine requires negative 20 degrees temperature, the initial vaccine doses will be distributed to areas with the capability to handle the said temperature requirement, like in Metro Manila, Cebu, and Davao.

"Pero gaya ng sinabi ko kanina, napakadami na po nating iba pang mga bakuna, so wag po kayong mag-alala magkakaroon po tayo ng bakuna para sa lahat," assured Sec. Roque.

Roque also cited Vaccine Czar Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr, in a previous guesting in the press briefing, who said that with regard to the vaccine rollout, there has been an agreement already that those areas with high incidence of COVID-19 will be prioritized for the vaccination program, which include the National Capital Region (NCR) Plus areas

and neighboring provinces, including Cebu and Davao.

With the successive arrival of COVID vaccines, the Palace spokesperson expressed confidence that more people will be inoculated. As of May 8, 2021 data from the Department of Health, there are now 2,395,494 COVID vaccine doses that have been administered, of which 1,508,146 were medical frontliners or those from the A1 Priority Group.

Meanwhile, in terms of COVID-19 recovery rate, the Philippines currently ranks third among ASEAN nations with a recovery rate of 92.76 percent, following Singapore and Brunei, said Sec. Roque, citing data from the Global COVID-19 Statistics of Worldometer.
