Classes in public schools begin June 3

MANILA -- An official of the Department of Education (DepEd) said that classes in elementary and secondary schools nationwide for school year 2019-2020 will open on June 3.

In an interview with reporters in Makati City, DepEd Undersecretary and Chief of Staff Nepomuceno Malaluan confirmed that classes will open on the first Monday of June.

Republic Act 7797 or "An Act to Lengthen the School Calendar from 200 days to not more than 220 Class Days" states that the school year shall start on the first Monday of June but not later than the last day of August.

21 deaths, almost 6K dengue cases recorded

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna -- A total of 5,910 cases of dengue fever, leading to 21 fatalities, were recorded in the Calabarzon Region (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) from Jan. 1 to March 23 this year, the Regional Surveillance and Epidemiology Unit (RESU) reported.

Glen S. Ramos from

the Department of Health (DOH) Calabarzon-Media Relations and Communications Unit (MRCU), disclosed to PNA on Wednesday that RESU assessment found this year's number of cases to be lower compared to the same period last year when 5,925 dengue cases were logged.

Ramos said the dengue-

Gatchalian To MWSS: Contingency for Angat Dam needed

Senator Win Gatchalian is asking the Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS) and other concerned agencies to disclose to the public their contingency plans should the Angat Dam dry up and breach its critical level in April.

"As early as now we should assure the public that should the water level in Angat Dam reach the critical level because of the El Niño, the government is prepared for that eventuality and we already have contingencies in place to ensure there will be adequate supply of water," Gatchalian said. "I understand that formal recommendations for cloud seeding in Angat have already

been sent to PAGASA (Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration), but we should also be prepared should cloud seeding not be enough to stop the dam from breaching its critical level," he added. The lawmaker reminded MWSS Administrator Reynaldo Velasco to submit the official list of waterworks projects in the pipeline between now and 2023, *Turn to page 3*



Universal Health Care featured in PhilHealth's first media event for 2019

The event was led by PhilHealth Acting President and Chief Executive Officer Dr. Roy B. Ferrer, and attended by media practitioners from various national print, radio, online and TV stations. Also present were PhilHealth senior officers including Executive and Chief Operating Officer Ruben John A. Basa, Chief Information Officer Jovita Aragona, Acting Senior Vice President for Legal Services Atty. Rodolfo del Rosario, Acting Senior Vice President for Fund Management Renato Limsiaco Jr., Acting Senior Vice President for Actuary Nerissa Santiago, Vice President for Member Management Dr. Francisco Soria, Area III Vice President Walter Bacarezza, and Vice President for Corporate Affairs and Official Spokesperson Dr. Shirley Domingo.

Key performance indicators in 2018 were discussed that made PhilHealth fully prepared for the coming of the UHC. It was emphasized that some 104 million Filipinos are already covered by the Program and are now enjoying financial protection from health risks. The program has also effectively broken down social and economic barriers that used to deny many of our kababayans access to quality health care and removed socioeconomic status, gender, location, cultural upbringing or religious beliefs as a determining factor for accessing health care services.

A run through of the UHC's salient points that impact PhilHealth, such as the automatic coverage inclusion of all Filipinos into the program, and the granting of immediate eligibility and access to preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative, and palliative care medical, dental, mental and emergency health

services was also done. The UHC Act also guarantees all Filipinos outright entitlement to PhilHealth benefits as long as they meet certain conditions set forth by the law.

A PhilHealth ID shall no longer be required before availment of the services and benefits; and more importantly, there will be no co-payment for services availed of in basic or ward type accommodations since both PhilHealth and the Department of Health shall regulate co-payments and co-insurance in public hospitals.

For his part, Ferrer thanked the media partners and appealed for their help in realizing the vision and wonderful intention of the UHC law which for him is a reform that will be truly felt by Filipinos especially the vulnerable sector of the society.

"Sana po ay magkaroon ang baw't isa ng pagkakaisa at pagtutulungan para mangyari ang hinahangad ng UHC na mabigyan ng karampatang serbisyo ang baw't kalusugan ng Filipino, saan man siya naroroon, anoman ang kaniyang katayuan sa buhay, at anoman ang kaniyang karamdaman,"

"Tiyak ng hindi mapagkakaitan ang baw't Filipino ng serbisyonang kinakailangan niya. That is what we meant by PhilHealth being the equalizer of man. Lahat ay pantay-pantay dahil karapatan ng bawat isang maging malusog at gumaling sa kaniyang karamdaman." Ferrer further noted of the UHC.

DOH addresses shortage of psychiatrists in Calabarzon

The shortage of psychiatrists in the Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) Region has prompted the Department of Health regional office to embark on capacitating health workers to do the job to augment mental health services.

Dr. Eduardo C. Janairo, DOH Calabarzon Regional Director, said on Thursday one of the biggest barriers to the management and treatment of mental health illness in the country is the lack of qualified health personnel to do the job.

"There is a need to properly identify the illness and provide appropriate treatment," Janairo said, citing the National Mental Health Law or Republic Act 11036 which President Rodrigo Duterte signed June 21, 2018, paving the way for the establishment of the government's national mental health policy.

Through the new law, the government's mental

health policy aims to enhance integrated mental health services to promote and protect Filipinos suffering from mental health illness and afford them access to professional help.

In pursuit of the new law, the DOH regional office has gathered the 2nd batch of health workers for a four-day "Training on Mental Health Global Action Program (MHGAP)" for municipal and city health officers, nurses and mental health coordinators in the region, which kicked off last Tuesday and ended Friday.

"The growing number of people with mental health problems must be given importance and the only way to immediately recognize them is to provide the knowledge and skills to our health workers, especially in the community where most of untreated mental illness are prevalent," he added.

Janairo said mental illness affects not only the individual, but also the family,

their eventual woes on financial strain, job loss and also psychological problem affecting a family member personally helping a mentally ill relative.

Based on DOH data, there are only 600 licensed psychiatrists in the country and to augment this shortage, the regional health office here has already trained a total of 70 health workers for Calabarzon.

The training is led by the DOH Calabarzon Non-Communicable Disease Control Unit under its Mental Health Program led by Mental Health Coordinator Paulina A. Calo.

The MHGAP training gathered a team of mental health experts from the National Center for Mental Health, Quirino Memorial Medical Center Psychiatric Department, Dementia Society of the Philippines, Department of Neurosciences of the University of the Philippines, Neurology Department.

when the Kaliwa Dam project is expected to be completed. The government is banking primarily on the Kaliwa Dam to shore up Metro Manila's

water supply.

"What is the strategy of the MWSS for the next five years? We want to face our constituents at masasabi naming sa kanila na puwede silang maging kampante dahil itong mga proyekto ay papasok na," Gatchalian told Velasco during the recent Senate Committee on Public Services hearing on the Metro Manila water shortage.

Based on PAGASA's computation, the water level in Angat Dam may reach its critical level by the end of April. The dam's water level is now at 195 meters, or 16.09 meters below its normal high level of 212

meters.

According to PAGASA, the dam will reach critical level once it breaches the 180-meter mark. PAGASA hydrologist Danilo Flores said the Angat water level drops by an average of 41 centimeters daily.

A 2011 study conducted by the University of the Philippines National Engineering Center (UP NEC) on the water demand-supply for areas served by the two concessionaires of the MWSS projected that Metro Manila will experience a water supply deficit around 2020 if no buffer capacity for demand is assumed.

infected patients have a wide age range, from one month-old to centenarians, while a slight majority of those infected, 3,143 or 53 percent, are males.

Ramos said Cavite province recorded the highest number of dengue cases with 1,880 followed by Batangas with 1,332; Laguna-1,183; Quezon-829; and Rizal with 686 cases.

Top cities and municipalities with the most number of dengue cases are Dasmariñas City – 355; Lipa City – 295; Batangas City – 277; Bacoor City – 275; Calamba City – 255; Imus City – 224; Lopez – 219; San Pablo City – 208; Tanauan City – 181; and General Trias City -176. (PNA)

way,” said Legarda, Chair of the Senate Committee on Climate Change and UNISDR Global Champion for Resilience.

products, increasing local milk consumption and awareness, and aspiring for higher milk sufficiency in dairy producing areas.

“We want to increase local dairy herd inventory from 65,737 to 344,590 heads and to increase livelihood opportunities to 152,505 rural families in dairy producing areas by 2030,” Mabale said.

To achieve this goal, NDA will carry out programs on Good Quality Stock Production, Dairy Animal Replacement, Health Infusion, Animal Productivity Development, Dairy Enterprise Development, Dairy Incentive Program, Milk Quality and Safety Assurance, and Masustansyang Gatas Para sa Pinas Program.

“We would like to see opportunity we can get on Milk Feeding Program, which is our partnership with the Departments of Social and Welfare Development (DSWD) and Education (DepEd),” Mabale said.

To ensure the success of the program, Mabale said NDA seeks to form the Dairy Executive Council (DEC) to be led by private partners, which will act as the industry advisory council. The agency will also institutionalize a Program Management Committee (PMC) headed by the NDA Administrator to oversee the implementation of the said roadmap.

NDA will also implement a Results-based Monitoring and Evaluation (RBME) to examine and assess the performance of the program and interventions implemented. A Dairy Monitoring System will be undertaken to serve as production indicators.

“In our computation, we will be needing about P57.2 B budget for the realization of the ten-year roadmap,” Mabale said.

Meanwhile, DairyCon Director Gilbert Llanto presented the cooperative seven-point agenda aims to complement NDAs initiative. The DairyCon 7-point agenda composed of programs on Build-up and Genetic Improvement, Pasteur Development and Nutrition, Milk Quality Standards and Collection System, Product Processing and Development, Genetic Marketing, Strengthening the Dairy Coop Structure, and Career Development and Professionalism for Dairy Farmers.

Currently, the country has 29 dairy zones with 70 provinces engaged in dairy production.

Aside from lectures, the DairyConEx showcased latest products, services, innovation and technology in dairy farming from its confederation members.

The Embassy of Canada participated in this year conference, and shared knowledge on policy implemented and technologies such as cattle livestock genetics. ### (Kristel Merle, DA-AFID)
