



DUQUE MEETS WITH CAVITE OFFICIALS ON PROVINCE'S DENGUE STATUS



GENERAL TRIAS CITY, Cavite-- Department of Health (DOH) Secretary Francisco Duque III met Monday with the Cavite governor, mayors and legislators here to ensure preparedness and response plan on the dengue outbreak.

Duque expressed concern on the growing number of dengue cases in the country with some

cities, towns, and provinces declaring "state of calamity" and immediate releases of health and calamity funds to avoid an epidemic, if not properly and immediately addressed.

Besides meeting with local chief executives and district lawmakers, the Health chief also conducted his rounds of hospital visits and checked on the health

conditions of dengue patients.

"Dapat lahat ng ating mga lokal na pamahalaan ay handa na makapagbigay ng suporta sa mga biktima ng dengue lalo na ngayong patuloy na tumataas ang mga kaso dito sa Cavite, kailangan natin ng dobleng pag-iingat (we should see to it that all our local governments are ready to provide support to the dengue victims especially

now that dengue cases in Cavite have increased, thus the need to double precautionary measures)," he said.

Duque also urged local government units (LGUs) to establish hydration stations in all rural health units (RHUs) for those suffering from high fever to prevent dehydration, and ensure the necessary medical treatment and health services are in place in all levels of care to support

New Dengvaxia task force chair to intensify efforts of DOH Region IV-A

CALABARZON(PIA)-- The ongoing efforts of the Department of Health (DOH) Region IV-A in addressing concerns on the effects of the Dengvaxia vaccine will soon be expanded in Central Luzon and National Capital Region.

This is after Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque appointed DOH Region IV-A Regional Director Eduardo Janairo as Chair of the National Dengvaxia Task Force for the said regions as part of the

Continuous rains brought by the southwest monsoon (habagat) and low pressure area (LPA) affected coastal communities and those living along rivers and creeks in the province of Cavite. In a prompt response, Governor Jonvic Remulla directed concerned offices, primarily the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) and the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) to assess the situation for the effective allocation of relief resources.

On August 5, 2019, Governor Remulla spearheaded the distribution of relief packs in Tanza and Trece Martires City with the team of volunteers from PSWDO and PDRRMO. The governor underscored that the program is intended to somehow help the families on their basic needs, since most of the livelihood are halted due to the bad weather condition. Likewise, Governor Remulla provided safety reminders which are very vital for their health during the rainy season amidst the dengue outbreak in the province.

In Trece Martires City, Mayor Gemma Lubigan, Vice Mayor Bobby Montehermoso and the city

SENATE CORNER

Angara to LGUs:
Provide alternatives to
those who will be
displaced by the road
clearing operations

Senator Sonny Angara called on the local chief executives of Metro Manila to look after the welfare of their constituents who will be affected by the ongoing clearing of roads in their respective areas of jurisdiction.

Angara said that while he fully supports the clearing operations in order to help ease traffic in Metro Manila, the displacement of sidewalk vendors and removal of structures such as barangay halls are consequences of the process that should not be ignored.

"We understand that all obstructions on the roads and sidewalks should be cleared. All of the efforts to address traffic congestion in major urban areas such as Metro Manila will not succeed unless the primary, arterial and secondary roads are clear of obstructions," Angara said.

"However, many of those who will be affected are from the informal sector, meaning they have no social protection to fall back on at all. Illegal or not, their needs are just as important as anyone else's," Angara added.

For the displaced vendors, Angara suggested that the LGUs provide permanent facilities for them to legally sell their wares.

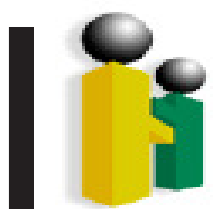

In the case of the barangay halls, police precincts and other public structures that are being removed for encroaching on the sidewalks and roads, Angara said that it is the responsibility of the LGUs concerned to find suitable areas for them to use.

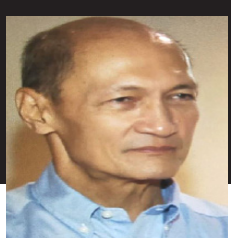

Binabayaran ng PhilHealth ang dengue confinements

MAYNILA – Ginagarantiyahan ng Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) na mayroon itong benepisyon nakalaan para sa dengue. Ito ay matapos ang deklarasyon ng Department of Health ng dengue outbreak sa lalawigan ng Iloilo.

"Binabayaran ng PhilHealth ang mga pasyenteng na-confine dahil sa dengue. P10,000 para sa dengue with o without warning at P16,000 naman para sa severe dengue," ani BGen. Ricardo C. Morales, President at CEO ng PhilHealth. Idinagdag pa niya na, "Ang mga benepisyon ito ay makukuha sa mga Level 1, 2,

at 3 na ospital. Samantalang ang non-severe dengue ay maaaring gamutin sa mga primary care facility at may benepisyon P7,000."

Ayon sa PhilHealth, maaari ring makakuha ng benepisyo maging ang mga hindi pa miyembro kapag nangailangan ng atensiyong medikal dahil sa dengue.

"Maaari silang magkaroon ng coverage sa pamamagitan ng Point of Service (POS). Kung saan ang walang kakayahang magbayad ng kontribusyon ay babayaran ng gobyerno ang kanilang isang taong premium," dagdag ni Morales.

Ang impekisyong nakukuha mula sa kagat ng lamok ay may sintomas tulad ng trangkaso. Ang mga naapektuhan nito ay mabilis na dumami sa mga dekadang nakalipas.

Mula Enero hanggang Hulyo 2019, ang PhilHealth ay nakapagbayad na ng 174,000 dengue claims na humigit sa P1.7 bilyon. 17,000 ng mga claim ay nagmula sa NCR na ikalawa lamang sa Region II na nagtala ng 19,000 claims. Samantala, ang mga Rehiyon IV-A, VII, X, XI, at XII ay kabilang sa mga nangungunang rehiyon para sa mga dengue

health care provider network of the universal health care framework.

Janaíro welcomed his appointment and said he will harmonize the efforts of the three regions in addressing the issues surrounding the Dengvaxia vaccine.

He added that similar services, activities, support, and assistance as provided in Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, and Quezon) will be rolled out to the two other regions.

"Kung ano ang ginawa namin sa Calabarzon ito ang susundin namin for the two regions. Kailangang hanapin natin lahat ng nabakunahan. Bigyan ng physical examination, bantayan at palakasin ang kanilang mga resistensya dahil ito lamang ang makapagbibigay ng proteksyon sa anumang sakit na pwedeng dumapo sa kanila," Janaíro said.

(Whatever we did for Calabarzon, we will also follow for the two regions. We need to find all those who have been vaccinated, give them physical examinations, monitor them and strengthen their immunities/ resistance because this is the only way we can protect them from any disease which they may acquire.)

The newly appointed National Dengvaxia Task Force Chair said he will push for the establishment of vaccine and patient tracking system to know the status of those who received shots of Dengvaxia vaccine.

"Kailangan nating magkaroon ng vaccine and patient tracking kasama na dito ang referral system dahil kailangan natin silang i-profile at bantayan upang malaman kung anumang ang mangyari sa kanila sa loob ng limang taon mula ng sila ay mabakunahan. Lahat ay hahanapin natin at walang dapat maiiwan," he added.

(We need to have a vaccine and patient tracking along with a referral system because we need to profile and monitor them to know what would happen to them within five years of their vaccination. We locate all of them and make sure that no one will be left behind)

Under the Department Personnel Order No. 2019-2458 dated June 10, 2019, DOH established the Task Force for Calabarzon, Central Luzon and Metro Manila to address the tetravalent dengue vaccination concerns.

Janaíro explained that the objective of the national task force is to establish a whole of government and whole of society management team to oversee the implementation of activities for more equitable provision of services for all the regions concerned.

In 2016, the DOH launched the Dengvaxia immunization and was implemented in the three regions including Central Visayas as requested by its congressional representative.

A year after its implementation, it created panic and concern among the parents of children who received the vaccine because of the analysis and announcement made by its manufacturer.

According to DOH, a total of about 833,000 Filipino children were given the controversial Dengvaxia vaccine.

Address, ordered the LGUs and the Metropolitan Manila Development Authority to "reclaim all public roads that are being used for private ends" in order to ensure the smooth flow of traffic in Metro Manila.

Responding to the directive of the President, the Department of Interior and Local Government, gave the Metro Manila mayors up to the end of September this year to clear public roads of all obstructions.

The local chief executives were also ordered to revoke all permits issued to private entities for the occupation of public roads, alleys and other thoroughfares.

DOH distributes assistive devices to Calabarzon PWDs

SAN MATEO, Rizal – The Department of Health regional office has distributed some 180 assistive devices comprised of wheelchairs, crutches, canes and walkers to persons with disability (PWDs) in Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon (Calabarzon).

The distribution ceremony culminated the two-day "PWD Health Summit for CALABARZON" which gathered some 130 PWDs, whose federation officials and representatives received on their behalf the 40 wheelchairs, 40 crutches, 40 canes and 40 folding walkers on Wednesday at the Ciudad Christia Resort here.

"In CALABARZON, we have already prioritized the health needs of PWDs by providing them medical services and assistive devices that will enable them to be physically active and help them compensate even with a limited activity," said Dr. Eduardo C. Janairo, DOH Calabarzon Regional Director.

Janairo said the PWDs is one sector of the society that should not be left behind, but instead be given equal opportunity in health now that the Universal Health Care Law is ratified.

The DOH regional office hosted the two-day summit themed "Lokal na Pamahalaan: Kabalikat sa Pagtupad ng Karapatan ng mga Taong May Kapansanan," (Local Government: Partner in Upholding the Rights of PWDs), was part of the nationwide observance of the "National Disability Prevention and Rehabilitation Week," held annually every 3rd week of July through Proclamation 361 in Aug. 19, 2000.

"PWDs need more than what we can give them, thus the need to understand their needs and capabilities prompting government agencies to provide them the opportunity for work and



make them more productive, self-reliant and empower them to become active," Janairo added.

According to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) 2010 data, Calabarzon Region has the highest number of PWDs with 193,000 followed by the National Capital Region with 167,000; Central Luzon – 139,000; Western Visayas – 138,000; and Central Visayas – 109,000; and Cordillera being the lowest with 26,000 PWDs.

During the two-day PWD summit, the DOH Calabarzon team presented various topics on PWD empowerment; updates on health service delivery concerning PWDs, their Philhealth benefits, and the institutionalization of a national integrated cancer control program.

Dentists from the regional health office also provided free dental cleaning and check-up for PWDs in attendance. (PNA)

our government may effectively stamp out criminality, illegal drugs, terrorism, and other ills that have prevented us from improving the lives of our people," he noted.

"Let us carry out our shared duty of building a stronger and more progressive Philippines that we can all leave behind for future generations of Filipinos."

Separately, the President also administered Monday the oath of Wendel Avisado, the acting secretary of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and William Dar, the acting secretary

of the Department of Agriculture (DA).

President Duterte also mentioned in his speech the challenges that his government has been facing, including the roadblocks in the implementation of the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL).

The administration also has to deal with the Moro National Liberation Front (MNLF) led by Nur Misuari, hoping that the Muslim leader with strong influence in Sulu, Basilan, and Tawi-Tawi accepts

the same terms conceded by the government to the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF).

The proliferation of illegal drugs, another menace that the President has vowed to confront, is also a major concern for the government.

But he said he worries more about the influence of ISIS in Mindanao after the extremist group caused so much destruction in Iraq, Syria, and other parts of the Middle East.

"Talagang ako'y nagdarasal. I'm praying...I really

pray. Talagang lumuluhod ako sa Diyos na to spare us the kind of brutality and cruelty in our country because it will really be bloody... bloody as it can ever be," the President said.

Also present Monday were Executive Secretary Salvador Medialdea, Presidential Legal Counsel and Spokesperson Salvador Panalo, and Communications Secretary Martin Andanar. PND

Other coastal municipalities such as Kawit and Naic are next to visit for donation of relief.

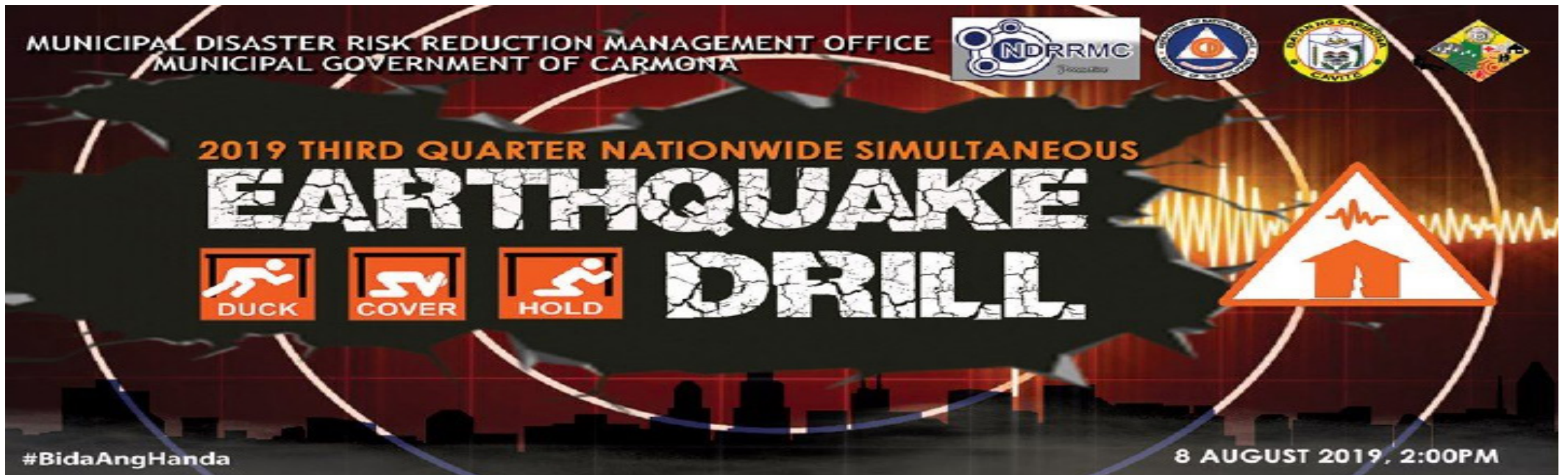

REVILLA TO ESTABLISH INCLUSIVE EDUCATION LEARNING RESOURCE CENTERS FOR SPECIAL CHILDREN, YOUTH

Sen. Bong Revilla filed Senate Bill No. 804 to institute inclusive education by establishing inclusive education learning centers for children and youth with special needs in all public school divisions in the country.

A 2018 report by PhilHealth revealed that one out of seven or 5.1 million children in the country are living with disabilities.

This was supported by another report from the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP) released in 2018, where 26.56 percent of poor children with disabilities do not have a strong referral system.

According to Revilla's bill, the inclusive education learning center aims to provide language and speech therapy, quality reading or other effective methods of delivering reading materials to individuals with visual impairments, acquire and modify equipment and device, ensure appropriate classroom accommodation, and assist in transferee or admission of qualified children and youth with special needs to post-secondary or tertiary education.

To fully equip the teachers and staff personnel, Revilla said that the center shall provide technical and professional assistance and replication of successful innovations approaches

in providing educational or related services.

He further believes that the establishment of an inclusive learning center in every municipal and city division in the country will help increase active participation and integration in public, civic and state affairs among children and youth with special needs.

President Duterte swears in newly appointed officials, asks support to fight corruption

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte led the mass oath taking in Malacañang on Monday of newly appointed officials, asking their help to stamp out corruption in government, one of his campaign pledges during the 2016 election.

In his speech during the mass oath-taking rites, President Duterte told the newly appointed officials that part of their responsibilities is upholding integrity, accountability, and transparency in the institutions that they will serve.

"Our people have long suffered from the scourge of corruption and red tape in the bureaucracy. As you assume your respective offices, I expect you to help me in the task of regaining our people's trust in government by pursuing necessary bureaucratic reforms that will enable us to address the needs of those we serve," he said.

"Know that you will always have my complete support as long as you resist any temptation that will taint your character and reputation as public servants."

The President promised to reduce corruption in government to the barest minimum during his term as president.

At the same time, he encouraged the newly appointed officials to keep their dignity intact, stressing that he personally guarantees that any form of corruption will be dealt with promptly and



severely.

The President then rallied for their support so that the administration can finally end the ills that have degraded the level of governance in the country.
