


'Confess, repair, return': Cardinal David's message to the corrupt

The head of the Catholic hierarchy said repentance—not rhetoric—is what the nation needs, urging those involved in the flood control scandal to confess, make amends and return stolen funds.

Cardinal Pablo Virgilio David of Kalookan, president of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines, said the Church stands with the people in demanding truth and accountability in the alleged misuse of public funds for flood control projects nationwide.

In a video message, David outlined what he called the "essential" steps



of Christian reconciliation for those burdened by guilt and the pain carried by their families.

"First, confes-

sion— the courage to admit the wrong that has been done and the good that was left undone," David said.

"Second, contrition— the sincere remorse for the harm inflicted on our people and our institutions," he added, calling it vital for moral conversion and healing.

"And third, penance through restitution the willingness to repair the damage and return what has been taken," he said, stressing that restitution completes repentance.

David said that when these steps are present,

He emphasized that unauthorized possession, sale, or use of these devices is considered a criminal offense and violators may face imprisonment of six years and one day to 12 years, a fine ranging from ₱10,000 to ₱20,000, or both. Confiscation of all involved electrical materials, devices, or meters is also mandated by law.

The provincial police chief further cautioned that individuals found guilty of tampering with or selling unauthorized electric meters may face disconnection of power service and permanent disqualification from future electrical

Red called on Cavite residents to remain alert and report any person or establishment engaged in the illegal trade, tampering, or installation of electric meters to the nearest police station or through the official Cavite Police Provincial Office Facebook page.


