13 NEW CONFIRME D-19 CASES

13 newly confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in the Town of Carmona were recorded on July 18, 2020

According to our initial investigation, the said cases are from Barangay 3, Barangay 8, Milagrosa (8 cases), Bancal, and Lantic (2 cases). Most of our new cases are working with companies here in our town (8), close contacts of a previously confirmed case (4), and a seaman with travel history in Metro Manila. Contact tracing and surveillance continues to be conducted in the said barangays.

Aside from the information mentioned, the patient profiles of C-P81 will be released until C-P93 later for your generosity.

It is disturbing the continuous coming of the newly confirmed cases of COVID-19 in our town but it is expected especially to continue opening the economy and loosing the borders. The

CA junks Tolentino libel suit vs. Ted Failon

Court of Appeals (CA) dismissed the libel complaint filed by former Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) chairman and now Senator Francis Tolentino against broadcaster Ted

In a decision dated July 7 released on Thursday penned by Associate Justice Pablito A. Perez, the CA's Twelfth Division dismissed the criminal complaint and ordered the Cavite Regional

Trial Court (RTC) Branch 18 to cease and desist from the proceedings.

Aside from Failon, known as Mario Teodoro Etong in real life, the CA also cleared ABS-CBN's "Failon

As Anti-Terror Law Takes Effect: Yes to Vigilance, No to Disinformation

Now that the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020 is in effect, the Filipino people are assured of a law that allows the Philippines to mount the needed strong response against the threat of terrorism.

As the one who painstakingly sponsored the measure in the Senate, I will not allow anyone to pervert the legislative intent of the law, thus my commitment to go the extra mile in guarding against possible abuse in its implementation.

It is the responsibility of all Filipinos to see to it the law is implemented properly - meaning, it is meant to go after terrorists and not anyone else. Thus, the efforts of some groups to similarly keep watch against abus-



es despite the safeguards already in place are very much welcome, so long as they avail of the proper venues and follow safety protocols.

That said, we cannot afford to have disinformation campaigns aimed to make the public reject the Anti-Terrorism Law. Terrorism knows no timing or borders. I hope the day will not come that critics of the law - especially those behind the disinformation drives - will not be at the receiving end of terrorist attacks.

BREADWINNER TRIUMPHS OVER COVID-19 AND FINANCIAL WOES

What happens when in one snap, the provider of the family cannot take care of his loved ones anymore?

"Ako nag-head aning pamilya nako kay breadwinner man ko, nag-agaw buhay ko sa ospital, nag-text pa akong brother na wala na sila'y makaon sulod sa panimalay (Being the head of the household as the breadwinner, while I was hovering between life and death in the hospital, I received a message from my brother that my family has nothing to eat at home anymore.)," Gay Lord Aves, a Cebuano COVID-19 survivor, shares one of his most difficult experiences while fighting for his life due to the novel coronavirus.

On May 21, Aves suddenly felt tired, lost his appetite, and had a terrible headache. Thinking that it was just one of those days where one feels a little

under the weather, he just went on with his work, took a medicine, and waited for his condition to alleviate.

A few days went by but his situation worsened to having a sore throat, cough, fever, and the dreaded difficulty in breathing which led him to immediately go to a hospital and have himself tested for COVID-19.

As Aves was undergoing self-isolation, his results came in. He was negative for the rapid test, but marked positive with the swabbing or the Reverse

Transcription-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test. Aves immediately sought help from their local government unit which led him to their barangay isolation center (BIC). During his stay in the BIC, his

condition worsened. Breathing became more difficult than ever, to the point of him yearning for oxygen.

His father immediately flew to get him. He drove him around the city searching for hospitals. At that time,

Aves remembered being hopeless, "I [wanted] to give up on life because of the gravity of pain that [was] just unbearable." Fortunately, they received a referral to the

Allegiant Regional Care (ARC) Hospitals in Lapu-Lapu City where he was finally admitted on the first day of June. He got discharged after over a week in the hospital. Kate Trangia, Pubic Affairs Unit, PRO 7 — The experience for him was like an arduousclimb, as not only did his condition struck on him physically, but also mentally and emotionally. With his family on the line, he converted his worries to strength and fought with his might. Eventually, his oxygen level went back up and his body responded well to the medicines.

"The whole experience was both a tragedy and a victory. It was a near-death experience. But God is so good. He gave me a second chance at life. I am forever thankful to God, to my family and friends and to all the people of ARC Hospitals for all the warmth, help and care they gave me. PhilHealth [also] came as an angel.

I never expected it would give me so much financial help during my crisis. My case was placed under the category moderate pneumonia and PhilHealth shouldered 143,000 pesos out of my total bill and it was such a relief!

Wala'y kinutuban ang akong pagpasalamat sa Phil-Health tungod kay taliwala sa krisis pinansyal, wala ako pasagdi sa PhilHealth ug ila gayod gituman ang ilaha'ng saad nga motabang ug moagak sa katawhan. (My gratitude to PhilHealth will be unending as amid the financial crisis, PhilHealth never left me behind and stayed true to their promise of providing aid towards people).

With many lives lost and many others who are still fighting for theirs during this pandemic, Aves is one of the thousands who got a chance at second life and a living testimony of how important healthcare is. To this day, he actively advocates for convalescent plasma donation to help treat seriously ill coronavirus patients, and be another angel towards others who, like him, may also triumph over COVID-19. The libel case involved a report on the purchase of second-hand motorcycles by the MMDA which Tolentino then headed "with commentary on the broader context of possible fund misuse".

A second broadcast of the program prompted a second libel complaint.

The Department of Justice in 2017 ruled that as media practitioners, Failon and his co-accused lawfully performed the press function of exposing anomalies and irregularities in government.

Tolentino appealed the DOJ ruling while the prosecutors filed a motion to withdraw the information.

Failon took the case to the CA after the lower court judge failed to act on the prosecutors' motion.

Ruling in favor of Failon and his team, the CA said they had acted within their rights.

"Certainly, if we are to remain faithful to the dictum that public office is a public trust. Some leeway should be given to the public to express disgust or discontent-- even if such expression is sometimes acrid, harsh, critical, vitriolic and accusatory. The interest of society and the maintenance of good government demand a full and free discussion of pub-

minds everyone not to let their guards down but be more vigilant to keep safe.

"The MGCQ status will not change the threat of the COVID-19 but rather puts us at more risk," Mayor Angeles said.

Meanwhile, the RHU was apologetic for being behind in reporting because they make sure their announcements/posts are all true and well documented.

"Now that the government is easing quarantine restrictions to balance public health with the need to reopen the economy, we must institute measures to promote discipline and individual responsibility among our people through local legislation," he said Tuesday.

The DILG Chief said these ordinances that prescribe discipline includes following health safety protocols like wearing a face mask in public, sanitizing hands, doing at least one-meter physical distancing, observing cough etiquette, and staying at home for children and senior citizens.

"I encourage LGUs from provincial to barangay

sanggunians to make use of their legislative power to enact ordinances on 'discipline as the new normal' to beat COVID-19. By instituting individual discipline, we can defeat COVID-19," he pointed out.

The DILG Secretary reminded the public about the World Health Organization (WHO)'s warning that COVID-19 is merely biding its time waiting for people to let their guards down. The WHO said that even in countries that haven't seen any cases recently, COVID-19 hasn't gone away for good.

WHO advises people to avoid the three Cs: confined and closed spaces with poor ventilation, crowded places, close-contact settings, especially where people have close-range conversations. Police can't police every person

"His proposal is good. It's true that the police cannot police everyone all the time. Police can't do it alone in making sure that all continue to follow health safety practices. Every Filipino must do his responsibility. If there's an ordinance, it imposes a duty to obey, involves a sanction, promotes order, and benefits all," the DILG Chief said.

Eleazar recently said that some LGUs have passed their ordinances imposing a penalty on people who would be caught not wearing face masks in public places and violating the quarantine protocols on physical distancing.

Disiplina Muna campaign adopted by PNP

To walk the talk on discipline, the PNP launched the Disiplina Muna national advocacy campaign in the PNP National Headquarters and all Regional Police Offices across the country.

"Tandaan po natin, lalo na mga pulis at nasa frontline—lalong-lalo na sa mga nasa lansangan, kayo ang show window ng pulisya. The discipline that you display reflects on the character of the PNP organization as a whole," said DILG Undersecretary for Peace and Or-

der Bernardo C. Florece, Jr. during the launch in Camp Crame.

"Patunayan natin na tayo ay may disiplina. Higit sa lahat, may malasakit, may dangal, at puso, pinakahigit sa lahat at may takot sa Diyos," he urged.

The launching is in line with DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2019-18 directing the Department's attached agencies and LGUs to roll out the campaign in their respective organizations and jurisdictions.

The Disiplina Muna campaign is one of the DILG's projects as Chair of the Cabinet's Participatory Governance Cluster. It seeks to rebuild the culture of discipline among Filipinos to foster people's participation as one of the tenets of good governance.

Florece lauded the PNP for adopting the campaign, which cuts across government, private sector, civil society, and the media. He said that the campaign's relevance is imminent in the current pandemic and the post-COVID-19 era.

The campaign has earned support from the public as well as from celebrities like Mateo Guidicelli, Diether Ocampo, Paolo Bediones, and James Deakin.

Good Clinical Practice," dela Peña said.

Once given FDA approval, the project would run for five months and would be implemented by Dr. Cecilia Maramba of the University of the Philippines Manila.

Their target date of implementation is on August 1, as soon as they get the FDA clearance.

"There are numerous studies involving lagundi. It also has been one of our traditional herbs used for cough, which has been scientifically validated to be efficacious for treating respiratory symptoms, such as those in nonbacterial cough and asthma," dela Peña said. (PNA)



Secretary Fortunato dela Peña

MANILA - The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) has approved the clinical trials for the local herb, lagundi, against the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), Secretary Fortunato dela Peña

"The project aims to determine if lagundi, as adjuvant therapy, can provide symptomatic relief for mild Covid-19 patients without co-morbidities. It also aims to determine if lagundi can decrease the number of patients who progress from mild to moderate or severe case," dela Peña told the Philippine News Agency (PNA) in an interview Saturday.

Lagundi tablet or syrup is a proven bronchodilator with its registered indication for the treatment of cough, he said, adding that the common symptoms of Covid-19 are fever, cough, sore throat, myalgia, and fatigue.

"Several studies have also explained lagundi's antipyretic, analgesic, anti-inflammatory, and anti-viral activities," he said.

Because of these pharmacologic properties, dela Peña said lagundi seems a suitable choice for the symptomatic treatment of Covid-19 patients.

He clarified that even if the DOST has approved and would fund this study, it still needs the approval of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

"The FDA will further evaluate and ensure full protection of human subjects' rights and safety, and the integrity of clinical trial data through the adoption and implementation of international standards on
