BATANGAS CITY- Two weeks after Taal Volcano's eruption, most residents who were housed in temporary shelters have gone home beginning Sunday, Jan. 26 when the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology lowered the volcano's Alert Level 3 from Level 4.

PhilHealth extends special privileges during catastrophic situations

IN the light of on-going crisis situation resulting from the recent eruption of Taal volcano in Talisay, Batangas, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) is extending certain privileges to ensure continued provision of responsive health care benefits to members at all times especially during fortuitous events where help is needed the most.

Pursuant to its Circular 34, s. 2013, claims of non-accredited health care facilities on behalf of members or their beneficiaries shall be covered, provided that the concerned facilities are duly licensed or certified by the Department of Health. The same also extends to services by non-accredited health care professionals but are holders of valid license issued by the Professional Regulations Commission.

Also covered are claims for medical treatments done as an outpatient or inpatient relative to both direct and indirect effects of a fortuitous event within improvised or satellite facilities, as well as for patients being transferred from or managed by health care personnel from accredited facilities in evacuation areas or improvised health care facilities.

The circular also extends special privileges such as exemption from the 45 days annual benefit limit and the policy on 'single period of confinement' where patients can avail of full coverage even if their series of confinements have intervals of less than 90 days.

During such fortuitous events, admissions of less than 24 hours shall also be paid while filing period of claims is extended from 60 days to 120 days from discharge of the patient. Also granted under the policy include extension of deadlines in the payment of premium contributions, reimbursement for both referring and receiving health care facilities, priority in the processing of claims, extension of deadline for submission of health care facility reports, extension of accreditation of providers as applicable, among others.

"We recognize that uninterrupted availability and access to health care are crucial during calamities, that is why we assure our affected Kababayans of their PhilHealth benefits, as well as our partner hospitals and even those not yet accredited with us that their services will be reimbursed," Ricardo C. Morales, PhilHealth President and CEO said, adding that these privileges are granted only in areas declared under state of calamity or emergency.

In pushing for his proposal, Revilla said bullying not only affects the physical, mental and emotional health but could also cause long-term career problems to a person.

"Bullying in the workplace is often ignored and overlooked by both employers and co-employees, only on the victim's emotional health but on his productivity and morale," he explained.

Under the bill, all government and non-government offices, and business establishments, shall adopt policies to address bullying in their respective institutions.

Pope Francis has earlier appointed Cardinal Tagle as Prefect of the Congregation on the Evangelization of Peoples

Pabillo stressed that the Church has its process of choosing bishops and appointing them to various positions

"We know that positions in the Church are not by popularity, much less by our so-called 'padrino system," he said.

Describing the process, he revealed that consultations are conducted in the countries concerned by the apostolic nunciature.

He said that consultation letters are sent to people who would know the candidates or who could nominate other candidates for the intended position.

"Those consulted are bound under pontifical secret not to divulge the consultation letters and their responses to protect the good name of the candidates and the respondents alike," Pabillo said.

All the answers, he said, are then processed in the nunciature and then sent to the Congregation for Bishops in Rome which further analyzes and discerns on the results.

The pope must approve the final selection and the person chosen is then informed and asked for his consent. "It is only then that a date is set for the public announcement," he said.

Bishop: Pray, not speculate over selection of Cardinal Tagle's successor

A church official has called for prayers instead of making speculations on the process of choosing a successor for Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle as Manila archbishop. Saying that the process is "tedious," Bishop Broderick Pabillo, the auxiliary of

Manilasaid it is "useless" to speculate on who would be the next head of the Manila archdiocese. "Rather than speculate, the best thing to do is to pray that those consulted and

those who do and process the consultations may be enlightened and guided by the Holy Spirit," he said. He said the process of choosing Tagle's successor will be guided by the Apostolic

Nunciature in Manila and could take a "long" time. According to him, certain bishops, priests, nuns and lay leaders likely will have an

input into the selection process. "Most of all, we pray for the Holy Father. The final responsibility rests on him, and to think that there are more than five thousand positions in the Church and all over the

world to be considered," he said. "This is no easy task, so we all need to pray for the Holy Father in this service that he does for the Church," he added. Turn to Page 3

In a report, the Office of Civil Defense-4A said 165 families in various evacuation sites in Batangas and Laguna have so far returned to their homes as January 27.

The families were previously housed in various evacuation sites in six Batangas towns namely Balayan, Caltagan, Nasugbu, Tuy, Bauan and San Luis. Some 41 families from San Pablo, Laguna have likewise left their temporary shelters. The return of other

evacuees from Tanauan and Batangas cities are still on-going.

Meanwhile, the provincial government is setting its sights on putting up Magiting Assistance Centers to facilitate the distribution of food, shelter, clothing, medicines and basic needs for residents affected by Taal volcano's eruption in the aftermath of Taal's reduced alert level.
