LUNGSOD NG BATANGAS, Abril 5 (PIA) --Umabot na sa kabuuang 54 na mga empleyado ng pamahalaang panlalawigan ng Batangas ang nag-positibo sa COVID-19 ayon sa datos ng Provincial Health Office (PHO).

Pinakamaraming tinamaan ng virus ang Provincial Treasurer's Office, kung saan galing ang mga empleyadong may tungkulin sa pamamahagi ng mga financial assistance, tulad ng educational, medical, burial, at iba pang tulong.

Karamihan ng mga opisinaang may mataas na bilang ng COVID cases ay nasa frontline services sa Kapitolyo, kabilang ang Provincial Assistance for Community Development Office, Provincial Accounting Office, Provincial Veterinary Office, at Lobo District Hospital.

Ayon sa Office of the Provincial Governor, ipinatutupad sa bawat tanggapan ng Kapitolyo ang pagsunod sa lahat ng health protocols kontra sa new corona virus, kabilang ang pagsusuot ng face masks at face shields, 30% - 50% work force kada tanggapan, hindi pagpapapasok ng mga bisita sa mga opisina, at physical distancing.

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Intensified testing, tracing to boost benefit of ECQ extension

MANILA – A more intensified implementation of the prevent, detect, isolate, treat, and reintegrate (PDITR) strategy is key for the enhanced community quarantine (ECQ) to be more effective in reducing coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) cases, the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) said.

“The latest data shows that we are at a critical juncture. Our collective actions today will spell the difference between containment and further spread of the virus. ECQ alone does not reduce the spike in the Covid-19 cases. The solution is to further enhance our implementation of the PDITR strategy with clear targets to achieve. This will

help reduce the spike in Covid-19 cases given the new variants,” acting Socioeconomic Planning Secretary Karl Kendrick Chua said in a statement.

Chua said the PDITR strategy worked between August 2020 and February 2021 when the country reduced cases to below 2,000 per day, which allowed for the gradual opening of the

economy.

However, with the new variants, the implementation of the PDITR strategy needs to be further intensified, he said.

Last April 3, 2021, 12,576 new cases were recorded with a positivity rate of 21.1 percent. The standard positivity rate is less than 5 percent according to the World Health Organization.

On the same day, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) on the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases recommended the one-week extension of the



Bong Go lauds bayanihan efforts as hundreds of nurses from Visayas volunteer to augment medical frontlines in NCR Plus

Senator Christopher "Bong" Go, Chair of the Senate Committee on Health, lauded the bayanihan efforts of healthcare workers in the Visayas who expressed willingness to be deployed to Metro Manila, Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna and Rizal.

The initiative, spearheaded, by Go aims to help augment personnel in hospitals and other health facilities in the 'NCR Plus' area amid high COVID-19 cases.

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Remittances, improved external demand to buoy PH recovery

MANILA – Growth of money being sent home by overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) and improvement of external demand are expected to boost the domestic economy’s recovery this year.

However, Fitch Solutions Country Risks and Industry Research reduced its growth projection for the country this year from 7.6 percent to 5.8 percent on the expected hit from the enhanced community quarantine (ECQ). The ECQ status in Metro Manila, Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna, and Rizal set from March 29 until April 4 was extended for another week to April 11 amid surge of coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) cases.

Fitch Solutions said another unfavorable factor

in the economy’s recovery is the slow vaccination rollout.

In a report released Monday, the unit of Fitch Group cited signs of gradual economic activity such as the above 50 level of the Manufacturing Purchasing Managers’ Index (PMI), which was unchanged at 52.5 last February against the previous month “indicating a gradual improvement in activity.”

As of last March, the PMI index stood at 52.2 based on the report of the IHS Markit.

An index of above 50 indicates expansion while a figure of below 50 shows otherwise.

“Indeed, respondents noted supportive demand dynamics and increased inventory building

on a more positive outlook,” Fitch Solutions said.

The report also said external demand has been improving, partially due to the Covid-19 vaccination program in other countries.

Similarly, OFWs remittances continue to remain resilient, it added.

The report said while the January 2021 inflows declined by 1.7 percent year-on-year, it is 1.8 percent higher than the January 2019 pre-pandemic level.

“We believe that overall remittance flows will begin to gradually rebound as growth picks up globally, particularly on the back of a recovery in the US and the Middle East on the back of rising oil prices, which together accounted for 57.4 percent of remittances in

2019,” it said.

It added while lockdowns in Europe and tightening credit growth in China threaten the broader recovery in global demand as vaccination rollouts progress, “we expect growth to prove strong, boosting the outlook for exports which we forecast to grow 9.5 percent, following a 16.7 percent contraction in 2020.”

“As such, the external backdrop should continue to provide support to the economy in 2021,” it said.

However, the report said implementation of the two-week ECQ will slightly dampen growth prospects given the expected slide in domestic consumption and investment, factors that the domestic economy are highly vulnerable to. (PNA)

On behalf of the people of Cavite, ako po ay sa nagpapasalamat at kahit papaano ay may tulong na paparating.

Noong nakaraang linggo ay sinabi ko na “disaster in the making” ang kasalukuyang sistema sa pagbibigay ayuda.

Some of the issues include:

1. Are the middle-class families living in the over 2,000 subdivisions disqualified again?
2. The budget allocation is based on the 2010 census: 3.2 million was Cavite's population eleven years ago. Today, the headcount is approx. 4.2 million citizens.
3. The current allocation gives very little flexibility on how to serve the people most equitably.

A few remedies I would like to propose (Inuulit ko na SUGGESTION pa lamang ang mga ito sa National Government for their consideration):

1. There are approximately 1.3 million households in Cavite. Ang rekomendasyon ko ay mabigyan natin ng ayudang patas ang bawat pamilya;
2. Sa P3.2B ay kaya ang hanggang P2,500 per family;
3. Commit to a full accounting & transparency in the disbursement of funds.

By doing so:

1. Maiiwasan ang mali kung gagawin nating patas ang sistema;
2. Walang inggitan at reklamo sa mga hindi maaabutan;
3. Ang middle class na laging nakakalimutan ay tiyak protektado at garantisado.

APOLOGIES

Humihiingi po ako ng paumanhin kung antipatiko ang dating ko sa last post re CHECKPOINT:

1. Ang stress level ko po ay lagpas ulo na. Ang mga hospitals natin ay lagpas sa 30 frontliners na ang COVID-positive;
2. Ang testing lab po natin sa DLSU-HSI ay kasalukuyang baldado. Halos kalahati sa mga tao doon ay COVID-positive;
3. It is very difficult to navigate this unprecedented crisis. Please understand we're also following directives from the IATF as well as the other government agencies involved;
4. Kahit mga staff ko mismo sa Kapitolyo ay puro COVID-positive na.
5. With the ECQ extension, many businesses continue to be inoperable. We do not know until when the ECQ will remain in effect unless the government is able to control the situation better and bring down the numbers.

In fact, the most popular question I've seen on social media: Does the government have a concrete plan of action aside from the endless lockdown?

That said, I promise to be even more sensitive and mindful with regards to how everyone is coping. I should have realized that many are having a hard time. Hindi po ako nagtatago sa excuses. I am not exempted. I am man enough to own up to my mistakes. My responsibility is to “serve the people first above everything else.

ECQ AYUDA GUIDELINES



In preparation for the arrival of aid funds, here are the guidelines we will implement for the proper distribution of it. This is what we base on Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, Series of 2021, of DILG, DSWD, and DND. P447, 563,000: Imus City will be accepted to distribute to those affected by ECQ.

P1, 000.00 per individual, or limited to P4, 000.00 per family.

PRIORITIES IN RECEIVING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ACCORDING TO JMC (Joint Memorandum Circular):

1. beneficiaries of SAP under Solidarity Act 1, and additional beneficiaries of emergency subsidy (SAP 2) under Solidarity Act 2.
2. beneficiaries of SAP that are on the wait-list.
3. Members of vulnerable groups like: low-income individuals living alone, Persons with Disabilities, solo parents, and others.
4. For remaining funds: additional individuals affected by ECQ.

WAY OF SHARING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Due to the threat of COVID-19, financial assistance distribution will be carried out as much as possible through an electronic platform, such as GCash, Paymaya, cash cards, and others.

Beneficiaries are considered to contact their barangay officials about their chosen electronic payment system, or if they are incapable of using it.

And if not able to use it, barangays have a way to still distribute your financial assistance.

PROCESS OF VERIFYING ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL OR FAMILY

1. Releasing master list according to data from Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) of local DILG.
2. The master list will be brought down to the respective barangays to verify or confirm the details of the listed. This will also be published by barangays on their respective website, social media accounts, along with physical copies in places where it can be seen by the public.

THE LAST VERSION OF THE LIST IS CONTAINED IN THE INFORMATION THAT THE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WILL GIVE.

The barangays are also being arranged:

- Notify the constituents to prepare their electronic payment system.
 - Establish an information dissemination campaign to inform the beneficiaries.
 - Correct list information like missing or wrong details, double name.
 - Know the electronic payment system of the beneficiaries that will be used, and know who is incapable of using it.
3. Within 72 hours (three days) the barangay will return the verified master list to the DILG office to finalize the list of those who can receive financial assistance.

4. The distribution of aid will start within seven (7) days after the barangays submit the verified list of beneficiaries. This will be diligently completed by Imus City Government before April 20, 2021. Distribution can be extended under appropriate factor.

5. The full list of eligible individuals and families will be published on the Facebook Page of Mayor Emmanuel Maliksi and the City Government of Imus.

With the abundance of aid distribution, this list will have an update to show who has received their financial assistance and those who haven't.

APPEALS

The City Government of Imus under Grievance and Appeals Committee will release a process for those who will submit reports or complaints for receiving financial assistance to ensure that the help will be smooth and reach to those who are most affected and in need.

to gather health workers from the Visayas who are willing to assist in addressing the health situation in NCR plus areas.

"Magpapadala po ng nurses at iba pang medical personnel ang Visayas sa NCR Plus upang tumulong sa mga ospital na nangangailangan ng karagdagang frontliners dahil sa mabilis na pagtaas ng kaso ng COVID-19 sa lugar," Go said.

Health Secretary Francisco Duque III and National Task Force Against COVID-19 Chief Implementer Carlito Galvez, Jr. also welcomed the initiative and committed to help in processing the needs of health workers who are willing to be deployed.

"Patunay lamang po ito na sa kabilang pandemya, malakas pa rin ang diwa ng bayanihan sa bansa. Mas mabilis natin malalampasan ang suliraning ito kung tayo mismong mga Pilipino ay magtutulungan," Go said.

Go, through the help of OPAV, sought the assistance of the Department of Health Regional Offices, local government units, Malasakit Center hospitals, and the Project Balik Buhay (PBB) member-private hospitals to implement the initiative.

PBB is a Cebu-based private sector-led organization which aims to help the public sector cope with the challenges brought by COVID-19 in Visayas through collaboration and cooperation of the business sectors and private hospitals.

PBB is a strategic public-private partnership for strengthened COVID-19 response in order to sync in government efforts with private sector initiatives. Members of PBB are owners of private hospitals and businesses in Cebu and the different chambers of commerce and industry. There is an open sharing of data and information in order to come up with policies and programs that best fit the evolving status of the pandemic. Under the PBB, OPAV is in charge of deploying nurses who expressed willingness to augment critical areas. OPAV Secretary Dino said that it will take four to five days to prepare the deployment but they are already

expediting the process in coordination with DOH and other concerned agencies.

The recipient hospitals will shoulder the accommodation, food and the transportation needs of the frontliners once they arrive in Metro Manila, while the OPAV or the DOH Regional Center for Health Development will shoulder their transfer from any point in Visayas to NCR. DOH has also assured that they will be able to provide additional 20% premium of the basic salary for emergency hiring based on Bayanihan 2 funds.

Responding affirmatively to Go's initiative, local chief executives in the Visayas said they aim to gather more than a hundred nurses and other healthcare workers next week to augment the growing needs of hospitals in NCR plus areas. Aside from additional human resource, the initiative also aims to deliver medical supply donations from the Visayas to Metro Manila. These include high flow nasal cannulas, drugs such as Tocilizumab and Remdesivir, other COVID life-saving medicines, among others. Secretary Dino also said that Vicente Sotto Memorial Medical Center in Cebu City has already expressed willingness to provide COVID life-saving medicines. On the other hand, OPAV, with the help of DOH Region VII, is also set to launch a convalescent plasma blood drive to address the growing needs in the NCR.

Go, then, repeated his appeal to all Filipinos to intensify their 'bayanihan' spirit, cooperate with authorities, and show compassion to each other in order to help in the efforts to overcome the ongoing crisis.

"Magtinabangay kitang tanan. (Magtulungan tayong lahat.) Ang ating pagiging mga responsableng mamamayan na nagmamalasakit sa kapwa at nakikisama sa bayanihan ay ang susi sa ating mabilis na pag-ahon sa krisis," he said.

"Patuloy tayong magtutulungan at magbayanihan para hindi bumagsak ang ating healthcare system. Pag-amping pirme, (Mag-ingat palagi)," he ended.

strategy. Containing the virus starts from one's self. By washing hands frequently, wearing masks even at home, staying at home during ECQ, and practicing social distancing when outside to buy essential goods, we can all help contain the virus," Chua said.

He added that on the part of the government, the following key interventions will be pursued: increase and improve the health systems capacity, improve the communication strategy, accelerate vaccine deployment for the vulnerable sectors, and ensure all sectors are equipped with the skills to transition to the new normal.

Chua said with more stringent quarantine standards during the ECQ period, the country stands to benefit from lower number of cases and deaths from Covid-19.

Chua said an additional week of ECQ is estimated to help avert 215,320 cases, of which 6,460 are severe and critical.

"We can also prevent 4,026 Covid-19 deaths," he said.

Moreover, in using this time to significantly upgrade the country's health systems capacity, where testing and isolation are intensified, the benefits would be even greater at additional 323,262 Covid-19 cases that may be averted, of which 9,698 are severe and critical, while preventing 6,045 deaths from Covid-19.

Nevertheless, ex-

tending the ECQ will also have a negative impact on the majority of people.

NEDA estimates that the two-week ECQ would result in some 252,000 more individuals without jobs and 102,000 more poor individuals.

On top of these, the more stringent quarantine in NCR Plus translates to a daily household income loss of PHP2.1 billion or almost PHP30 billion for the two-week period.

All in all, the two-week ECQ may shave off 0.8 percentage points from the country's full year economic growth in 2021.

"ECQ alone does not reduce cases. It simply buys time. Thus, we need to further intensify testing, tracing, quarantine, isolation, treatment, and vaccination," Chua said.

"Enforcing minimum health protocols and monitoring compliance, building more isolation facilities, accelerating vaccine deployment to the vulnerable sectors, and implementing the additional social amelioration program are all needed," he added.

Chua further underscored that the unhampered transition to the digital economy and the new normal, both for government agencies and businesses, should be further promoted to limit physical interactions, as well as enable continued operations and delivery of goods and services. (PR)

WHAT SHOULD YOU KNOW ABOUT AIDA IN NCR +:

WHAT DOES DSWD PLAY IN DISTRIBUTION OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE?

DSWD will share technical assistance to concerned LGUs belonging to NCR+ by providing a validated list of SAP beneficiaries. This will serve as the LGUs guide in determining the aid providers.

DSWD is with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) and Department of National Defense (DND) in assisting LGUs to ensure the proper distribution of financial assistance and comply with the provisions of Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) 1, Series of 2021.

WHO HAS THE DISTRIBUTION OF ASSISTANCE?

Local governments or LGUs belonging to NCR+ have a duty to distribute assistance.

Based on JMC 1, the LGU will identify the most effective and fastest method of distribution of assistance, whether in-cash or in-kind, to their constituents.

It is also necessary that mode and means of distribution are included in an Executive Order issued by the Local Chief Executive before the distribution is carried out.

WHAT WILL BE THE BASIS BE USED FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GIVEN?

According to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), there are 22.9 million of our countrymen from NCR+ (National Capital Region, Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna, and Rizal) qualified to be given financial assistance.

Based on the Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, series of 2021, the priority to provide financial assistance to local governments are the following:

- a. Benefits of Social Amelioration Program (SAP) under Bayanihan 1 and additional beneficiaries of emergency subsidy of Bayanihan 2;
- b. Mga SAP waitlisted beneficiaries;
- c. Members of the vulnerable sector like low income people living alone, persons with disabilities (PWD), solo parents, etc;
- d. Other individuals to be identified by LGUs who are highly affected by ECQ, if their funds are worthy.

IS THE REPRESENTATIVE FAMILY INCLUDED IN THE NUMBER OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE NOW?

As part of Technical Assistance to LGUs of NCR +, DSWD shared the list of SAP beneficiaries, including 4 Ps beneficiaries.

The said list has been shared to serve as a reference by LGUs in determining the recipients of financial assistance. So LGUs are still at the discretion of who gives priority for financial assistance.

HOW MUCH IS IT POSSIBLE FOR EACH FAMILY TO GET?

Based on DBM's released Local Budget Circular, Php 1,000.00 per individual and no more than Php 4,000.00 per family can receive.

If the family has more than 4 members, they will still receive no more than Php 4,000.00

WHERE CAN I FIND THE LIST OF THOSE WHO WILL BE GIVEN FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE?

Before the distribution of financial assistance, LGUs should post a list of verified beneficiaries on their official website and social media accounts. This should also be posted in barangay areas where it is easy to see and read.

With this method, we can ensure that eligible and qualified beneficiaries will receive financial assistance as the whole community participates in its validation.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS OF REDUCING THE FUND AND ASSISTANCE TO BENEFITS?

The fund will be translated directly by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) to LGUs belonging to NCR+ under ECQ.

After the LGU has set the method of receiving aid in their EO, in-cash or in-kind assistance can be distributed to their most affected constituents.

According to JMC 1, the said fund can only be used as assistance during ECQ season and cannot be allocated for other programs, projects, and activities.

WHEN WILL THE AYUDA BE SHARED?

If the emergency subsidy will be given in cash, it needs to be distributed within fifteen (15) days from the release of the Notice of Cash Allocation and within thirty days (30) if the help given is in kind .

HOW WILL CONCERNED LGUS RESPOND TO COMPLAINS OR REQUESTED FOR AID?

The concerned LGUs will form their own Grievance and Appeals Committee that will respond to the complaints or grievances of their constituents.

Can also create a similar committee in barangays if required.

Expecting immediate committee response to complaints and setting hotline only for this.

"The present Covid pandemic is an unprecedented health crisis that requires extraordinary amount of resources for an indefinite period of time. Lahat tayo dapat magtulungan to ensure that health facilities remain strong and stable in its ability to provide health care to all, especially during this time of pandemic."

The 44-bed capacity modular tent will serve as an extension of the health facility. The tent has a 5-meter wide and 12-meter-long floor area. It is a closed tent, fully covered with soft PVC side wall and with eave height. One modular tent cost Php294,850.00.

Among the sixteen (16) health facilities who received the heavy duty collapsible tents were Carsigma District Hospital in GMA, General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital in Trece Martires City, Ospital ng Imus in Imus and Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital in Bacoor in the province of Cavite; General Cailles Memorial District Hospital in Pakil, Laguna Medical Center in Sta. Cruz, San Pablo City General Hospital in San Pablo City, and San Pablo City District Hospital in San Pablo City in Laguna; Bondoc Peninsula District Hospital in Catanauan, Claro M. Recto Memorial District Hospital in Infanta, Gumaca District Hos-

pital in Gumaca, Magsaysay Memorial District Hospital in Lopez, Quezon Medical Center in Lucena City and RAKK Prophet Medical Center Inc. in Gumaca in the province of Quezon; San Juan District Hospital in San Juan and Mabini Community Hospital in Mabini in Batangas province. Janairo also disclosed that the provinces of Rizal and Batangas are now at high risk in terms of bed occupancy rate with 77.8% and 74.3%, respectively.

"We have moderate risk for total beds occupancy rate for the provinces of Cavite (65.2%), Laguna 63.8% and Lucena City (65.2%). The province of Quezon is at low risk with

57.8%."

"We have to be prepared to handle the influx of Covid patients not only from the provinces but also those of nearby Metro Manila. Our health facilities in the region are already accepting Covid patients from NCR for treatment and care," he emphasized.

The four mega quarantine facilities in the region are now at 64% occupancy rate with a total of 534 admitted patients from a total number of 839 beds capacity.

As of April 6, 2021, a total of 100,440 Covid cases were recorded in the region with 16,860 active cases. There are 80,901 recoveries with 2,679 deaths.

CAVITE POLICE MADE 9 ARRESTS ON DAILY ANTI-CRIMINALITY AND ACCOSTS 182 QUARANTINE VIOLATIONS

Camp BGen Pantaleon Garcia, Imus City, Cavite - Cavite Police Provincial Office arrested 9 individuals in Anti-Criminality Drive and accosted 182 others on Quarantine Violations over the last 24 hours.

Four wanted persons were arrested by virtue of warrant of arrest for Reckless Imprudence Resulting in Physical Injuries and Damaged to Properties in Trece Martires City, Qualified Theft in Carmona, Theft in GMA, violation of RA 9165 (Dangerous Drug Act of 2002)

Three (3) persons were arrested for violation of RA 9165 (Dangerous Drug Act of 2002) in two buy-bust operations in General Trias City and Imus City that resulted in the confiscation of 2 pieces of medium and 4 pieces of small heat-sealed transparent plastic sachets containing white crystalline substance suspected as shabu, drug money and other drug

paraphernalia.

Two (2) suspects were arrested for the crime of Disobedience to an Agent of Person in Authority in GMA, Cavite and Direct Assault in Silang, Cavite.

On the other hand, one hundred eighty-two (182) Community Quarantine violators were recorded provincewide for not wearing face masks, social distancing, and violation of curfew hours.

The arrested suspects who committed criminal offense were apprised of their Constitutional Rights and documentation are being undertaken for filing appropriate charges against them before the City and/or Provincial Prosecutor.

Cavite PNP is still committed to enforce laws, prevent and control crimes and continue to strengthen its operational capabilities despite the challenges facing in this time of pandemic. (Cavite PIO)
