Pres. Duterte calls for unity during National Heroes Day celebration

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte rallied for national unity Monday during the celebration of the National Heroes Day 2019 as he renewed his administration’s vision to create a more progressive Philippines.

In his speech delivered by House Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano at the Libingan ng mga Bayani in Taguig City, President Duterte honored the country’s heroes who fought during the tumultuous period in the country’s history and called on the Filipino people to emulate their patriotism.

“We dedicate this day most especially to those unnamed heroes who have also shed blood, sweat, and tears in



defense of this nation and the values that it represents,” the President said in his message.

“As we commemorate National Heroes Day, I call on my fellow Filipinos to emulate the patriotism of all those heroes who came before us by supporting the government’s nation-

building efforts, especially our campaign against illegal drugs, criminality, corruption, terrorism, poverty, and environmental degradation.”

The ultimate sacrifice of the Filipino heroes will never be in vain if the people, in their daily lives, learn to embody their courage through small deeds of heroism that will touch the lives of our countrymen, especially the poor and marginalized, he added.

The Chief Executive then reaffirmed the administration’s commitment to create an environment where every Filipino, regardless of ethnicity, political affiliation, religious belief, educational

attainment, or financial capability, can become a hero in his own right.

It is every Filipino’s obligation, he said, to build on the legacy of those brave men and women who offered their lives building the foundations of a better Filipino nation, adding that the people owe it to the heroes to be worthy heirs to such legacy.

“I therefore ask my fellow Filipinos to set aside our differences so that together, we may shape a more dynamic and prosperous society that will serve as a cradle of future generations of Filipino heroes,” he noted. PND

DOH starts Cavite-wide orientation on BHWs’ role under UHC

TANZA, Cavite (PIA) - The Department of Health in Region IV-A has started its province-wide orientation of Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) in Cavite about primary health care at the community level and their responsibilities under the universal health care (UHC).

Themed “Sa UHC Walang Maiiwan, BHW ay Kailangan,” the two-day capacity building seminar held at Tanza Oasis Hotel on August 29-30 delved not just on its specific role, but includes basic training on health care, “including the preventive and curative aspect,” said Chief Local Health Support Division Dr. Noel G. Pasion.

BHWs, considered as “navigators” under the UHC should know where to refer the patient which will help decongest government hospitals, especially the 2nd and 3rd level ones.

“Nakasalanayan na natin na dalhin agad ang ating mga maysakit sa mga ospital at kadalasan na dahilan ay upang

mabigyan ng magandang lunas ngunit sa ating mga Rural Health Units (RHUs) lamang ay kayang-kaya na itong gamutin lalo na kung ito ay hindi naman malubha,” Pasion said.

(We’re used to bringing the sick directly to the hospital to get treatment but our RHUs are also capable to cure, especially the non-severe cases)

During the seminar, Regional BHW Outcome Manager Kristine Mariel C. Villasanta stressed that under the UHC, barangay health workers will conduct the profiling of families in their respective areas in order for every family to have a health folder.

“Once a family has this health folder, a health professional or health facility can access a person’s health record, history of treatment and medications everywhere in the country. In short, he/she can go to any health facility and request for treatment without repeating any



procedure already done such as x-rays, blood tests as it is already recorded in the health folder,” said Villasanta.

Under UHC, a system will be developed for the identification of those persons most needing medical attention and also to ensure that health care resources will be used to maximize improvements in health. “It is a vital health care planning tool that will be used for families, communities, and populations,” Villasanta

added. There are a total of 21,405 BHWs Region IV-A (Calabarzon) which is composed of the provinces of Cavite (2,182); Laguna (2,054); Batangas (7,686); Rizal (2,476); and Quezon (7,007).

The regional office will continue to conduct a province-wide orientation for all of the BHWs to update them on their functions and responsibilities under universal health care. (Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite with reports from DOH IV-A)

DENR 4A steps up campaign on environmental awareness, celebrates 2019 Int’l Youth Day

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna- Recognizing the importance of environmental awareness among young Filipinos, DENR 4A initiated a lecture on climate change, solid waste management and composting for selected youth in this city on August 13.

This was also in celebration of the International Youth Day 2019 themed, “Transforming Education” which gathered young people from DENR 4A, Toshiba, DepEd, and selected schools of this city.

“May pag-asa pa tayo kung paano ipatupad (ang mga batas para sa kalikasan), at ito ay sa pamamagitan ng ating kabataan!” DENR 4A Assistant Regional Director for Technical Services Arturo E. Fadriquela said.

(We still have hope on how we can implement environmental laws and this is through our youth!)

The Assistant Regional Director pointed out that one of the environmental problems faced by the country today is the difficulty in the implementation of laws on natural resource conservation, solid waste management and protection of trees that serve as last defense against pollution, among others.

He said that focusing on promoting environmental awareness among the youth might give more hope than merely encouraging the older ones to change the lifestyle they had been accustomed to for years.

“Napakahirap talaga na ipatupad ang ating mga patakaran dahil iyong iba ay matanda na talaga at mahirap nang pasunurin at mahirap nang turuan o itama ang mga gawi,” he added.

(It is quite difficult to implement our policies because some of the older generation find it difficult to follow and it is even harder to teach them or ask them to correct their ways.)

However, he emphasized that there is still hope to successfully implement environment laws in the country and that is through the youth.

“Sinasabi nga na tumayo tayo sa kabataan kasi sila ang susunod na henerasyon at sila ang magmamana sa ating mundo kaya sana magabayang nang maayos. Kayo iyon,” he stated addressing the young participants.

(We are placing our hope in our youth since they are the next generation and will be the next in line for our world which is why we have to guide them properly. You are our hope.)

The program included lectures on Climate Change 101 discussed by Laguna Climate Change Adaptation Office (LCCAO) Head Henry B. Halawig and Solid Waste Management and Composting by Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) Senior Ecosystems Management Specialist Lori Estorque. (Joy Gabrido/PIA4A)

Angara--Let’s work on decongesting Metro Manila now

Expanding and rehabilitating the railway systems should be the first step taken in the efforts of the government to decongest traffic in Metro Manila if it wants to make an impact right away, Senator Sonny Angara said.

Angara, the chairman of the Senate Committee on Finance, vowed to look for ways to support the programs of the Department of Transportation (DOTr) to decongest Metro Manila, not only for the long-term, but also in the short and medium term for the sake of the commuters, motorists and the economy as a whole.

“We need to find ways to decongest Metro Manila immediately. It pains us to

see commuters lining up for hours every day to ride the MRT or buses to work and school. Motorists waste so much time stuck on the roads when they could be productive in their offices. Something has to be done about this right now,” Angara said.

The DOTr has several projects aimed at decongesting the roads in Metro Manila, some of which are already being implemented while the others are still in the pipeline.

These include the rehabilitation of the MRT-3, the revival of the Philippine National Rail (PNR) trains and the development of a subway system.

During a briefing on the proposed P147 billion budget of the DOTr for 2020, Transportation Secretary Arthur Tugade acknowledged that increasing the number of “trains” within and outside of Metro Manila is key to reducing the volume of vehicles on the Metro roads.

The DOTr noted that for every train pulling eight cars, 448 vehicles could be removed from the roads, assuming each car carries five passengers.

However, the task of rehabilitating the railways would be very challenging based on the data presented by the DOTr.

In 1938, at the peak of the railway system in the

country, there were 2,400 kilometers of railroad tracks across the country. Now, there are only 77 kilometers left and this includes the MRT and LRT lines.

“We have regressed. That is the tyranny of the automobile. So I think we need to reboot our thinking,” Angara said.

Angara said there is reason for optimism for Metro Manila commuters and motorists in the short and medium term.

Construction for the first phase of the Metro Manila subway system is set to start this November. Once completed, the subway will connect Mindanao Avenue in Quezon City to the NAIA Terminal 3 in Pasay City.

The MRT-3 along EDSA will also undergo rehabilitation, which would allow the trains to move faster and transport more passengers daily.

The LRT-1 extension to Cavite is also underway to connect the large number of residents in the province to Metro Manila where they work.

A new and improved PNR is also in the pipeline. The high-speed rail project will connect Manila to Batangas to Sorsogon.

“Many of these projects will not be completed by the end of President Duterte’s term in 2022. But we have to get to work on this now so that the public will be able to benefit from these at the soonest possible time,” Angara said.



DOH 4A warns public vs risk of leptospirosis

The Department of Health (DOH) Region 4-A has cautioned residents in the Calabarzon (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal, and Quezon) region to be mindful in wading in flood waters during rainy days to avoid contracting leptospirosis.

In a statement, Regional Director Eduardo Janairo reminded the public especially parents of children who are keen in playing outside their homes to be on-guard against leptospirosis. “If we have no business to go outside our homes, it is best to stay inside and be safe. Hindi tayo nakakasiguro na ang dadaanan natin ay hindi baha at laong hindi tayo nakakasiguro na malinis

ang tubig nito dahil sa mga basurang nakakalat sa paligid,” Janairo said. “Mas makabubuti ng umiwas at kung lalabas naman makabubuting magsuot ng bota at siguraduhin na walang bacteria na nagdudulot ng leptospirosis,” the Regional Health Director added.

According to DOH Region 4-A leptospirosis is transmitted through skin abrasions while walking in moist soil, rice fields, and sugar cane plantations contaminated with the urine of an infected animal, like rats.

Adding the deadly disease could be acquired through contaminated

participants from the 26 barangays, expressed his appreciation to the NSB program session held to promote entrepreneurship. Mayor Dionisio encouraged constituents to grab every opportunity that DTI offers, especially the free training and seminar being provided through NSB for it may fuel the town’s economy. “Mahalin natin ang Amadeo,” the mayor added in his message.

Words of inspiration also came from the Chairman Emeritus of the Provincial Cooperative Development Council (PCDC) Ka Rodrigo Camia and the Officer-in-Charge of the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO) Atty. Khervy Reyes, who both shared success stories that are pushed by business and cooperatives. Mr. Camia told the locals of Amadeo the benefits of joining cooperatives, particularly to farmers and to those in the agricultural business; while Atty. Reyes presented the programs and projects of PCLEDO that help capacitate entrepreneurs and cooperatives in the province.

On behalf of Governor Jonvic Remulla, Atty. Khervy Reyes delivered his message of thanks, ensuring everyone that the provincial government will continue developing and conducting interventions needed for economic development. Atty. Reyes also mentioned the Pondo sa Pagbabago at Pag-asenso (P3) program of DTI that can help boost business, since it provides capital loan to micro entrepreneurs.

Other resource speakers during the NSB in Amadeo were from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)-Cavite with their discussion on Business Permit and Licensing System standards, emphasizing the shift to automation and computerization; the Department of Science and Technology with their SETUP or Small Enterprises Technology Upgrading Program that encourages and assists MSMEs in adopting technological innovations; and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) with presentation on the list of trainings they provide.

Aside from the free seminar provided for the locals of Amadeo during the NSB, they also enjoyed free-of-charge pamper services sponsored by TESDA including manicure, pedicure and haircut.

Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit of DOH Region 4-A, there is a total of 75 leptospirosis cases recorded in the region from January 1, 2019 to August 17, 2019.

“Leptospirosis just like dengue is fatal but also preventable. All we need is to clean our surroundings, be sure that our garbage is well-attended and improve flood control measures in the community,” Janairo said. (FSC/DOH 4-A)

8980, otherwise known as the Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) Act.

At present, Daycare Workers receive a negligible P500 per month as honorarium, which is certainly not enough for them to provide for the needs of their families.

Despite the MEASLY compensation and their heavy workload, these workers continue their service to the country,” Revilla said. “We commend them for their dedication, and we have to reciprocate their sacrifices,” the lawmaker added.
