

Namahagi ngayong Enero 9, 2026 ang Carmona LGU sa pamumuno ni City Mayor Dahlia Loyola ng additional na 209 na laptops at 15 desktop computers na nakalaan para sa mga public school laboratories sa ating Lungsod. Ito po ay isa sa at-



ing mga hakbang upang tugunan ang mga modernong pangangailangan ng mga mag-aaral upang mapataas pa ang dekalidad at antas ng edukasyon sa Carmona.

"Pagyamanin niyo

nawa ang mga kagamitan na ito upang malinang ang kakayanan at kaalaman ng kabataang Carmona sa iba't-ibang asignatura at larangan ng pag-aaral," ani Mayor Loyola.

In a major move to ease the financial burden on Filipino businesses and workers, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has ordered PhilHealth to implement a general amnesty program for unpaid health insurance contributions.

"Alam naman namin na 'yung three percent na binabayad para sa PhilHealth buwan-buwan ay ramdam na ramdam ng ating mga kababayan," Marcos stressed.

(We know that the 3% monthly PhilHealth contribution is something our fellow citizens truly feel in their pockets.)

"Kaya po ito po ay patuloy naming ginagawa upang pagaanin ang dala ng ating mga kababayan tungkol nga sa mga healthcare costs at sa lahat ng iba't

ibang hamon na hinarapang ating mga kababayan araw-araw," he added, emphasizing that the amnesty is part of a broader effort to make healthcare more accessible.

(This is why we are doing this to ease the burden on our fellow citizens when it comes to healthcare costs and the various challenges they face every day.)

The program, set to take effect this year, grants a one-time waiver of all interests on missed payments for

the year 2026. This initiative is expected to provide relief to approximately 300,000 beneficiaries, including private employers, small business owners, and self-employed individuals who have struggled to keep up with monthly premiums.

Under the amnesty program, employers and members are given a one-year window to settle all missed contributions spanning from 2013 to 2024, allowing them to pay their arrears without the burden of accumulated interest.

Meanwhile, President Marcos has called on employers to update their records and enroll their

The discussions reflected a shared commitment to addressing social and economic factors that influence student wel-

CEO Acosta highlighted the importance of housing and financial stability in supporting the education sector, noting that secure systems enable students and educators to focus on learning, teaching, and public ser-

Asian track tourney set March 25-30 at Tagaytay velodrome

MANILA – Twelve nations have confirmed their participation in the 45th Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) Track Championships scheduled from March 25 to 31 at the Tagaytay CT Velodrome in Cavite.

"It's been three decades since the country hosted the Asian track championships —1995 to be exact— at the then-Amoranto Velodrome in Quezon City," Philippine Olympic Committee (POC) president Abraham "Bambol" Tolentino said in a statement Thursday.

"With at least 12 nations confirming their attendance and more than 200 athletes competing as of today at the brand-new and International Cycling Union (UCI)-standard velodrome, the POC, PhilCycling and Tagaytay City will be rolling out the red carpet as we aim for an excellent hosting of

the event," he added. Tolentino also serves as PhilCycling head.

Tagaytay City Mayor Aizack Brent Tolentino has assured the city's full support to the tournament, which features men and women sprint, keirin, one-kilometer time trial, team sprint, individual and team pursuit, points race, scratch, omnium, Madison and elimination race.

To be held simultaneously with the 45th Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) Track Championships is the 14th Asian Para Track Cycling Championships, which has competitions in the one-kilometer time trial, individual pursuit, sprint, elimination and scratch races in six events both for men and women.

Besides host Philippines, also competing are powerhouse Japan, South

PGC Continues Health Initiatives with Medical and Dental Mission in Trece Martires City

On January 8, the Provincial Government of Cavite successfully conducted a Medical and Dental Mission in Barangay Cabezas, Trece Martires City, marking the continuation of the PGC's health initiatives for the new year.

The activity served a total of 582 patients, with 379 receiving medical consultations and 49 availing of dental services. Diagnostic services were also provided, including 100 fasting blood sugar (FBS) tests, 32 electrocardiogram (ECG) procedures, and 22 X-ray examinations. Free prescribed medicines were likewise distributed to patients.

Medical and dental services were delivered by health professionals from

the General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH), with the assistance of the Office of the Provincial Governor (OPG) medical mission team.

rang, and barangay officials. The activity underscored the provincial government's sustained commitment to bringing accessible and responsive healthcare services closer to communities, as it continues to roll out health programs aimed at addressing the medical needs of Caviteños throughout the year. — R. ATI Calabarzon training program to focus on ‘modernizing’ agriculture

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Department of Agriculture’s Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) in CALABARZON will prioritize providing responsive training aimed at modernizing local farming and fishing practices in 2026.

Dr. Rolando Maningas, Center Director for ATI CALABARZON, emphasized that the center will also focus on inclusive and technology and skills-based training.

“We will solidify our efforts to modernize and mechanize the agri-fishery sector by reinforcing technologies, innovations, quality extension services, inclusivity, and skills-based training that respond to the evolving needs of our farmers and fishers,” he said.

As the training hub

for farmers, fisherfolk, Agriculture Extension Workers (AEWs), as well as hobbyists and enthusiasts, Maningas also noted that the region’s programs integrated modern technology and sustainable farming practices to create a resilient agriculture sector.

“Training and other extension initiatives by the DA-ATI CALABARZON primarily focused on good agricultural practices, farm mechanization, climate-resilient agriculture, smart farming, and integrated nutrient and pest management,” he added.

Maningas underscored that training for agricultural workers goes beyond production—it also hopes to transform the region’s strengths in agrobusiness.

“The agency also provided technologies along

the agricultural value chain, including post-harvest technologies, processing, and marketing—across different banner programs.”

This effort will focus on key programs, including rice, corn, livestock, Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP), High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP), organic agriculture, and National Urban and Peri-urban Agriculture Program (NU-PAP).

In 2025 alone, the ATI CALABARZON has equipped over 4,783 farmers; 1,209 agricultural extension workers (AEWs) from various local government units; 555 DA staff; and 537 students, agri-enthusiasts; and individuals with essential skills in agriculture. (PB-PIA4A, ATI CALABARZON)

Korea, China, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Chinese-Taipei, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and Iran.

Japan won 16 of the 22 gold medals at stake last year. Host Malaysia got two golds while South Korea, China, Hong Kong and Uzbekistan had one each.

Tolentino is expect-

ing more countries to send their teams to the championships, which already surpassed the 10 nations that took part in last year’s edition in Nilai, Malaysia. The registration deadline is set on Jan. 15.

Tolentino and Asian Cycling Confederation head Dato’ Amarjit Singh Gill led the inauguration of the velodrome in June last year.

Only 12 countries in Asia have velodromes, with Tagaytay City being recognized as the newest indoor and wood facility that vies as a track cycling epicenter for the Southeast Asian region.

Beyond improving children’s nutrition, the program has also positively influenced family practices at home. Liezel Estrada, a parent of a child-beneficiary from Barangay Longos, Kalayaan, Laguna, noted that her child developed healthier eating habits, including a greater preference for vegetables.

“Natutunan ko din dito kung paano gawing mas masustansya ang mga niluluto kong pagkain sa aming bahay,” Estrada shared, adding that the knowledge she gained from the program helped improve the overall nutrition of her house-

hold. Parents like Estrada actively supported the program by volunteering in food preparation throughout the feeding period. Through hands-on participation, they gained practical skills in proper food handling, meal planning, cooking, and basic nutrition, enabling them to sustain healthy practices beyond the program’s duration. In CALABARZON, the SFP was implemented through a fund transfer scheme to local government units (LGUs). Local social welfare and development offices oversaw the procurement of supplies, conduct of feeding sessions, monitoring of



Over 116,000 Calabarzon children benefit from DSWD supplementary feeding program

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has provided critical nutrition support to more than 116,000 children in the CALABARZON Region through its Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP), reinforcing government efforts to address malnutri-

tion during early childhood.

In 2025, a total of 116,809 children enrolled in child development centers across 121 cities and municipalities benefited from the program, receiving P350.43 million worth of meals and nutrition interventions designed to improve and maintain healthy growth. Prior

to implementation, around 9,000 children were identified as nutritionally at risk, including those classified as stunted, wasted, overweight, or obese.

As of December 31, 2025, 73,077 children have already completed the program's required 120-day feeding cycle, while the re-

maining beneficiaries are expected to finish within the first quarter of 2026.

Among the five provinces, Laguna recorded the highest number of beneficiaries with 28,599 children, followed closely by Cavite with 28,102. Batangas served 23,396 children, Rizal reached 18,817,

and Quezon accounted for 17,895, underscoring the wide coverage of the SFP across the region.

Jennylyn Rapiso, a National Child Development Center (NCDC) Teacher in Victoria, Laguna, shared that feeding sessions typically consist of hot meals with rice and viand, comple-

mented by nutritious snacks such as nutribun paired with milk. These meals are prepared to be age-appropriate and nutritionally balanced,
