# No domestic flights yet for 1st week of June: CAB

In a text message to the Philippine News Agency (PNA), Samodio confirmed that as of posting, no domestic flight has been approved

yet saying these need to wait for clearance from the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF).

In an advisory dated May 30, CAB said the IATF "has yet to approve the routes for domestic air services proposed by airlines for the resumption of domestic operations in the first week of June."

The Q-passholder could purchase any one of the following per day: one (1) liter of hard drinks (18 proof and above) including but not limited to Emperador, Alfonso, Ginebra, and any other 'hard drinks'; two (2) liters of drinks (12 - 17 proof) that include wines, shoktong, and other champagne; a total of two (2) liters

# 6 more COVID-19 cases reported Bacoor, Cavite

IMUS CITY, Cavite The city government of Bacoor reported six new coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) positive cases, which brought the total case number in its jurisdiction to

The authorities reported that of the 114 cases involving resident-patients, 58 or more than half of the total, have recovered. One death, involving an elderly woman, was

also reported lately in the city.

Bacoor, a city at the boundary of Metro Manila's south, has the highest incidence of COVID-19 in Cavite province, followed by the neighboring cities of Dasmariñas with 50 positive cases, Imus, the capital, also with 50, and General Trias with 23.

In its latest update report, the Bacoor government confirmed that the city has 114 total cases, with 58 recoveries

and 11 deaths, and 45 in active status. Bacoor, Cavite's second most populated city after Dasmariñas, has 73 barangays (vil-

In a text message, Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla said that the case number surge was observed following the results of the Department of Health-Polymerase Chain Reaction (DOH-PCR) tests that had been conducted earlier

# GATCHALIAN: SCHOOL OPENING SHOULD BE RISK-BASED

With the start of the enrollment period and the transition to General Community Quarantine (GCQ) and Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ), Senator Win Gatchalian emphasized that class opening should be guided by a risk-based approach to address safety and health concerns for students, teachers, parents, and other school personnel to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the community.

The Chairman of the Senate Committee on Basic Education, Arts and Culture underscored that even in provinces where there are zero cases of COVID-19 and physical classes might be allowed, minimum health standards such as bans on mass gatherings should be observed.

The Department of

Education (DepEd) has clarified that learners will not necessarily attend physical or face-to-face classes when school year 2020-2021 starts. DepEd's Learning Continuity Plan (LCP) in fact identifies alternative modalities for learning delivery including online learning. For those who have no gadgets or access to the internet, television and radio-based instruction, and the use of printed packets are tapped.

"What we want is for the government to innovate. Kailangang alalahanin natin na layon ng pagpapatuloy ng edukasyon ay ang pag-angat natin sa kinabukasan ng ating mga kabataan, lalo na para sa mga nangangailangang magaaral," said Gatchalian.

# PhilHealth sets new benefit package for COVID-19 testing

The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) announced the new rate of its benefit package for COVID-19 testing. The adjustment resulted from its continuing consultation with stakeholders and infectious disease experts, increased availability and affordability of testing kits in the market, and increased number of qualified facilities to do SARS-CoV-2 testing.

As approved by the PhilHealth Board of Directors, the new rates are as follows:

Condition for payment Amount

All services for testing are procured and provided by the testing laboratory Php 3409

Test kits are donated to the testing laboratory 
Php 2077

Test kits are donated to the testing laboratory; cost of running the laboratory and RT-PCR machine for testing is included in the facility budget. Php 901

PhilHealth clarified that the package is for costs attributable to services related to testing such as clinical assessment, specimen collection, specimen transport and materials such as PPEs and test kits.

A Circular on pertinent guidelines and date of effectivity will be issued soon. END

# **FOREIGN NEWS:**Global coronavirus cases exceed 6M mark

ANKARA – The total number of global confirmed coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) cases surpassed 6 million late on Saturday, according to a running tally by the US-based Johns Hopkins University.

The university's data showed that the worldwide tally of fatalities had reached 367,356, while the number of recoveries topped 2.53 million.

The US remains the worst-hit country by the virus with over 1.76 million infection cases, while the death toll in the country exceeded 103,600.

Brazil, which has the largest number of Covid-19 cases and deaths in Latin America, is the second country with the highest number of cases with more than 465,100, followed by Russia with around 397,000 and the UK with over 274,200 cases.

Several European countries are also among the hardest hit in the world.  $\,$ 

China, the ground zero of the virus, has registered 84,127 cases so far, including 79,384 recoveries. The country's death toll stands at 4,638. Barely changing figures continue to raise questions in and outside China.

Overall, the virus has spread to 188 countries since it first emerged last December.

Despite the rising number of cases, most who contract the virus suffer mild symptoms before making a recovery. (Anadolu)/sourcePNA

STEP 2. Wait for the reply and register with your

full name. (Example: Juan de la Cruz)

STEP 3. Reply with TULOY (Continue) if you want to continue to finish the program or reply with WAK-AS (END) if you want to stop.

STEP 4. Chart a date on when you want to stop smoking.

STEP 5. You are now a part of the program. Everyday, you will receive a message and reminder fro DOH. This will help you intensify your will to stop smoking.

STEP 6. Just answer the message you will receive if it requires an answer based on your true status. Don't worry, every message you will send is free and does not require payment.

So there you go folks, just follow the six easy step to stop smoking.

# Revilla urges Gov't: 'Speed up' resumption of public works, priority projects to pump-prime economy

Capital Region (NCR) transitions to, and joins the majority of the country under General Community Quarantine (GCQ) beginning June 1, Senator Ramon Bong Revilla, Jr. urged the government to immediately resume and fast track its public works and other projects. When an Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) was implemented in Luzon and other parts of the country beginning March 15, all public works were temporarily suspended.

The veteran legislator stated that resuming public works will help jumpstart the local economy after a three-month lockdown. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the government originally planned to allocate 1 trillion pesos for various infrastructure projects to realize its vision of ushering the "Golden Age of Infrastructure."

He also pointed out that since local government units have already utilized their 20 percent local development fund addressing COVID-19, only the national government has the capacity to spend for public works.

"Noon pong i-release ng DILG ang kanilang Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1 s. 2020, agad pong tumalima ang ating mga LGU sa paggamit ng kanilang local development fund para sa procurement ng personal protective equipment, disinfectant tents, COVID-19 testing kits, hospital equipment at supplies."

"Pati pagkain, transportasyon at matutuluyan ng medical personnel at iba pang frontliners, sinagot lahat ng LGU's at dahil sa haba ng lockdown, pasaid na rin po sila," he explained.


"Ang national government na lang ang may kakayahan magpatupad ng public works. The infusion of capital and jobs to be generated by these projects will be a much needed boost to the economy. It will start the gears moving, so to speak," he said.

"Kaya kailangan na talagang apurahin ng gobyerno para ibangon ang nakapako nating ekonomiya," Revilla added.

He also pointed out that two weeks have already passed since the Inter-Agency Task Force on the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) released Resolution No. 34 which provides the Construction Safety Guidelines for the Implementation of Infrastructure Projects during the COVID-19 pandemic, but construction has not yet resumed.

"There is no perfect time to resume public works but now. As we embrace the so-called "New Normal" way of life, we need to get back on track with due haste to avoid undue delays," Revilla added.

# GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW ON MINIMUM HEALTH PROTOCOLS FOR BARBERSHOPS & SALONS

# The following minimum health standards shall be implemented in all barbershops and salons:

A. Posting of information at the entrance and other prominent or conspicuous areas about the following:

Mandatory wearing of face masks at all times;

- \*Social distancing protocols of the establishment;
- \*Regular sanitation schedule and procedures (a 10-minute interval for sanitation in between clients is required);
- \*Availability of alternative methods of payment, if applicable;
- \*Availability of alternative methods of scheduling appointments (e.g., online, textmessaging system):
- \*Client-personnel interaction protocols;
- \*Policy against the bringing of companions, unless absolutely necessary; and
- \*Enforcement measures for clients who refuse to comply with the protocols in a manner consistent with the law.
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{B}}.$  Requiring the placing of the following at the entrance:
- \*Floor mat or foot bath with disinfectant
- \*Thermal scanner (i.e., for temperature reading)
- \* Alcohol that can be easily sprayed on the clients' hands
- \*Health checklist to be distributed to all clients
- \*A system where the personal effects of clients, including bags, jackets, and gadgets, are disinfected and deposited in secured sanitary plastic bags
- \*Face shields to be distributed to clients if they availed shampoo services
- C. Enforcement of the following protocols concerning equipment found in the workplace:
- \* Distancing of chairs to at least one (1) meter apart on all sides;
- \*Visible floor markings for guidance of clients;
- \*Proper ventilation;
- \*Personal effects of personnel should be placed in plastic bags stored in an area inaccessible to clients;
- \*Face masks readily available for sale, or otherwise, to clients;
- \*Sanitizing equipment and tools that are visible to clients;
- \* Sterilization of workstation before and after each service;

- \*Pieces of furniture that are made of porous materials must be covered in plastic for ease of sanitation; and
- \*Strict use of disposable-only menus, reading materials, and magazines.
- D. Enforcement of the following protocols concerning employees in the workplace:
- \*No personnel with COVID-19 symptoms or with exposure to COVID-19 patients shall be allowed to work;
- No wearing of pieces of jewelry (e.g., rings, bracelets, watches, earrings, exposed body piercings);
- \* Observance of proper personal hygiene (e.g., clipped fingernails, observance of company-imposed personal sanitation);
- \*Mandatory wearing of personal protective equipment (PPE) including, but not limited to:
- \*Face mask
- \* Face shield
- \*Eye glasses
- \* Gloves
- \*Hair caps
- \*Mandatory wearing of closed shoes;
- \* Observance of the proper disposal of single-use supplies (e.g., cotton balls, popsicle sticks, tissue);
- \*Observance and enforcement of the client-personnel interaction protocols;
- \* Mandatory declaration of health and whereabouts prior to every duty in case contact tracing becomes necessary; and
- \*Frequent handwashing/sanitizing.
- E. Requiring the following procedures upon exit:
- \*No physical contact during payment
- \* Personnel are provided with small trays for accepting cash; and
- \* Ensure that clients who prefer to use an alternative mode of payment are able to do so.
- \*Regular sanitation of high-contact areas and surfaces (e.g., pens used for filling out forms, door handles, common tables)

NOTE: Barbershops/Salons need to comply before they will be allowed to operate again. This will be the new normal. Please wait for further announcements on the date of reopening.

# Gov't cites infra projects for completion in 2020, 2021

MANILA – Presidential Adviser for Flagship Programs and Projects Vivencio Dizon said the government would deliver infrastructure projects under the "Build, Build, Build" program, which are targeted for completion in 2020 and 2021 despite the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) crisis.

During an online forum of the Financial Executives Institute of the Philippines on Thursday, Dizon said these projects would help the country recover from the impact of Covid-19.

"The 'Build, Build, Build', or (the) unprecedented infrastructure program under the Duterte administration, is one of the key interventions that the government must do and must do swiftly in order to help us get out (of) the mess that has been brought about by Covid-19," he said.

For this year, the government targets to complete the Metro Manila Skyway Stage 3, now 76-percent complete and is expected to be delivered by December; the Harbor Link that connects the North Luzon Expressway to North Harbor, estimated to be completed by the end of the year; the Clark International Airport, now 93-percent complete and is targeted to be delivered by July; the Light Rail Transit Line 2 (LRT-2) East Extension, which was 71-percent complete in October 2019 and is expected to be completed this year; and the Bonifacio Global City - Ortigas Center Link Road, which is 45-percent complete and will be delivered by December 2020 or early 2021.

Dizon, who is also president and chief executive officer of the Bases Conversion and Development Authority (BCDA), said the construction of two new bridges across Pasig River would be completed by 2021.

These include the Estrella-Pantaleon Bridge and Binondo-Intramuros Bridge, which are scheduled for completion by February 2021, he said.

"By 2021, we are also going to complete two bridges across the Pasig. So there will be a total of three new bridges across the Pasig. This is the most number of bridges we did within one administration across the Pasig River and we are even envisioning to start five more bridges through an ODA (official development assistance) from China," he added.

Dizon further said the government would push through with its rail projects, such as the LRT-1 Cavite Extension and Metro Rail Transit Line 7 (MRT-7), which will be partially operational by 2021; the MRT-3 Rehabilitation Program to be completed by July 2021; and the Philippine National Railways (PNR) Phase 1 connecting Tutuban, Manila to Malolos, Bulacan, which is targeted to be completed by the fourth quarter of 2021.

On the other hand, the government moved the target completion of the Bicol International Airport from July to next year, he said.

Dizon added that the administration would also pursue big-ticket legacy projects, including the North-South Commuter Rail connecting Clark and Calamba, as well as the Metro Manila Subway.

### CITY AND MUNICIPAL TOURISM OFFICERS EXTEND ASSISTANCE TO CAVITE LSIs:

The Provincial Government of Cavite through the Provincial Tourism and Cultural Affairs Office remains steadfast in aiding the needs of locally stranded individuals (LSIs) in various regions due to the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) crisis. Another batch of LSIs boarded the domestic sweeper bus from Baguio City on May 29, 2020 and from Ilocos on May 31, 2020. The said buses catered a total of eight (8) Caviteños residing in the municipality of Alfonso, Noveleta, Maragondon and Cavite City. Meanwhile, respective city and municipal tourism officers extended all necessary assistance and arranged shuttle services. The Cavite Local Government continuously coordinates with the Department of Tourism and other national agencies to ensure that safety measures are strictly observed when transporting returning residents.



# Provide transpo solution for employees: DTI chief to firms

MANILA – Trade Secretary Ramon Lopez has urged companies to provide shuttle services for their employees as more workers are expected to report to their workplace due to the easing of quarantine restrictions starting June 1.

In an interview with CNN Philippines on Friday, Lopez said companies' shuttle services would help "unload the problem of the public transport."

Under general community quarantine (GCQ), the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) has allowed the full operation of businesses except for a few industries, particularly in entertainment, as well as travel and leisure.

However, commuting would be a challenge for the workforce as operations of public transport are limited to observe minimum health protocols, such as physical distancing.

Lopez noted that it would be in the company's favor to provide its employees with shuttle services as this would ensure the safety of the workers and easier contact tracing.

He also encouraged companies to house

their employees in nearby accommodation facilities.

"Employers would want their workers to go to work, especially if it's (the) operation type of work. For administrative jobs, they can do (the) work-fromhome (scheme)," Lopez said.

Even under the "new normal", he said, companies would implement alternative work arrangements, such as work from home, compressed work week, and skeleton workforce.

Meanwhile, as more individuals are looking into the use of bicycles in going to work due to limited public transportation, Lopez said the DTI would consider imposing price control on bikes now that sales are increasing. (PNA)

A local health department source elaborated that the latest positive case number was an offshoot of the tests that have been released after a delay of more than three weeks. "Lumalabas na results ng mga positive test. Na-delay ito for more than three weeks, ngayon konti-konti na lumalabas," the source said. (The results of the positive tests are coming out. These (the results) were delayed for more than three weeks, it is gradually coming out.)

The authorities identified the latest six new cases in Bacoor as of Wednesday, May 26, as Patients #109: a 41-yearold man from Barangay Ligas II, #110: a woman, aged 44, from Molino IV, #111: a 24-year-old man from Queens Row West, #112: a 29-yearold woman from Molino III, #113: also a woman, aged 30, from Molino VI, and #114: a 75-year-old resident from Molino IV who already expired.

It was also reported that of the 45 active cases involving resident-patients, 31 were admitted to hospitals—11

and the background of those in Metro Manila, one in Laguna and 19 in Cavite-and that six were on home quarantine, four in quarantine facility and four in step-down facility.

The Bacoor COVID-19 tracker bulletin report showed that Molino III has the most number of positive cases with 21 (11 recoveries) and Molino IV with 15 (eight recoveries and two

Molino III, which was placed under lockdown for two weeks last month, is the most populated area among the city's 73 barangays.

There were reports of positive cases in 32 barangays. The case number listing can be viewed in the Facebook page of the City Government of Bacoor. Bacoor was the lone area in Cavite that was placed under the modified enhanced community quarantine (MECQ) as the province's cities and municipalities have been on general community quarantine (GCQ) from May

The local government had requested on May 15 that Bacoor be under MECQ due to the observed increasing COVID-19 cases in the area.

On Saturday night, budget carrier Cebu Pacific (CEB) announced offering limited number of domestic passenger flights set for June 2-4.

It also announced that it would provide updates on flight schedules for June 5 and onwards.

All CEB international flights would remain suspended until June 30, the carrier added.

AirAsia Philippines on Sunday announced a schedule of several domestic flights beginning June 3, citing its plan to resume services in key domestic routes by June 3, and gradually including international routes by July 1.

# Revised operational policies for all Cavite malls laid out

TRECE MARTIES CITY, Cavite (PIA) -- Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla announced the revisions for the operational guidelines for all mall establishments in the province.

He stated the policy for the Quarantine passholders and frontliners still remains in effect which means that malls would cater to their locals only.

An exception to this rule is reserved for transactions with the banks, dentists and other government services which would require the customer to first secure a Travel Pass from their respective LGUs.

Mall operations will start an hour early from 9am - 5pm while the grocery stores, banks, and drugstores within the mall establishments will open at 8am.

Likewise, a half hour extension for the time allowed to customers inside the mall was granted giving enough time of one and a half hours to select and purchase the products needed.

The malls could set a higher air cooling temperature of 25 degrees and music over the PA system could now be played and heard inside the mall, making it a little more relaxing for the customers.

"All these policies are subject to change once we transition to the Modified GCQ next week," the Governor said.

He also stated, "I have requested the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for the consideration of the validity of the Q-pass system in the province to remain in effect," (Ruel Francisco, PIA-Cavite with report from the official FB page announcement of Gov. Ionvic Remulla)

# DepEd, handa na sa remote enrollment simula June 1

Bilang pagtitiyak sa kaligtasan ng mga mag-aaral at guro, handa nang isagawa ng Kagawaran ng Edukasyon ang remote enrollment na magbubukas sa Lunes, Hunyo 1, 2020.

Ngayong taon, hindi kinakailangang pisikal na magtungo ang mga magulang at mag-aaral sa paaralan para sa enrollment upang patuloy na mapairal ang physical distancing at health standards ng Department of Health (DOH) at Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF).

Sa halip, ang mga magulang ng mga papasok na Grade 1 to 12 learners ay kokontakin ng kanilang adviser mula sa nagdaang taon para sa remote enrollment. Bago pa man ang June 1, nakapagsagawa na rin ang DepEd ng apat na national orientation upang ipaunawa sa mga magulang, kaguruan at mga opisyal ng kagawaran sa ibat ibang antas ang alituntunin sa isang buwang enrollment period. Nag labas na rin ang kagawaran ng mga FAQs upang mabilis na maunawaan ang mga katanungan ukol sa enrollment guidelines.

Kasabay ng unang araw ng remote enrolment, isasagawa rin ng DepEd ang virtual launch ng 2020 Brigada Eskwela (BE) at Oplan Balik Eskwela (OBE) upang tumulong
