DILG recognizes nine best LGU community-based rehab practices

Proving that grassroots recovery program for illegal drugs victims work, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) recognized nine (9) best practices of local government units (LGUs) under the Community-Based Drug Rehabilitation and Reintegration Program (CBDRP).

DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año said that despite the COVID-19 pandemic, the national government is committed to the rehabilitation of drug users in the community level as part of its anti-illegal drugs program. He said that the nine best CBDRP practices were evidences that community level rehabilitation works as it gives drug users a chance to

change for the better.

CALABARZON AFP mobile kitchen rolls out in Rizal

TAYTAY, Rizal, PIA – Personalities from various organizations, including the Armed Forces of the Philippines, prepared hot meals as part of the feeding program for the victims of the recent typhoons.

Together with Hands Off Our Children, the Armed Forces of the Philippines – 7th Civil Relations Group led by their commander, Maj. Celeste Frank Sayson, Miss Philippines 2020 first runner-up Bella Ysmal and actress Kris Bernal, the AFP Mobile Kitchen has officially rolled out in Sitio Tapayan Elementary School, Lupang Arenda in Brgy. Sta. Ana.

Previously deployed during the Marawi siege to sustain government troops, the AFP Mobile Kitchen was stationed right after the onslaught typhoon Ulyses.

Designed to cook for 1,500 individuals per meal, the Mobile Kitchen

currently stationed in Taytay is furnished with state of the art cooking technology that can supply hot meals to the recuperating communities who suffered due to the two typhoons.

“Bilang isa sa mga adbokasiya ng Armed Forces of the Philippines, dito sa paglulunsad ng AFP Mobile Kitchen gumagana ang whole of nation approach dahil bukod sa pamahalaan sa pangunguna ng AFP, nandito rin ang pribadong sektor,” said Sayson.

The AFP has also called for optimism and unity as the nation recovers from the aftermath of the recent disaster.

POE: WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS AT THE HEART OF POST-PANDEMIC RECOVERY

Resilient, strategic thinkers and persevering, women entrepreneurs are paving the way in the country's economic recovery following a slowdown due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Sen. Grace Poe said.

Despite the fracturing impact of the pandemic, Poe said there is clear optimism and rapid responsiveness among women entrepreneurs to turn the challenges into opportunities not only for the survival of the family, but for business growth.

"2020 will be a year of great significance. It marks the year wherein we experienced one of the worse global pandemics that resulted in both health and economic up-

heavals," she said in a speech at the GO Negosyo Women Conference 2020 and 15th founding anniversary.

"But 2020 also marks the year when Filipino women entrepreneurs displayed resilience, strategic thinking and the ability to adapt," Poe stressed.

According to Poe, COVID-19 has had disproportionate impact on women who lost jobs and livelihood, especially those who work in the hardest-hit sectors.

But quick to adapt, many women, for instance, went online to sell innovative products such as baked goods, plant accessories, and designer face masks.

Coverage of Hemodialysis in excess of 90 sessions

The PhilHealth Board of Directors has approved on November 11, 2020 the continuing coverage of hemodialysis sessions beyond the 90-session limit to a maximum of 144 sessions which can be availed of until December 31, 2020.

PhilHealth will immediately issue the guidelines for the special package through a Circular. For the meantime, it is directing all its regional offices and concerned healthcare facilities to continue honoring all availments beyond the 90-session limit as duly prescribed by a licensed physician.

Patients who have paid for their hemodialysis sessions are requested to file their claims with the nearest PhilHealth office.

DA launches CFSMFFP in CALABARZON

TAYABAS CITY, QUEZON, (PIA) --Department of Agriculture (DA), in partnership with the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP), launched the Cash and Food Subsidy for Marginal Farmers and Fishers Program (CFSMFFP) in Brgy. Mayuwi, Tayabas City, Quezon on November 23, 2020.

Secretary William D. Dar led the event along with DBP President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Mr. Emmanuel G. Herbosa, DA CALABARZON Regional Director Arnel V. de Mesa, Quezon Provincial Governor Danilo E. Suarez, 1st District of Quezon Representative Cong. Wilfredo Mark M. Enverga, and 4th District of Quezon Representative Cong. Angelina "Dok Helen" DL. Tan.

According to Dir. de Mesa, more than 81,000 farmers and fishers in CALABARZON are set to benefit from the CFSMFFP.

DA-Field Operations Service Director, Engr. Roy M. Abaya, explained that in order for the beneficiaries to claim this

assistance from DA, they must present their transaction code to any MLhuillier branch and their voucher code to any DA-recognized supplier together with one government-issued ID or barangay certificate. Engr. Abaya also noted that farmers and fishers must be listed in the Registry System for Basic Sectors in Agriculture to qualify for this program.

Engr. Abaya said the CFSMFFP is part of the Bayanihan to Recover as One Act 2 by the national government which aims to give assistance to 890,794 corn, coconut, and sugarcane farmers; fishers; and indigenous people in the Philippines. Mr. Abaya noted the said subsidy per eligible farmer and fisher includes P3,000 cash and P2,000 worth of rice, eggs, and chicken.

In his speech, Secretary Dar proudly acknowledged the hard work and commitment of farmers and fishers in CALABARZON for their outstanding contribution to the Philippine economy.

"Our farmers and fishers are the greatest heroes of today and you deserve a big round of applause. Despite the pandemic, you continuously work hard and it eventually paid off. The agriculture sector is the only sector in the Philippines to pose a positive growth of 1.6 percent in the second quarter followed by another 1.2 percent increase in the third quarter (this year), making the sector one of the strongest pillars of our country's economy. With this growth, we are requesting additional budget to be used for programs and projects by DA, like the CFSMFFP, that will significantly help the farmers and fishers improve their production in order for us to achieve a food-secure Philippines," Sec. Dar said.

DBP president and CEO Herbosa said he is grateful for being part of the noteworthy and timely advocacy of DA as the disbursement and settlement bank for the CFSMFFP and other programs and projects of the Department. According to Mr. Herbosa, the DBP believes that

the agriculture sector is the key for the Philippine economy to get back on track amidst all the adversities brought by the recent typhoons and the current pandemic.

"Makakaasa po kayo na hindi namin sasayangin ang pagkakataon at aming pagbubutihin ang paglilingkod sa inyong lahat. Sa pagkakataon pong ito, kabalikat po ng DBP ang Kagawaran ng Pagsasaka sa pagpatupad ng mga hanangarin sa ilalim ng CFSMFFP at iba pang programa ng DA upang mabigyan ng karampatang suportang pinansyal ang ating mga masipag na magsasaka at mangangisda," Mr. Herbosa said.

Governor Suarez said this launching of the CFSMFFP is a celebration of honoring the farmers and fishers of Quezon.

"Concentrate on where you are good at because the local government and the national government always got your back in providing support to achieve higher production yield and income. Together with DA, we are always here to help improve the lives of our farmers and fishers in Quezon," Mr. Suarez said.

Meanwhile, Cong. Enverga honored all the farmers and fishers who attended the ceremonial launching of the CFSMFFP. He thanked all the participants who spent hours on



the road just to be part of the said event.

"Kayo po ang tunay na mga bida sa programang ito sapagkat kayo ang mga nagsisikap at nagtitiyaga sa kabila ng nararanasan nating pandemya upang magarantiya na may pagkain sa bawat hapag-kainan ng bawat Pilipino. Mahaba pa ang ating tatahaking daan tungo sa mas maunlad na sektor ng agrikultura ngunit naniniwala po ako na tayo ay nasa tamang landas tungo sa mas masaganang ani at mas mataas na kita para sa ating mga magsasaka at mangangisda," Cong. Enverga said.

Cong. Tan expressed her gratitude for the DA's continued support for Quezon farmers and fishers, especially for those whose livelihoods were severely damaged by the recent typhoons that hit the province.

"Siksik, liglig, at umaapaw ang mga tulong at programa ng DA katuwang ang iba pang ahensya ng gobyerno upang masiguro na walang sinuman ang maiiwang nakalugmok, at matiyak na ang lahat ay sama-samang babangon tungo sa mas maunlad na sektor ng agrikultura sa Quezon. Sana po ay hindi rito matapos ang biyayang ipinagkaloob ninyo sa ating mga magsasaka at mangangisda. Kaisa po ninyo ang bawat representante sa bawat distrito ng Quezon upang kayo ay makabangon matapos ang delubiyong dulot ng mga nagdaang bagyo," Cong. Tan said.

Ms. Remedios Ella, a member of the Corn Growers' Association of Tayabas City, expressed her utmost gratitude for the cash and food assistance that they received from DA.

"Lubos po ang aking pasasalamat sa DA sa handog po nilang tulong para sa aming mga magsasaka. Wala po kami ng halos kinita nang magsimula ang pandemya at labis naman po kami nang napektuhan ng mga nagdaang bagyo kung kaya't napakalaki po ang maitutulong sa amin ng cash and food subsidy na ito mula sa DA," Ms. Ella said.

In conjunction with the CFSMFFP, the Philippine Center for Postharvest Development and Mechanization conducted a ceremonial turnover of farm machinery under the Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund for Quezon farmers worth P304 million.

Subsequently, DA-Agricultural Credit Policy Council conducted a turnover and release of loan assistance to qualified beneficiaries in the province.

Aside from the regional office, DA-attached agencies including the Sugar Regulatory Administration, the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources, the Philippine Coconut Authority, and the National Commission on Indigenous People also took part in the said program. (PIA-4A/DA-RFO IVA, RAFIS)

"I believe that entrepreneurs will be extremely vital in the post-COVID recovery of our communities. Their qualities and skills of turning challenges into opportunities, and of using limited resources creatively, will be the key to providing new jobs and generating income," Poe said.

The senator lauded GO Negosyo for unceasingly supporting women find livelihood and discover their niche, especially amid difficult times. She said she will

continue to push for legislation in the Senate that will impact on the welfare of women and tap their growth potential.

Poe is one of the authors of Bayanihan to Recover as One Act or Bayanihan 2, which provides for P39.47 billion for loans, especially to small enterprises. The law also directs all banks and financing companies to grant a moratorium on loan payments; a reprieve for utility bills; and a grace period for residential

and commercial rents. Poe also introduced amendments to promote digital connectivity.

"As we all know, better internet accessibility will improve e-commerce, e-government services, online health, and online education," she said.

"We believe women are brave enough to seize the opportunity and hurdle the challenges in building back better after the pandemic," Poe emphasized.

affected by lack of water supply

According to Maynilad, its consumers will lose water supply in some parts of Imus, Cavite from December 1 to 15.
According to the 24 Hours report, among those severely affected by the lack of water supply are businesses and households in the city that have not accumulated enough water for days.

"I hope Maynilad of water will deliver," Randy said a consumer. According to him, they don't know that their place is with the affected.

Still based on such report, 54 barangays in Imus are affected by lack of water supply due to high demad in PAGCOR pumping station.

Be a water pumping station in such a place that supposedly works overnight to pick up empty gallons in the morning and refill at night if there is water.

Aside from Imus City, there is also a water interruption that will take place in nearby city areas such as Bacoor, Las Pinas, Paranaque, Muntinlupa and Pasay City.

Norte; and Malaybalay City, Bukidnon.

He said that among the 36 entries from various LGUs nationwide, the DILG, through the Philippine Anti-Illegal Drugs Strategy Project Management Office, chose nine best practices "that demonstrate ideal CBDP implementation". Entries of LGUs were screened on the existence of a CBDRP; at least 80% of those enrolled graduate from the program; and if the LGU introduced "safe interventions" during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Ang tagumpay ng programang ito ay tagumpay din ng mga pamilyang Pilipino na nagiging biktima ng iligal na droga," he shared.

The DILG Chief also mentioned that the said CBDRP best practices are solid testaments that the government is serious in the rehabilitation aspect.

"Tuloy-tuloy ang pagtatrabaho natin sa baba (community level) para i-rehabilitate ang mga kababayan nating naging biktima ng droga para eventually ay makapagbago-ng-buhay sila at maging produktibong kasapi ng lipunan," he explained.

Stories of Change through CBDRP

According to Año, the victory of these community rehab facilities can encourage not just other LGUs to follow suit but illegal drugs victims as well to commit in rehabilitation and reintegration as major steps in getting their lives back.

He said that the recognized CBDRP entries have been instrumental in changing people's lives. SIPAG or Simula ng Pagbabago Program of Magallanes, Cavite has been conducting 12-week programs addressing the physiological, relational, spiritual and emotional issues of drug dependents.

tal, climate change adaptation and mitigation measures.

Also, the chamber's Committee on Disaster Resilience has adopted HR 535 expressing the sense of the legislative body that there is a disaster climate emergency requiring a "whole-of-government, whole-of-society and whole-of-nation policy response to anticipate, halt, reduce, reverse, address and adopt to its impacts, consequences and causes."

Velasco said the declaration of a climate emergency would amplify the country's demand for climate justice from developed nations and help achieve its goals under the landmark Paris Agreement on Climate Change.

The Paris Agreement calls all signatory countries to

submit stronger climate targets, known as Nationally Determined Contributions or NDCs, every five years. The NDCs state what each country will do at a national level to reduce emissions, enhance their resilience to climate change threats, and help finance climate action.

So far, over three quarters of the world's countries have formally committed to strengthen their NDCs by the year-end. However, only 17 countries have actually submitted their NDCs to the United Nations and only 13 of those NDCs contained improved climate targets. The Philippines is currently working to submit a revised NDC.

At the recently concluded virtual conference of lawmakers from 48-member-na-

tion Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF), Velasco said the country's NDC will show "the world our resolve to pursue low carbon development, as well as the support we need from developed countries in terms of climate finance, capacity building and technology transfer in the context of climate justice and in accordance with the Paris Agreement."

Velasco, along with Senate President Vicente "Tito" Sotto III, Deputy Speaker Loren Legarda and House Committee on Climate Change Chair Edgar Chatto, represented the Philippines in the CVF conference.

During the forum, the Speaker said there is a need for the country to set enabling policies that will accelerate its transition to low carbon and

climate-resilient economies notwithstanding the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We need to address gaps in climate action and the implementation of our climate change laws and policies," Velasco said.

He also emphasized the need for other nations to support the Philippines in its fight against climate change.

"We are your people, our local emergencies are your global emergencies," Velasco told forum attendees. "The increasingly violent typhoons, hurricanes and floods caused by climate change are becoming the new normal all over the world and the Philippines has been unfortunate receiving end of the worst of them."/source: House of Rep.

House Speaker Lord Allan Velasco on Sunday said he fully supports the declaration of a climate emergency to encourage swift action to combat climate change and its impacts.

According to Velasco, the declaration would compel the government, including Congress, and other stakeholders to place climate change at the center of their policy and planning decisions.

"Declaring a climate emergency means recognizing that climate crisis is the fight of our lives

and that there is an urgent need for a massive-scale mobilization to protect Filipinos and the environment from climate change and its devastating impacts," Velasco said.

The House leader noted that the Philippines has been facing climate emergency for decades now with millions of Filipinos left to suffer the catastrophic effects of extreme weather events made stronger and more deadly by climate change.

He said it is for this reason why the Philippines is considered as one of the most

disaster-prone and climate-vulnerable countries in the world.

Velasco said the massive devastation caused by recent tropical cyclones—including Super typhoon Rolly and Typhoon Ulysses which claimed 73 lives and caused the worst flooding in Metro Manila and Cagayan Valley in years—has made it imperative for the country to pursue stronger climate-adaptive and -resilient measures.

"There will be more typhoons that will come our way, and we have to become better at preparations and in

handling situations that call for sound judgment to prevent devastating death tolls and economic costs of future calamities," Velasco said.

The House of Representatives recently unanimously adopted a resolution endorsed by the Committee on Climate Change declaring a climate and environmental emergency.

House Resolution (HR) 1377 also sought to mobilize government agencies and instrumentalities, together with local government units, to effectively implement environmen-
