PhilHealth Disbursed Over P217 Billion Claims Payment

in the first 9 months 17.93 Bilyon

Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) announced its release of over P217.93 B in total benefit claims to healthcare facilities nationwide which represents a 94.18% increase compared to the same period last year (January to September).

This surge in payments solidifies PhilHealth's financial support and marks a major achievement in its drive to provide prompt and reliable financial support to Filipino patients and healthcare providers.

PhilHealth's total claims payment for the first nine months of 2025 reached P217.93 B, up from P112.23 B in 2024, both for public and private facilities.

As of September 30, 2025, PhilHealth achieved an average claims processing turnaround time of just 22 days, demonstrating remarkable improvement in efficiency and responsiveness, aligning withPresident Ferdinand R. Marcos' directive to improve its performance.

PhilHealth emphasized that the expenditure is largely driven by payments for catastrophic conditions covered by Z Benefit Packages (heart surgery, cancers and kidney transplantation) and high-cost services like outpatient hemodialysis continue

IRRI, DA, and DA-PhilRice finish strong on its first year of Drones4Rice

LOS BAÑOS, Laguna (16 October 2025) — The International Rice Research Institute (IRRI), the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), and the Department of Agriculture (DA) Regional Field Offices (RFOs) in Cagayan Valley (RFO II), CALABARZON (RFO IVA), and Bicol (RFO V) are gearing up for the second year of the Drones4Rice project, following a successful first year of laying the groundwork for scaling drone technologies in Philippine rice farming. The three-year initiative funded by the Philippine DA - Bureau of Agricultural Research (DA-BAR) aims to boost the productivity and income of smallholder Filipino rice farmers through drone-enabled precision agriculture.

During its first year, the Drones4Rice project team developed protocols for drone-based seeding, pesticide spraying, and fertilizer spreading in partnership with key government agencies such as the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP), Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB), as well as the DA – Fertilizer and Pesticides Authority (DA-FPA). These protocols were field-tested and validated across the three regions in collaboration with PhilRice and DA. They were also used to support DA's Drone Voucher Program, which provides Php 2,000 per hectare in assistance to encourage farmers to access drone

Although drone use in Philippine agriculture is still emerging, its benefits are clear: lower labor costs, faster and more precise field operations, and early detection of pests and diseases through aerial mapping. With labor accounting for nearly one-third of rice production costs, drone-based direct seeding offers economic and environmental gains-including lower emissions and reduced drudgery.

"By integrating digital tools, we are able to optimize resource management, make faster and more informed decisions, and respond to the needs of farmers more efficiently," DA Undersecretary for Rice Industry Development Christopher Morales stated in his opening remarks, "For farmers, this translates into practical benefits of more efficient input use, reduced labor costs, and improved crop management," he contin-

IRRI Project Leader Dr. Carlito Balingbing noted the importance of private sector partnerships in accelerating adoption, "Agridom and NewHope, which are drone service provider companies, assisted in the conduct of field operations and field trials." NewHope Corporation and Agridom Solutions Corp. have forged formal partnerships with IRRI in the past years to advocate for a modernized and digitalized Philippine agriculture. Once completed, Rizal Village I will stand as a testament to Calamba City's dedication to inclusive development—ensuring that as the city continues to advance, no Calambeño family is left without a place to call home.

FDA joins global campaign for safer use of medicines

MANILA – The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Thursday said the country is joining over 130 partner organizations worldwide in the 10th anniversary of #MedSafety-Week, an international campaign promoting the safe use of medicines through vigilant reporting of side effects.

Running from Nov. 3 to 9, this year's campaign carries the theme "We Can All Help Make Medicines Safer," highlighting the shared responsibility of patients, families, healthcare professionals and regulators in ensuring medicine safety.

"Every report counts. When you report suspected side effects, you are not just protecting yourself; you are helping protect others," FDA spokesperson Khay Ann

Magundayao-Borlado said in a statement.

"Through #Med-SafetyWeek, we encourage everyone to be more involved in ensuring that the medicines we take are both safe and effective," she added.

The campaign aims to raise awareness on the importance of reporting suspected side effects to help the FDA's Center for Drug Regulation and Research (CDRR) identify potential risks and take appropriate actions.

These reports play a vital role in promoting public health and improving medicine safety.

Since medicines, like all products, have risks, the FDA underscored that continuous vigilance helps ensure that medicines are safe for everyone.

It noted that only 5 to 10 percent of suspected side effects are reported globally. Common reasons for not reporting include lack of awareness, the belief that the side effect is minor, or simply forgetting to do so.

The #MedSafety-Week campaign, founded in 2016, was launched to address this gap and strengthen global pharmacovigilance.

The 2025 anniversary edition is expected to be the largest to date, with 150 organizations across 77 countries sharing the #Med-SafetyWeek message in more than 60 languages.

CDRR Product Research and Standards Development Division Chief Lanette Lee Querubin said the FDA continues to enhance pharmacovigilance in the country through improved reporting mechanisms, including the VigiMobile app and online submission via VigiFlow nationwide information drives, and partnerships with the Department of Health, Philippine Information Agency and the World Health Organization—Uppsala Monitoring Centre.

The FDA is also encouraging the public to join the conversation online by following and sharing #MedSafetyWeek posts on its official Facebook page and partner platforms.

"When we speak up, we save lives," FDA Director General Paolo Teston said. "Our vision is a nation where every Filipino becomes a partner in medicine safety. source:(PNA)
