Cavite PESO and TESDA join forces to empower jobseekers through contact center services NC II training

In a bid to create opportunities for jobseekers, the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager, in partnership with TESDA Cavite Provincial Office, has successfully concluded the Community-Based Training on Contact Center Services NC II.

The program, held from November 27 to De-

cember 20, 2024, combined 13 days of online learning with 5 days of in-person training at the Cavite Provincial Capitol compound in Trece Martires City. Participants, including displaced POGO workers, OFWs, OFW dependents, and unemployed individuals, were trained to become certified customer service profession-

Remulla: Enforce law on use of firecrackers

MANILA – Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Jonvic Remulla on Friday urged local government units (LGUs) to enforce rules and regulations on firecrackers and other pyrotechnics in their respective jurisdiction to prevent firecracker-related injuries.

In a memorandum, Remulla called on LGUs to issue ordinances and other regulations banning or discouraging individuals or households from using firecrackers as prescribed by Executive Order No. 28 series of 2017.

He also said LGUs must restrict the use of fire-

crackers only to community fireworks displays that have secured necessary permits and conduct information campaigns on the dangers of prohibited fireworks.

Remulla instructed the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) to ensure that fire exhibition safe zones are guided by the provisions of

Republic Act (RA) 9514 or the Fire Code of the Philippines.

At the same time, the DILG chief directed the Philippine National Police to conduct inspection, confiscation, and destruction of illegal fireworks and pyrotechnic devices.

The public is also discouraged from patronizing illegal or otherwise hazardous fireworks and using alternative noise-inducing items such as horns, recycled containers, pans, and other common household items.

TRICE MARTIRES CITY - Umabot na sa bilang na 4,500 ang kaso ng pertussis o whooping cough sa buong bansa ang naitala ng Department of Health (DOH) nitong nakalipas Disyembre 14, 2024. Ayon sa ulat na pinalabas ng nasabing kagawaran ang bilang ay halos anim (6) na dobleng mas mataas kaysa sa 760 kaso na naitala noong 2023. Sa pinakahuling datos, naitala ang 144 na namatay sanhi ng pertussis, na naging dahilan para tumaas ang kaso ng fatality rate sa 3.19 percent.

Ayon sa DOH, puspusan ang ginagawa nitong monitoring at pagsasagawa ng pagbabakuna o vaccination para makontrol ang pagkalat ng naturang sakit. Ang whooping cough o masasal na ubo ay isang nakakahawang bacterial re-

DA: Kadiwa ng Pangulo ‘Rice-for-All’ program depressing rice prices at metro markets

QUEZON CITY — Market rice retailers started lowering prices following the successful implementation of the Kadiwa ng Pangulo “Rice-for-All” program across Metro Manila, according to the Department of Agriculture (DA).

The Kadiwa ng Pangulo “Rice-for-All” program is an initiative launched by the DA, local dealers, importers and wholesalers, with the support of the Philippine National Police (PNP).

The program ensures the smooth distribution of affordable rice at P40 per kilo with a 25-kilogram limit per person.

The DA and other stakeholders said the program made a dent on the sta-

ple’s price.

Rice being sold by the Kadiwa and its retailers is cheaper by PhP3 to PhP5

compared with those being sold by market retailers, resulting in increased sales by rolling stores in the recent operation.

Market retailers are currently reducing their prices to keep up with the lower price offered by rolling stores, the DA reported.

So far, EDSA Balintawak Market (South-bound, Brgy. Balingasa, Quezon City) distributed 110 sacks of rice; New Marulas Public Market (Along Market Road, Brgy.

Marulas, Valenzuela City), five sacks; and Malabon Central Market (Along F. Sevilla Blvd., Brgy. Tañong, Malabon City), 32 sacks.

A total of 147 sacks of rice were distributed, based on the government report.

The Kadiwa ng Pangulo “Rice-for-All” program resumed Friday, December 27, on its seventh day, targeting more public markets in time for the celebration of New Year. (PND)/ source Pia Cavite

OCD reports widespread flooding across CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol, Eastern Visayas, and Davao Regions due to ITCZ, Shear Line, and LPAs

QUEZON CITY — Severe weather conditions continue to impact the Philippines, as the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) reports ongoing flooding in multiple regions due to the effects of the Shear Line, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), and Low-Pressure Areas (LPAs).

Since December 8, 2024, these weather systems have caused significant flooding incidents across CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, the Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, and Davao Region.

CALABARZON has been severely impacted, with ten areas in Quezon Province still experiencing flooding. A total of 88 families, comprising 367 individuals, have been affected across seven barangays. One road section in Real, Quezon, remains impassable to all vehicle types, complicating access to affected areas.

In MIMAROPA, the situation is dire, with 30 areas flooded in Oriental Mindoro and Palawan. Approximately 10,021 families (48,598 persons) have been affected, with 174 families (702 indi-

viduals) currently staying in eight evacuation centers. Infrastructure damage includes five impassable road sections and one bridge. Fortunately, all seaports have resumed operations, and no stranded passengers have been reported. However, one infrastructure has been reported as totally damaged. The Municipality of Baco, Oriental Mindoro, has declared a state of calamity through Resolution No. 290 – 2024, enabling expedited access to emergency assistance. Authorities have provided Php 1,779,800 in food and family packs to support the affected families.

In Region V, which includes parts of Camarines Sur, 33 areas are flooded across ten cities and municipalities, affecting 154 families (678 persons). These individuals are currently housed in ten evacuation centers, while 20 road sections remain impassable.

Eastern Visayas has also been significantly affected, with 52,949 families (199,364 persons) impacted. The OCD reports one fatality due to drowning in Borongan City (pending verification).

Damage assessments show that 18 houses have been affected—seven partially and eleven totally. Immediate needs include food packs in Northern and Eastern Samar and Doxycycline in Catarman, Northern Samar. The Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) VIII is actively conducting clearing operations following reported landslides.

In Davao Region, flooding has been reported in Davao del Sur and Davao Occidental. The Mana Bridge in Malita is currently impassable to all vehicle types, and power interruptions have been noted in Jose Abad Santos, Davao Occidental.

The OCD is actively monitoring the situation and coordinating with local disaster response teams to provide timely assistance to affected communities. As the nation copes with these adverse weather conditions, efforts are focused on ensuring the safety and well-being of

those impacted.

Residents are urged to stay connected with local authorities and the OCD for real-time updates and assistance. (OCD)

Pag-IBIG Fund promotes special housing loan

DAVAO CITY (PIA) – The Pag-IBIG Fund has promoted a special loan program called Pag-IBIG HEAL or Home Equity Appreciation Loan that allows borrowers of good standing with an opportunity to borrow based on the appraised value of the property they mortgage with Pag-IBIG Fund.

Atty. Marie Antoniette D. Diaz, Pag-IBIG Fund senior vice president of the Member Services Operations Sector, mentioned this during their guesting in the Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas of the Philippine Information Agency Region XI in Davao City.

According to Pag-IBIG Fund website, this loan is based on the net value of the mortgaged property, which can be used to fund

other needs of the borrowers. The existing borrowers may apply for a loan at very low interest rates and under borrower-friendly terms, payable up to 30 years.

This is exclusively offered to Pag-IBIG housing loan borrowers who have maintained the good standing of their accounts by paying their monthly amortizations on time.

“If you are a good Pag-IBIG housing loan borrower, please contact us or view our website for more information on this program,” Diaz said in her presentation of accomplishments during the Kapihan.

Meanwhile, the Pag-IBIG Fund official has also urged qualified members to avail of the Socialized Housing Loan.

The qualified borrowers are members from the low-income or minimum-wage sectors. Under this program, the qualified borrowers enjoy a subsidized interest rate of three percent per

annum for home loans of up to P580,000 for socialized subdivision projects, and up to P750,000 for socialized condominium projects, applicable for the first five years of the loan.

Diaz said “this subsidy enables our borrowers to allocate the savings from reduced amortization payments toward other necessities related to their relocation, occupancy, or construction of their new homes.” (CLC/PIA Davao)


