SENATE CORNER

Free Covid-19 testing  
for all Filipinos

Senate President Vicente C. Sotto III, during the continuation of the Blue Ribbon Committee investigation on the 2020 Commission on Audit (COA) report and other issues related to budget utilization of the Department of Health (DOH), asks the committee to also explore the possibility of providing free COVID-19 testing to all Filipinos.

Sotto noted that while the government is devoted to COVID-19 vaccines, the country's COVID-19 testing has been somewhat neglected. Sotto cited one of the findings of COA in its 2020 report regarding the failure of the Procurement Service of the Department of Budget and Management (PSDBM) to remit to the national treasury P10.87 billion in unutilized funds and remained dormant for years, which could have

been used to fund other programs. "Congress has been working hard with the country's budget to ensure that the needs of our people are addressed.

It is very disheartening to see that much-needed funds are just lying idly and put to waste especially that we are in a middle of a crisis. Maybe these funds could instead be allocated for free mass testing and help save lives," Sotto said Wednesday, August 25, 2021.

Beware of illegal  
recruitment  
via online  
dating - POEA



The Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA) warns Filipino overseas jobseekers to disregard job offers from unscrupulous individuals who take advantage of on-line dating apps and websites for their illegal recruitment activities.

The POEA received reports from individuals who were offered supposed migration and employment in countries such as the United States and Canada via online dating apps and websites.

The POEA advises job seekers to be cautious and ignore job offers from dating apps and refrain from paying any amount of money to their supposed 'online romantic partners' for overseas employment.

The public is also reminded that a job offer that requires early fees through electronic transfer is a solid indication of a scam.

"Safe po at effective ang mga ginagamit ng ating gobyerno na anti-Covid vaccines. Patunay po dito ang patuloy na pagbaba ng mga nadadala sa ospital at namamatay sa mga taong nabakunahan na nito. "People often share concerns, mistrust and rumors about vaccines on social media which causes vaccine hesitancy among those who already received their first dose and those who are yet to take their scheduled vaccination. About 99.77% vaccine recipients have not reported any severe adverse reaction and only 23% have experienced mild symptoms which resolved naturally."

The government has already administered 27,806,881 vaccine doses in the country, as of August 26, 2021. In CALABARZON, 1,681,899 individuals were already fully vaccinated. A total of 2,582,878 has received their first dose.

DILG to barangays: Support  
National ID campaign

QUEZON CITY -- The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) today encouraged barangays to support the implementation of the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys) or the National ID system by actively encouraging their constituents to register in the PhilSys and get a national ID.

"Nasa gitna man tayo ng pandemya, tuloy pa rin ang paghahatid ng serbisyo publiko sa mga mamamayan. Kaya hinihimok ko ang mga punong barangay na makiisa sa adbokasiya ng National ID Campaign, upang mapabilis ang pagpapatala sa ating mga mamamayan, lalo na ang mga nasa kanayunan," said DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año.

Año said the PhilID card will be the sole ID that will be required for all transactions in all local government units (LGUs), private entities, banks, and other

establishments.

Citing records from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), he said some 1.048-million National ID cards have already been successfully delivered so far in partnership with the Philippine Postal Corporation. Others are still in transit as some 3.036-million ID cards have already been dispatched.

The PSA has reported that there are now 40,388,260 Step 1 registrants (up by 683,777 or 1.7 percent from last week) and for Step 2 (biometrics collection in registration centers), there are now 25,263,851 registrants from 86 provinces and NCR districts (up by 1,514,220 or 6.4 percent from last week).

"Napakaimportante ang pagkakaroon ng national ID lalong-lalo na ngayong panahon ng pandemya kung saan madalas ginagamit ang ID para sa mga online trans-

actions, pagkuha ng ayuda, pagpapabakuna at marami pang iba," Año said.

The PhilSys Act, or Republic Act 11055, was signed into law by President Rodrigo R. Duterte to create a single national ID for all Filipinos and resident aliens which will serve as the official government-issued identification document of cardholders dealing with all national government agencies, LGUs, government-owned or controlled corporations, government financial institutions, state universities and colleges, and all private sector entities.

In Memorandum Circular No. 2021-078, Año expressed the Department's unwavering support to the PSA in implementing the national ID campaign down to the barangay level.

Año urged all punong barangays to share registration-related updates

from the Official PhilSys Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/PSA-PhilSysOfficial>) and facilitate barangay roving announcements from the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) to keep their constituents informed about the processes of availing the said ID card.

To raise awareness about PhilSys and encourage residents to register, Año said barangays may also distribute electronic and print materials from the PCOO such as audio-video presentations and flyers, or have these materials placed in conspicuous places.

He said the punong barangays and barangay officials can also enlist the help of their Barangay Information Officers in distributing these materials to schools and health centers.

262K Pfizer  
doses for NCR,  
Calabarzon arrives  
in Marikina

Some 262,000 doses of Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine arrived in the country Wednesday night (Aug 25), which were then transported to the PharmaServ Express cold-chain storage facility in Marikina City.

The Pfizer vaccines, which arrived on board Air Hongkong flight LD456 carried some 262,080 doses.

Assistant Secretary Wilben Mayor, head of the National Task Force Against COVID-19 (NTF) sub-task force on current operations, said the latest Pfizer vaccine would be deployed in COVID-19 high-risk and vulnerable areas such as the National Capital Region and Region 4-A (Calabarzon) under the vaccination program's "focus and expand" strategy.

"Though meron na tayong ngayong tinatawag na from the spot, nagkakaroon agad ng inoculation. Dinadala na agad doon sa area and pagdating doon ini-inject na kaagad (Though, we now have the so-called from-the-spot inoculation strategy. We deploy the vaccine in the area and administer it immediately)," Mayor said.

He said the country's Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is now in talks with Pfizer-BioNTech about its application for the full approval for their COVID-19 vaccine.

"Actually FDA has already coordinated with Pfizer for the submission of the necessary documents for that purpose," he said.

The United States FDA has granted full approval to Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine for people 16 and older on Aug. 23, the first for any jab.

The deployment of the highly sensitive vaccine, he added, will depend on the handling capacity of the local government units since it requires a temperature of -80°C to -60°C prior to dilution.

"But, again, we leave it to the Vaccine Cluster to decide on whether to which particular area that they will distribute or allocate this Pfizer vaccine," he said.

The Philippines has a total of 2,472,210 doses of Pfizer vaccine procured by the government and 2,479,239 doses acquired through the COVAX Facility, as more life-saving shots are expected to be delivered in the coming weeks that would ensure stable supply until yearend.

The latest shipment brings the country's total number of COVID-19 vaccines to 48,885,590 doses. (PIA-NCR)

SBN 2216 under Committee Report 260 presented by the Committee on Electoral Reforms and People's Participation seeks to enhance accessibility in the voting of senior citizens, persons with disabilities, pregnant women and Indigenous Peoples (IPs).

The measure, among others, proposes early voting for the abovementioned sectors for a period not less than two (2) days within thirty (30) calendar days before Election Day at accessible establishments.

"If we allow our senior citizens and other vulnerable sectors of the population to vote early, malaki po ang mababawas sa pila sa mismong araw ng eleksyon. 14% of the voters are senior citizens. At hindi na nila kailangang makipagsiksikan," Revilla stated.

Nonetheless, he noted of the very low turnout among voters aged 60 years old and up even before the threat of the pandemic, "Less than 3% of the 8 million senior citizen registered voters actually voted during the 2019 elections," Revilla citing data earlier presented by the Committee.

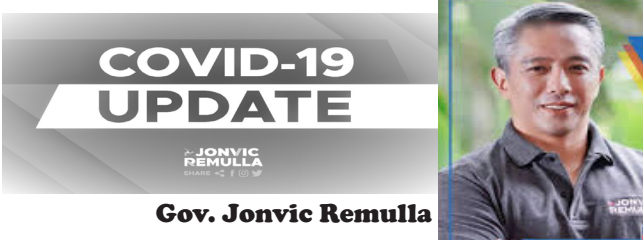

Revilla, however, remained worried about the Commission on Elections' existing capability to successfully conduct postal voting for the upcoming presidential elections, provided as another option for the sector in Section 4 of the proposed bill.

"Is this bill intended to be implemented for the 2022 elections? O sa mga susunod pang halalan? Kung sa 2022, kaya po ba ng Comelec na ipatupad ang postal early voting sa dating na Mayo? May sapat bang panahon upang mailatag ang lahat ng kailangan upang maipatupad ito, considering that we are less than 12 months away from the elections?" Revilla asked.

Lastly, Revilla also showed concern about the possibility of added bureaucracy before one can actually vote under a postal voting system, "Why is there a need for the barangay Chairman to certify the voters list, as reported in the media allegedly to ensure that the person voting is alive and a genuine resident in their barangay? Hindi po ba ito additional requirement na maaaring maka-disenfranchise ng voters?"

Spokesperson and Undersecretary Jonathan E. Malaya said that teens aged 15 to 17 years old and those aged 65 and up may proceed to Step 2 in the registration centers as soon as quarantine restrictions allow.

To register for the national ID, Malaya said residents can either coordinate with their respective municipal/city LGUs for the schedule or go online at <https://register.philsys.gov.ph/#/eng>.

Malaya, who also serves as the DILG's representative to the PhilSys Policy and Coordination Council (PSP-CC), said that PhilSys registration activities are classified as essential government service per Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-MEID) Resolution No. 114.

Among the demographic data captured during the personal appearance in Step 2 are full name, sex, date, and place of birth, blood type, permanent address, citizenship, and other optional data such as marital status, mobile number, and e-mail address. Meanwhile, the biometric data gathered include a front-facing photograph, a complete set of fingerprints, and iris scans.

He warned that refusal to accept, acknowledge, or recognize the PhilID or PhilSys Number (PSN) without just and sufficient cause shall merit a harsh penalty of a P500,000 fine or a lifetime ban from holding any public office or employment in the government for government officials and employees. 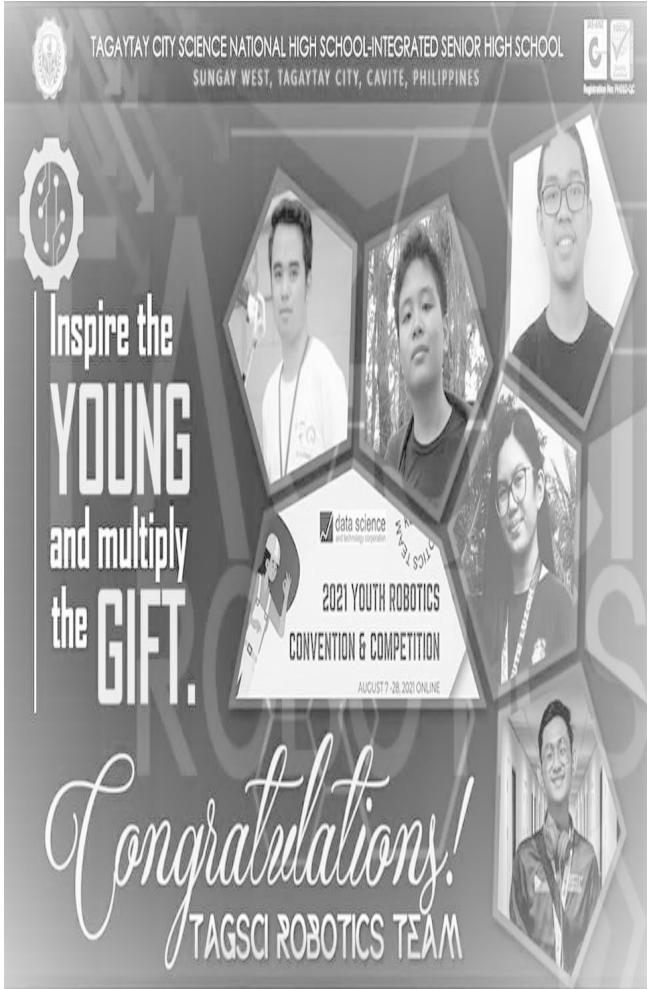
345 families benefit from gardening project

MANILA – At least 345 families from 19 communities in the National Capital Region have benefited from the Department of Science and Technology- Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development's (DOST-PCAARRD) urban gardening project, the agency announced Wednesday.

"Metro Manila was the hardest hit by the (coronavirus disease 2019) pandemic. That is why we focused our project there. Who would have thought they could plant in the city and despite living in a small space? Technology made it possible," DOST Secretary Fortunato de la Peña said in a virtual presser.

He said the project, called, "Gulayan sa Pamilyanan", is the DOST's way to help address food shortage and loss of livelihood.

"It is one of the DOST's ways to help achieve food security. We thank the



19 communities for their co-operation," de la Peña said.

The communities are Muntaparlas (Barangay CAA, Las Piñas; Barangay BF Homes, Phase 3, Parañaque City; Don Bosco, Parañaque City; Doña Rosario Heights and Paradise Garden group of Sucat, Muntinlupa City; and GAD, MCTI, Putatan, Muntinlupa City), Pamamazon (Barangay 412, Sampaloc, Manila; Claro M. Recto High School, Barangay 412, Sampaloc, Manila; and Barangay Pildera, Pasay City), Pamamari-san (Barangay Nangka, Barangay Concepcion THAI, Barangay Concepcion Uno, Fortune, and CEMO of Marikina City), and Camanava (Barangays Pasolo, Balangkas, Tanza 1, and Tanza 2, Navotas City).

According to PCAARRD, some 3,950 EPP kits, 2,350 SNAP kits, 180 bags of compost, eight coco coir net greenhouse, 1,000 liters of CSE, 100 sets of SNAP solutions, and 10 packs of plastic lining were distributed.

A total of 250 beneficiaries were trained.

"Because of these, they were able to get safe and nutritious vegetables that helped them prevent malnutrition. They used the vegetables for their own consumption, while the extras were sold for extra income. Some were also shared to nearby barangays," de la Peña said.

## DOH-CALABARZON strongly cautions residents not to patronize false information discrediting COVID vaccine efficacy

--The Department of Health (DOH)- CALABARZON (Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) strongly cautioned residents August 26 not to believe anti-Covid-19 vaccine rumors and other misinformation circulating online and distributed by individuals through pamphlets and flyers discrediting the efficacy of the Covid vaccines.

"I strongly advise residents to stick to the facts, review and understand information based on scientific evidence on the safety and efficacy of Covid vaccines and not to rely on unverified online information or groups of individuals who will try to manipulate you and provide you misleading reports and false claims about the vaccines," Regional Director

Eduardo C. Janairo stated.

A certain group of individuals, identified as members of the "Gising Maharlika," a so-called local independent news and media alternative source, reportedly distributed pamphlets to residents in Liliw, Laguna on August 23, 2021, informing them that masks and swab tests do not work, and that no person could die of COVID-19.

"For those who have received such information or has read in their social media platform about this online anti-Covid vaccine movement, I advise you not to share and influence other people so as not to amplify these rumors which are not based on scientific evidence," Janairo strongly urged.

## 7.2M learners already enrolled for new school year

**MANILA** – The Department of Education (DepEd) reported recently that 7,249,765 learners so far have enrolled in public schools nationwide for Academic Year 2021-2022 recently.

The DepEd's Learner Information System Quick Counts logged 2,692,438 learners enrolled since Aug. 16 and 4,557,327 during the early registration as of June 2.

So far, Calabarzon has logged the highest number of enrollees at 1,153,088 – 672,379 learners enrolled and 480,709 under early registration.

The National Capital Region recorded the second highest number of enrollees with 980,783 (688,668 learners and 292,125 registrants).

Last year, 26,826,387 students enrolled in Kindergarten, Grades 1 to 6, Junior High School, Senior High School, and the Alternative Learning System.

Registration will run until Sept. 13, the first day of the school year that will use blended learning.
