Over 4.5M workers benefit from wage hikes in 14 regions

MANILA – More than 4.5 million minimum wage earners in the private sector benefited from wage hikes in 14 regions in 2025.

According to the data from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) released on Wednesday, the wage adjustments ranging from PHP20 to PHP100 were issued con-

sistent with the policy of the National Wages and Productivity Commission (NWPC) on regular, moderate and predictable minimum wage increases.

The 14 Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Boards (RTWPBs) namely: National Capital Region (NCR), Cordillera Administrative Region

(CAR), Regions 1 (Ilocos), 2 (Cagayan Valley), 3 (Central Luzon), Calabarzon, Mimaropa, 6 (Western Visayas), 7 (Central Visayas), 8 (Eastern Visayas), 9 (Zamboanga Peninsula), 10 (Northern Mindanao), 12 (Soccsargen) and 13 (Caraga), have issued their respective Wage Orders this year.

‘Organic Encounter’: Libangan noong Pandemya, Isa nang Matagumpay na Organikong Kabuhayan

Maraming pinahinto ang pandemya mula 2020 hanggang 2022. Kabuhayan, gawi ng araw-araw na pamumuhay, at maski ambisyon.

Ngunit para kay Camille Diana Maralit, isang kabataang magsasaka mula sa Tagkawayan, Quezon, nagbigay ng panibagong pagkakataon ang pandemya. Pagkakataon upang pagnilayan ang mga pangarap, nais gawin, at makadiskubre ng bagong pagkakaabalahang hindi niya lubos inakalang magbubukas ng maraming oportunidad.

Nagsimula lang iyon sa ilang gulay na itanim niya sa mga lumang bote at paso sa bakuran. Walang malaking plano, walang malaking puhunan. Ani nga niya, “trial and error lang.”

Kalaunan, hindi na lamang limitado sa mga gulay ang naroroon. Sumubok na rin siya sa pagtatanim ng mga kabute at pag-aalaga ng mga manok at baboy. Dito na napagtanto ni Camille na maaari niya itong kabuhayan sa gitna ng pandemya.

Unti-unting nagbago ang itsura ng bakuran. Mula sa simpleng pinagkakaabalahang, naging maliit na kabuhayan. At doon nagsimulang malinawan si Camille, “Minsan, sapat na ang kaunting tapang at pagkamausisa para makabuo ng malaking oportunidad.”

Bago pa ito, may-

roon nang pinanghahawakang kaalaman si Camille. Nagtapos siya sa kursong BS Agriculture mula sa Southern Luzon State University – Lucban, Quezon noong 2024. Pero para sa kanya, hindi sapat ang diploma para matawag ang sarili na magsasaka. Iba pa rin niya kapag ikaw mismo ang humahawak ng lupa, nag-aalaga ng halaman, at humaharap sa mga problemang minsan’y hindi nasasagot ng libro.

Kaya kahit maraming alam na teorya at konsepto sa agrikultura, bumabalik pa rin si Camille sa aniya ay “basics.” Sa bakuran ng kanilang tahanan, nagtanim ulit siya—sa paso, sa sako, kung saan may espasyo. Nag-alaga ng hayop. Hanggang sa mas minahal niya ang kanyang ginagawa.

Alam din ni Camille na hindi kayang palitan ng online classes ang aktwal na karanasan. Kaya pinili niyang matuto sa paraan na pinakamalapit sa totoong buhay—“learning by doing,” ika niya.

Nag-enrol siya sa iba’t ibang kursong pang-agrikultura mula sa TESDA, gaya ng National Certifications (NC) II sa Organic Agriculture Production, Agro-entrepreneurship, Crop Production, at Swine Production. Lumahok din siya sa mga webinar, pagsasanay, at pagbisita sa mga farm upang mas matuto ng mga teknolohiya at pamamaraan. Nakinig

din siya sa mga magsasakang deka-dekada na ang karanasan. Aniya, bawat payo, bawat kwento ng pagkakamali at pagani, may idinagdag na kumpiyansa sa kanya.

Sa kabila ng lahat ng ito, hindi huminto sa paghahanap ng oportunidad ni Camille. Oportunidad upang mas mapagyaman pa ang kanyang nasimulan. Dumating ang isang malaking pagkakataon nang makita niya sa Facebook page ng DA-ATI CALABARZON ang Youth Internship Program on Organic Agriculture o YIPOA. Ito ay isang programa ng DA-ATI kung saan sinanasanay sa mga pamamaraang organiko at pagnegosyo ang mga kabataang intern sa loob ng 21 buwan. Nagbibigay rin ito ng 150,000-piso na pondo para simulang mga nagtapos na intern ang kanilang binuong business plan.


Para kay Camille, para itong bukas na pinto na nakatadhana sa kanya. Aniya, ito ang maituturing na “organic encounter” sa pagsasaka. Mula Hunyo 2024 hanggang Marso 2025, nagsanay siya sa isa sa

mga diversified farm at Private Agriculture and Fisheries – Extension Service Provider (PAF-ESP) sa rehiyon—ang Ouan’s Worth Farm and Family Resort Corporation sa Lucena City. Ang kanyang pagsasanay ay sa ilalim ng paggabay ni G. Glen Gabales.

Doon niya naranasan kung ano talaga ang ibig sabihin ng “real-world farming”—hindi lang pagtatanim, kundi pagbuo ng desisyon, pakikipag-ugnayan sa tao, pamamahala ng negosyong pansakahan, at pagharap sa mga problemang kailangang solusyunan agad. Pag-uwi niya, dala niya hindi lang kaalaman, kundi lakas ng loob.

Kaya pagbalik sa kanilang lugar sa Tagkawayan, hindi na siya nagdalawang-isip. Sa lupang pagmamay-ari ng kanilang pamilya sa Brgy. Payapa, sinimulan niya ang Payapa Mushroom House. Simple lang ang hangarin: makapaghatid ng masusustansyang ani at produkto sa kanilang komunidad.

Nagsimula siya sa 1,000 fruiting bags ng kabute. Mahirap aniya sa umpisa. Hindi



gaanong malakas ang demand. Sa puntong iyon, sa halip na sumuko, mas pinili ni Camille na magpatuloy at muling bisitahin ang plano. Mas inilapit siya nito sa reyalidad. Napagtanto niyang kailangan niya munang magsimula sa maliit papalaki

Ibinaba niya ang produksyon sa 300 bags at ang natitirang puhunan ay inilaan sa pag-aalaga ng mga organikong katutubong baboy at manok. Sa siyam na baboy na sinimulan niya—pitong patabain at dalawang inahin—unti-unting nabuo ang mas matatag at aniya’y mas “flexible” na kabuhayan.

Pagdating naman sa kanyang prayoridad na enterprise, ang produksyon ng kabute, aminado si Camille na wala talaga siyang background dito noong una. Pero gaya ng maraming bagay sa agrikultura, natunayan din ni Camille na kung minsan, mas malinaw ang mga aral kapag may lupa ang mga kamay, butil-butil ang pawis sa noo, at buo ang loob na ipagpatuloy at pagtagumpayan ang sinimulan.

Isang paalala na ang pagkatuto ay hindi lang nangyayari sa loob ng silid-aralan. Na maaaring makakita ng bago at mas malaking oportunidad sa mga panahong tila nakabibid in ang mga plano at pangarap. Bukod sa mga aral na ito, pinatunayan din ni Camille na kung minsan, mas malinaw ang mga aral kapag may lupa ang mga kamay, butil-butil ang pawis sa noo, at buo ang loob na ipagpatuloy at pagtagumpayan ang sinimulan.

Outside the Philippines, Archbishop Bernardito Auza was appointed by Pope Francis as apostolic nuncio to the European Union on March 22, after more

than five years as nuncio to Spain and Andorra.

In Rome, Pope Leo on May 24 gave Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, pro-pretect of the Dicastery for Evangelization, the title of cardinal of Albano.

The move was seen as a sign of trust, as Albano was Leo’s titular see before his election as pope May 8.

Cardinals are symbolically attached to Roman churches or dioceses as a sign of their connection to the Vatican and the pope.

Members of the Order of Cardinal Bishops traditionally receive one of the seven “suburbicarian” dioceses surrounding Rome.

The pope also named Laoag native Andres Ligot auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of San Jose, California, on Aug. 29. Ligot was ordained Nov. 3, becoming the sixth bishop of Filipino descent serving in the United States.

As the year ends, at least six ecclesiastical territories remain without bishops: the dioceses of Tagbilaran, Kalibo, Ilagan and Masbate, and the apostolic vicariates of Tabuk and Jolo.

Cavite Tourism Introduces Nighttime ‘Dark Heritage Tour’ on Corregidor Island

The Cavite Provincial Tourism Office has introduced a new nighttime tourism program on historic Corregidor Island, giving visitors a chance to experience its World War II landmarks after sunset.

Called the Corregidor Dark Heritage Tour, the evening program offers a more reflective way to explore the island, which played a crucial role during the Japanese invasion of the Philippines in 1942. The tour begins with an evening ferry departure from Cavite City. Tourism officials said the initiative

aims to deepen public understanding of Corregidor’s wartime past by presenting its history in a more immersive setting. The nighttime environment, they noted, adds a solemn tone to the experience and encourages reflection on the events that unfolded on the island.

The tour package includes a 45-minute ferry ride, a guided tram tour of key historical sites, and camping gear for an overnight beach stay. Participants are also served meals modeled after the wartime rations of Filipino and American soldiers.

Stops along the itinerary include the Malinta Tunnel, the Pacific War Memorial, the Mile Long Barracks, several coastal artillery batteries, and the Corregidor Lighthouse. Tourism officials stressed that the program is educational and historical in nature, not intended as a thrill or horror attraction. Its focus is on honoring the island’s role in Philippine and World War II history.

Bookings and inquiries are available through the official social media pages of the Cavite Provincial Tourism Office.

Over 4.5M workers benefit...FROM PI

The DOLE said all wage orders were issued motu proprio, majority of which were issued unanimously by the concerned RTWPBs.

The wage increases were made to take effect after anniversary date of the previous wage orders to reinforce policy stability that helps create an environment attractive to investments, which are needed to generate more decent, remunerative and productive employment.

The NCR is the region with the highest daily minimum wage rate ranging from PHP658 to PHP695 for workers in private establishments.

Meanwhile, the department noted that RTWPBs 11 (Davao Region) and 5 (Bicol) are set to commence their minimum wage determination processes in January and February 2026, respectively.

Pay hike for kasambahays

It also reported that 11 wage orders granting monthly minimum wage increases for domestic workers were also issued by RTWPBs in CAR and Regions 1, 2, 3

Mimaropa, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11 and 13.

The increases range from PHP300 to PHP2,000 per month, benefitting 755,000 domestic workers in 2025.

The DOLE added that wage orders were issued in consultation with workers and employers to ensure balance between protection and needs, reasonable returns on investments and employment generation.

At the same time, it said about 8 million full-time wage and salary workers earning above the minimum wage are also expected to indirectly benefit from wage adjustments at the enterprise level, arising from the correction of wage distortions.

Wage distortion occurs when the implementation of a mandated wage increase (i.e. wage order) results in the elimination or severe contraction of intentional quantitative differences in wage or salary rates between and among employee groups in an establishment.

The NWPC has issued Advisory No. 01, Series

of 2023 which provides guidance to correct possible wage distortions.

Calamity-hit regions

The DOLE, through the NWPC, has provided guidelines for an exemption mechanism for calamity-affected enterprises following the several typhoons that hit the country and caused significant challenges to businesses in affected areas.

Enterprises may inquire and apply through the RTWPB with jurisdiction over their business areas whether they may be eligible for a full exemption or for a specific minimum wage tranche, if any.

PhilHealth to disable old eClaims systems, version 3.0 mandatory by April 2026

The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) is requiring all accredited healthcare facilities (HFs) to migrate to the eClaims 3.0 system, with the mandatory shift taking effect on April 1, 2026.

PhilHealth is set to disable all earlier iterations of eClaims on March 31, 2026, making version 3.0 the exclusive platform for submitting healthcare claims. This aims to enable a more efficient, standardized, and digital-first submission process.

To ensure uninterrupted service and claim processing, all healthcare providers are encouraged to complete their migration to the eClaims version 3.0 ahead of the scheduled deadline.

Key changes to claims processing

In addition to the software upgrade, the system migration introduces enhanced digital standards for

and take full advantage of the opportunities available to reduce and mitigate vulnerabilities from economic disruptions, including those resulting from natural calamities.

Productivity initiatives

RTWPBs were also instructed to roll out productivity improvement programs and gainsharing schemes designed to foster sustainable and long-term wage growth.

As of November 2025, the NWPC and the RTWPBs have provided productivity and orientation to 28,115 MSMEs, benefitting 32,211 employers and workers across the country.

Of this number, 3,525 MSMEs have successfully implemented their action plans, translating knowledge into actual and measurable

documentation. The full implementation of the eClaims 3.0 now enforces strict digital filing rules for financial records:

Mandatory electronic SOA: For all admissions starting April 2026, claims must include a Statement of Account (SOA) in electronic format.

No more scanned PDFs: PhilHealth warned that claims submitted with SOAs in scanned PDF format will be automatically Returned to Hospital (RTH). This aligns with PhilHealth Circular 2023-0026, which aims to standardize electronic data submission for All Case Rates (ACR) and other identified benefits.

eClaims, or the electronic claims submission system, allows PhilHealth-accredited healthcare institutions to submit claims for patients’ reimbursements directly to the state insurer, streamlining the process from patient admission to

productivity improvements in workplaces.

A total of 1,754 MSMEs also received technical assistance in designing and formulating Productivity-Based Incentive Schemes (PBIS). PBIS is a workplace-initiated program on improving the productivity of workers and enterprises to generate savings or additional revenues, which can be shared by enterprises with their workers.


payment while reducing the need for physical paperwork and speeding up turnaround times.

The move to eClaims 3.0 and electronic SOAs is part of PhilHealth’s initiative to automate data validation, reduce manual errors, and expedite the reimbursement cycle for healthcare providers.

To avoid disruptions in claim reimbursements, PhilHealth advises all accredited facilities to coordinate with their service providers and the PhilHealth Regional Office – IT unit to schedule the system upgrade and receive technical guidance during the migration process.

Cavite Marks Peaceful New Year Under 'Ligtas Paskuhan' Campaign

IMUS CITY, Cavite — The Cavite Police Provincial Office (PPO) reported a safe and orderly New Year celebration across the province, citing a significant drop in incidents under the government's Ligtas Paskuhan campaign.

According to police data, total New Year-related incidents fell by 75 percent, from 36 cases in 2024 to just eight cases in 2025. All recorded incidents involved injuries related to firecrackers and pyrotechnics. No cases of indiscriminate firing, stray bullets, road accidents, or firecracker-related fires were reported.

Acting Provincial Director Police Colonel Ariel R. Red credited the peaceful celebrations to effective law enforcement and public cooperation.

"Ang malaking

pagbaba ng mga insidente ngayong Bagong Taon ay patunay ng epektibong pagpapatupad ng batas at ng kooperasyon ng ating mga mamamayan," Red said. "Sa tulong ng ating mga LGU at ng disiplina ng publiko, naging ligtas at mapayapa ang pagdiriwang ng Bagong Taon sa Cavite."

The Cavite PPO attributed the positive outcome to intensified operations against illegal firecrackers and loose firearms, increased police visibility, and close coordination with local government units.

Police officials also thanked the Caviteño community, partner agencies, and LGUs for their continued support in maintaining peace

and order as the province welcomed the New Year.

"With Cavite PNP, your safety is our priority," the PPO said.

Erwin Tulfo pushes Senate to review PWD Laws, seek true 'barrier-free' PH

MANILA, Philippines — Senator Erwin Tulfo has intensified his call for genuine inclusivity for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) by filing a Senate resolution urging a formal inquiry into the implementation of existing PWD laws.

Under Senate Resolution No. 186, the appropriate committee is directed to conduct an oversight

of the implementation of Batas Pambansa Blg. 344 (the "Accessibility Law") and Republic Act 7277 (the "Magna Carta for Persons with Disabilities").

"What is the sense of these laws protecting the rights of PWDs if accessible transportation and building features still fall short? Our PWDs are often forced to rely on others or risk their

own safety just to move around," Tulfo said.

He added: "There should be no issuance of building permits or approval of government projects for structural designs that lack mandatory accessibility features!"

The Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Social Justice, Welfare, and Rural Development also un-

derscored the prevalence of inaccessibility in public infrastructure.

"We see it on the news and social media—footbridges so steep that PWDs using mobility devices cannot navigate them safely. Even in public transportation, most designs are inconsiderate of the needs of the PWD community," Tulfo

Key episcopal appointments shape 2025 for Philippine Church

Episcopal leadership in the Philippines saw significant changes in 2025, with six new bishops and four archbishops appointed under Popes Francis and Leo XIV.

At least two new bishops were appointed by Pope Francis before his death on April 21.

On March 4, Francis named Rogationist missionary Herman Abcede bishop of the Diocese of Daet, filling a vacant see since Archbishop Rex Andrew Alarcon's transfer to Caceres in 2019. Abcede was ordained and installed May 1.

This was followed by the April 2 appointment of Daet priest Ronald Anthony Timoner as bishop of Pagadian, vacant since the death of Bishop Ronald Lunas in January 2024. His episcopal ordination and installation were held Aug. 13.

Glenn Corsiga of Ipil was the last Filipino bishop appointed by Francis, a week before the pope's death. A priest of the Diocese of Dumaguete, Corsiga was ordained July 29 and installed Aug. 14.

The Diocese of Ipil had been "sede vacante" following the transfer of Archbishop Julius Tonel to Zamboanga in August 2023.

Pope Leo made his first Philippine episcopal appointment May 16, naming Dave Capucac of the Prelature of Infanta to succeed retired Bishop Bernardino Cortez.

Capucac was ordained and installed Sept. 5, coinciding with the prelature's 75th founding anniversary.

Pope Leo on Oct. 4 also appointed Edwin Panerigo bishop of Boac, succeeding Bishop Marcelino Antonio Maralit Jr., who was transferred to the Diocese of San Pablo in 2024.

Panerigo, a priest of the Diocese of Lucena, was ordained to the episcopate Dec. 1 and installed Dec. 2.

On Nov. 21, the pontiff named Divine Word missionary Samuel Agcaracar bishop of San Jose in Nueva Ecija. He is scheduled for episcopal ordination Jan. 17 and installation Feb. 6.

Agcaracar will succeed Bishop Roberto Mallari, who now leads the Diocese of Tarlac.

New archbishops

Several bishops were also elevated to archbishops during the year, reflecting wider leadership realignments.

Midyphil Billones, then auxiliary bishop of Cebu, was appointed archbishop of Jaro on Feb. 2 under Pope Francis and installed April 2. He succeeded retired Archbishop Jose Romeo Lazo.

Under Leo XIV, Alberto Uy, then bishop of Tagbilaran, was appointed archbishop of Cebu on July 16 and installed Sept. 30, succeeding retired Archbishop Jose Palma.

Charlie Inzon, then apostolic vicar of Jolo, was named archbishop of Cotabato on Sept. 8 and installed Dec. 8, replacing retired Archbishop Angelito Lampon.
